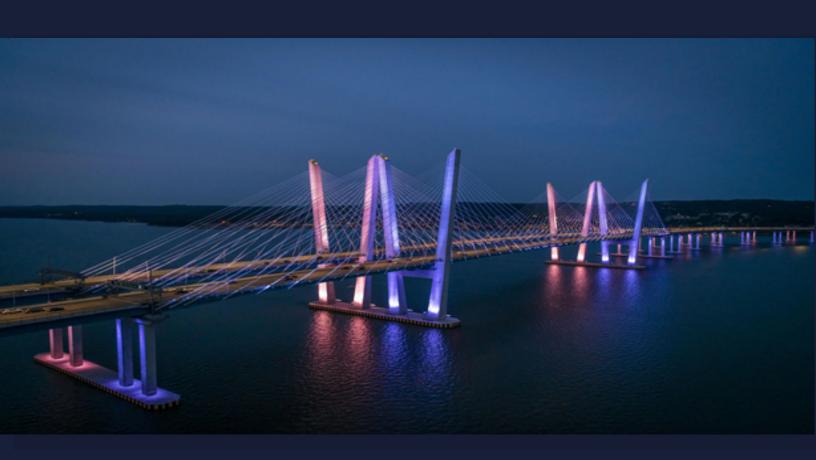

NOTE A - TOTAL REVENUES (pages 1 & 2):

Total revenues for the month are \$78,646,984, an increase of \$5,370,812 or 7.33%. Toll revenues for the month are \$72,039,083, an increase of \$3,033,205 or 4.40%. The increase in revenue is attributed to a toll adjustment implemented in January 2022 for traffic using the Governor Mario M. Cuomo Bridge.

Total revenues year-to-date are \$752,110,821, an increase of \$66,411,716 or 9.69%. Toll revenues year-to-date are \$684,252,476, an increase of \$50,390,297 or 7.95%. Year-to-date passenger revenues increased \$27,840,182 or 8.23% and commercial revenues increased \$22,550,115 or 7.63%.

NOTE B - TOTAL DEPARTMENTAL OPERATING EXPENSES (pages 4 & 10):

For the year, Departmental Operating Expenses are \$312,855,715, an increase of \$30,066,506 or 10.63% compared with October 2021.

The increase is primarily due to the payment of marketing fees related to the fiber optic system as well as E-ZPass and Tolls by Mail administration and professional service costs. Higher costs associated with personal services, snow and ice control, fuel and auto parts also contributed to the increase.

NOTE D - SERVICE AREAS (pages 13 & 14):

In January 2021 the Authority entered into a 33-year agreement with Empire State Thruway Partners, LLC (Empire) for the design, construction, finance, operation, and maintenance of the Authority's 27 Service Areas. Empire will rebuild 23 of the 27 service area restaurant buildings and perform significant renovations to the remaining four. Empire's initial investment to rebuild and renovate the service areas is estimated to be \$300 million. Additionally, over the life of the agreement Empire will invest another \$99 million into future renovations and improvements.

The initial construction work will occur in two phases as detailed below. Phase 1 commenced in July 2021 when Empire assumed control of 16 service areas previously operated by HMSHost Corporation and Delaware North Corporation. Phase 2 will begin in January 2023 when Empire assumes control of the remaining 11 service areas that will continue to be operated by McDonald's Corporation until then.

Commencing with the reopening of each new restaurant building, the agreement requires Empire to pay rent calculated as a percentage of gross sales, subject to a guaranteed annual minimum per location. In addition, the agreement has ancillary rent provisions tied to the operation of commercial vehicle fueling stations at 5 of the service areas and advertising opportunities at all service areas. Sales generated by Empire during the operation of a restaurant prior to reconstruction (interim operations) are not subject to rent provisions. Over the life of the agreement, base rent calculated as a percentage of sales is forecasted to be \$85 million, of which \$51 million is guaranteed.

During the period of January 1, 2021 through July 29, 2021 HMSHost's obligation to pay rent was suspended.

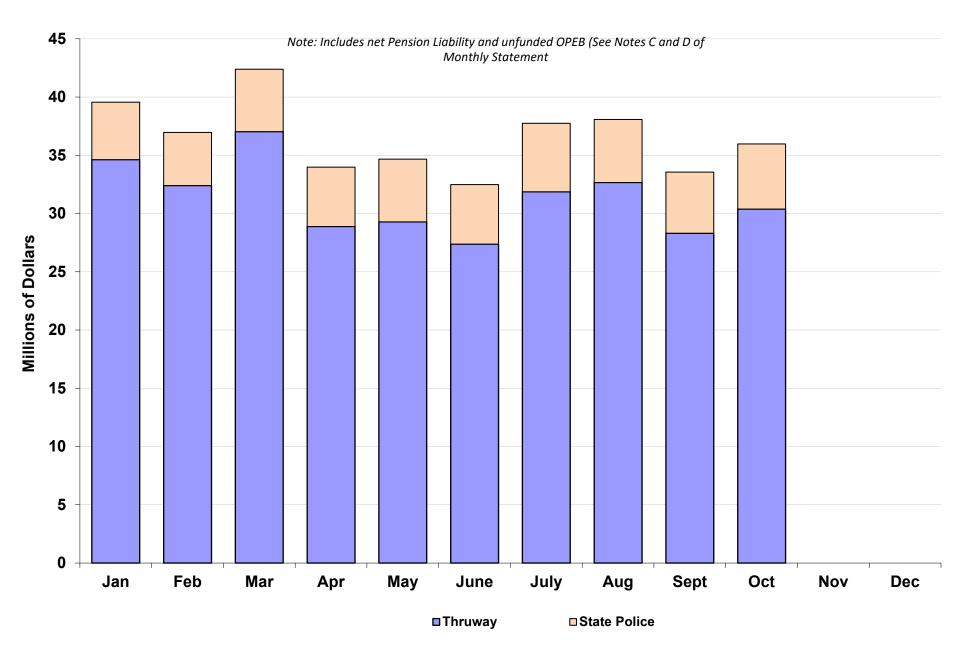

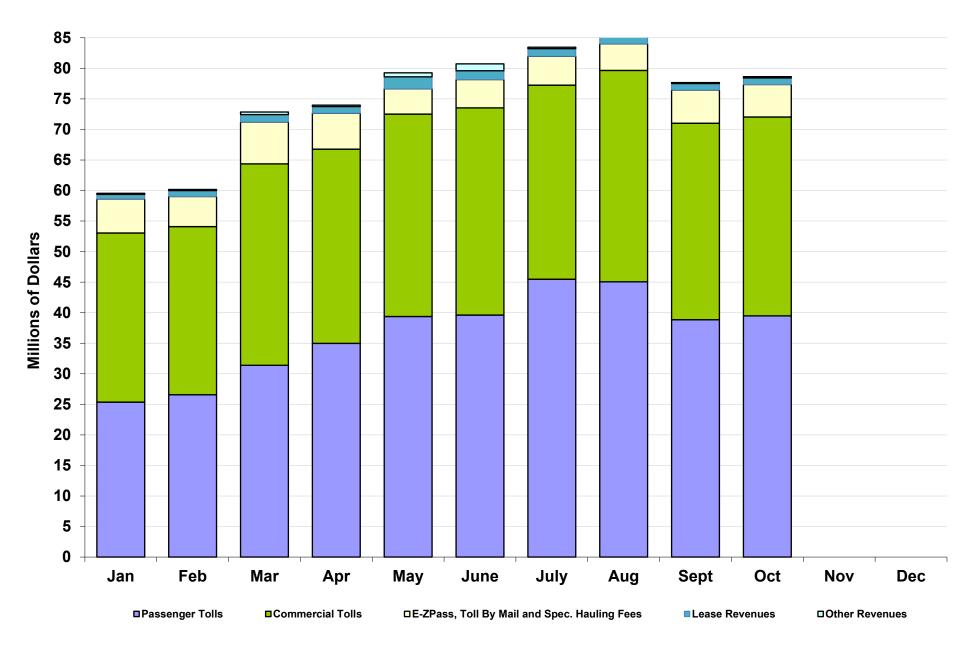

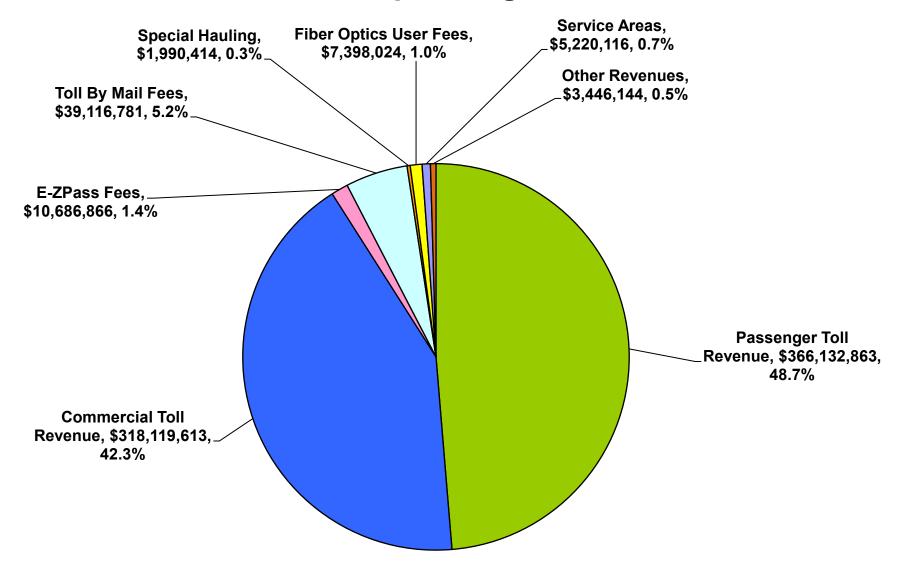

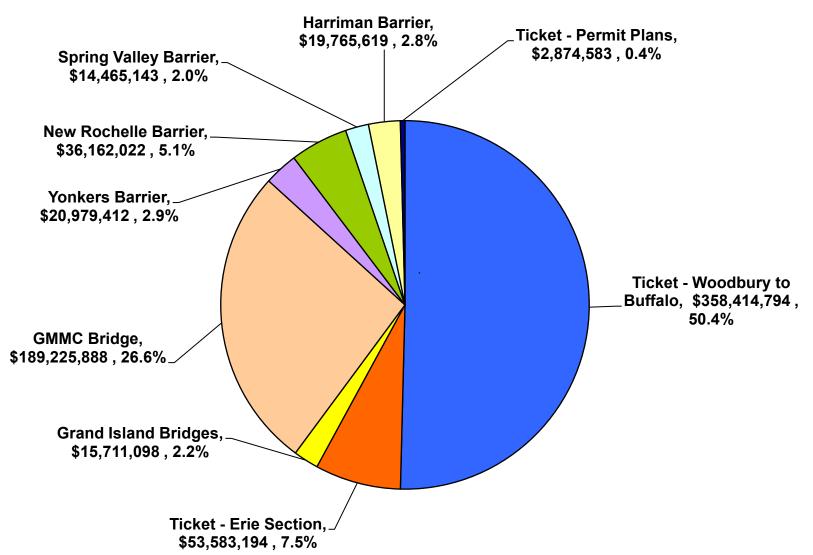
2022 YTD Operating Revenues

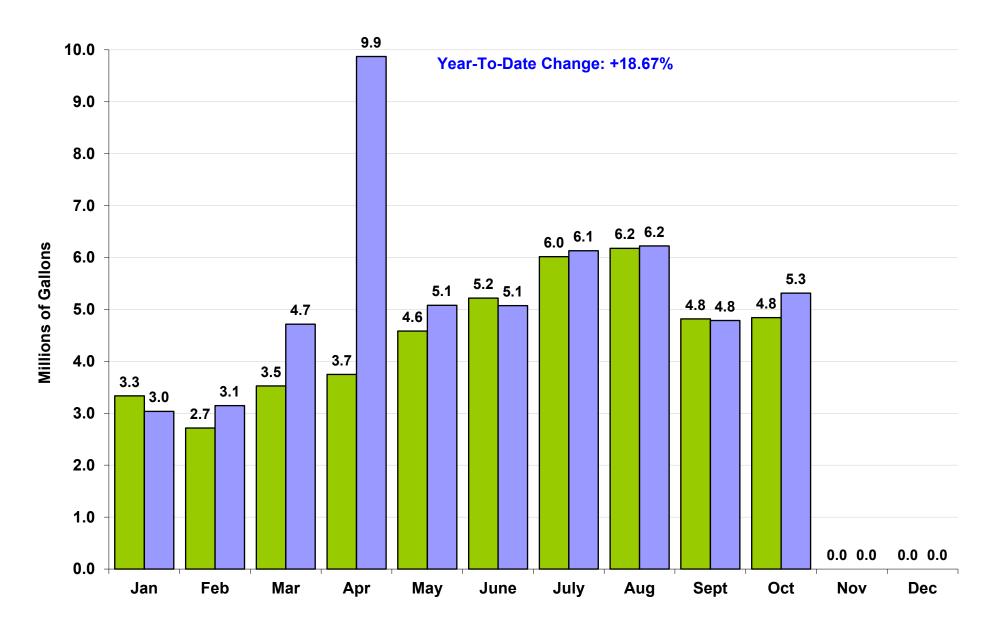


2022 YTD Toll Collections, By Location

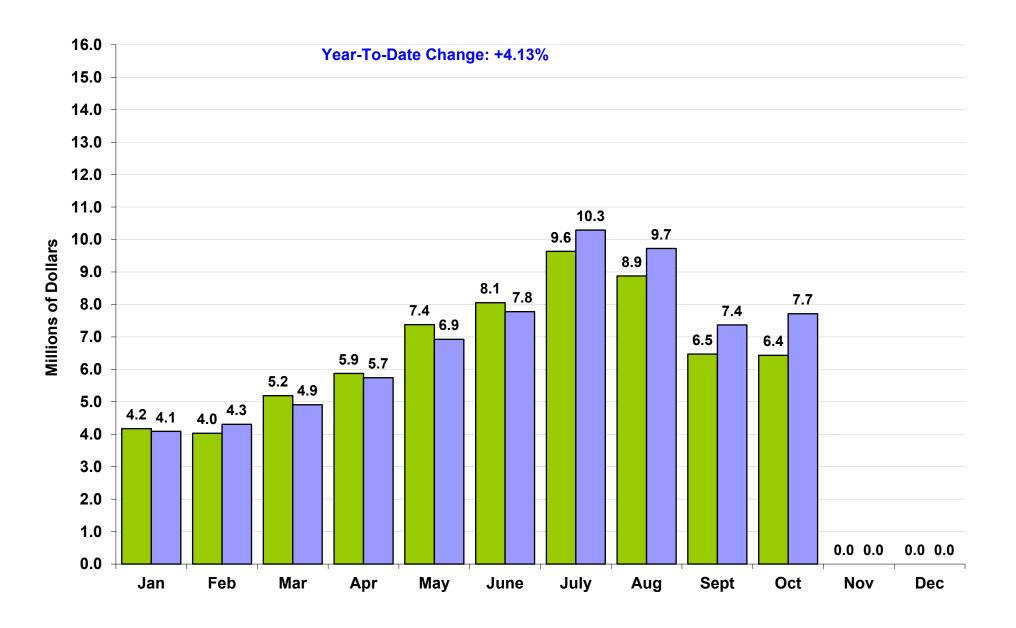

Restaurant Sales at Service Plazas

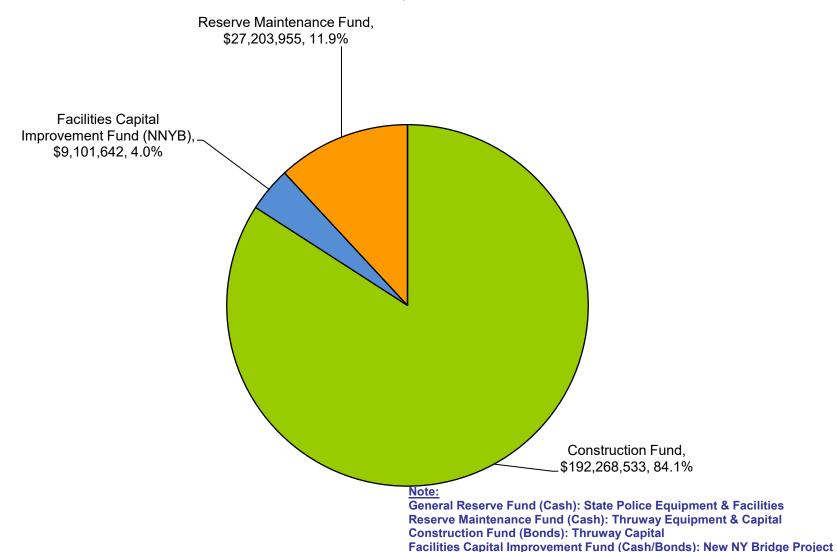

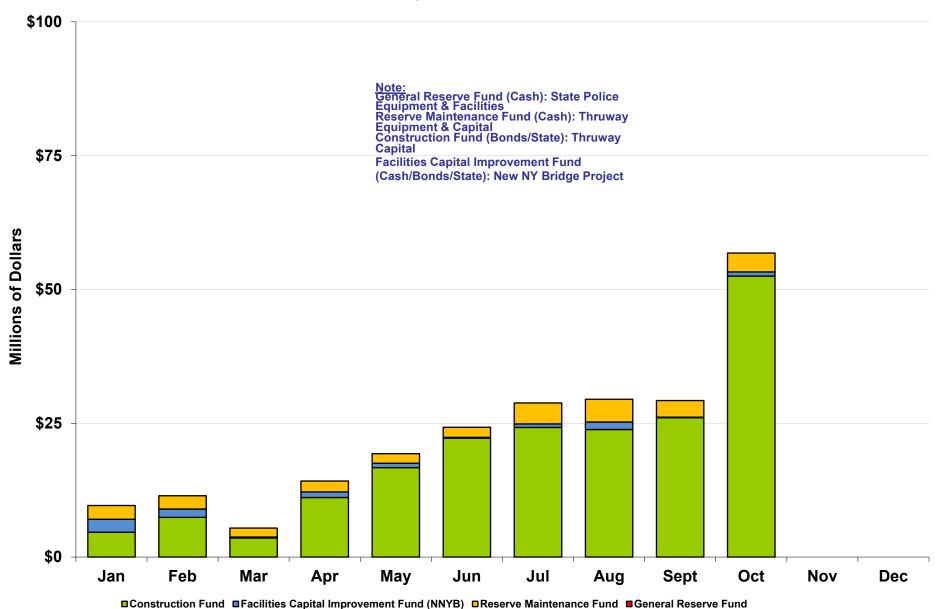
2022 YTD Capital Program Expenses, by Fund

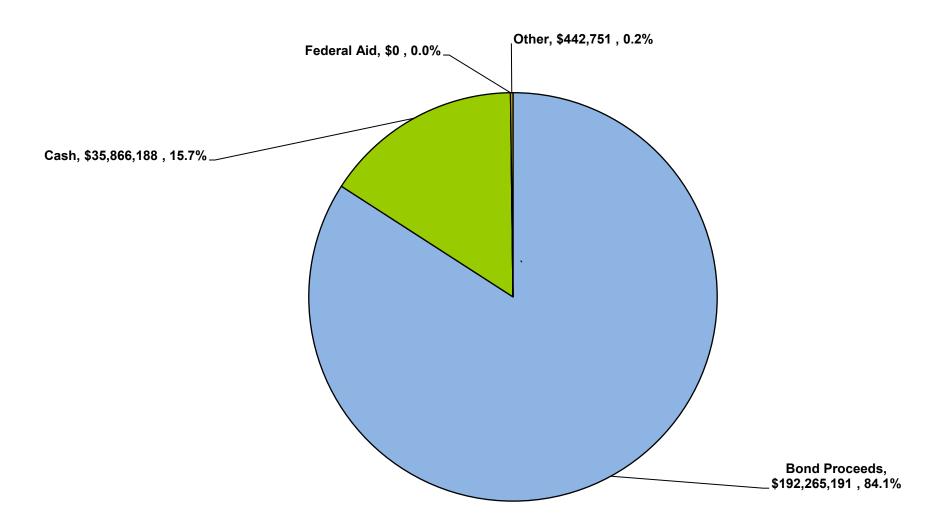
2022 YTD Capital Program Expenses, By Fund

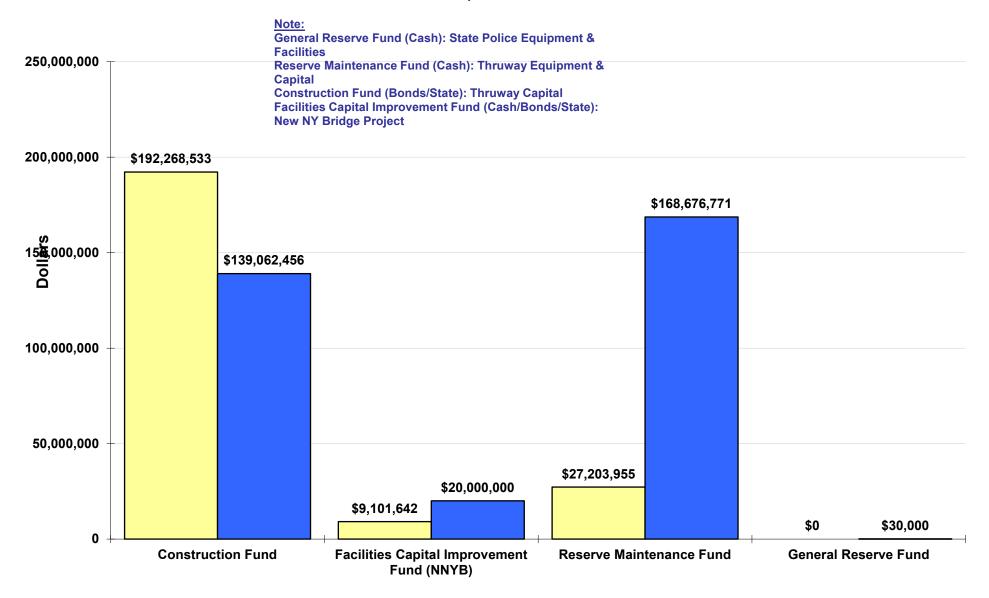
2022 YTD Capital Funding Sources

2022 YTD Capital Expenses, By Fund

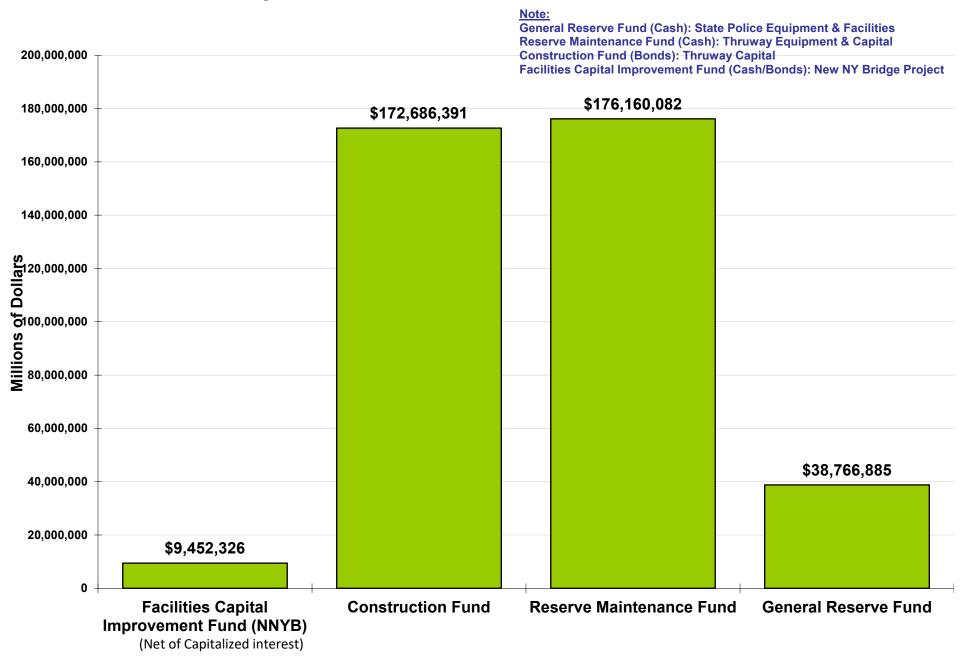

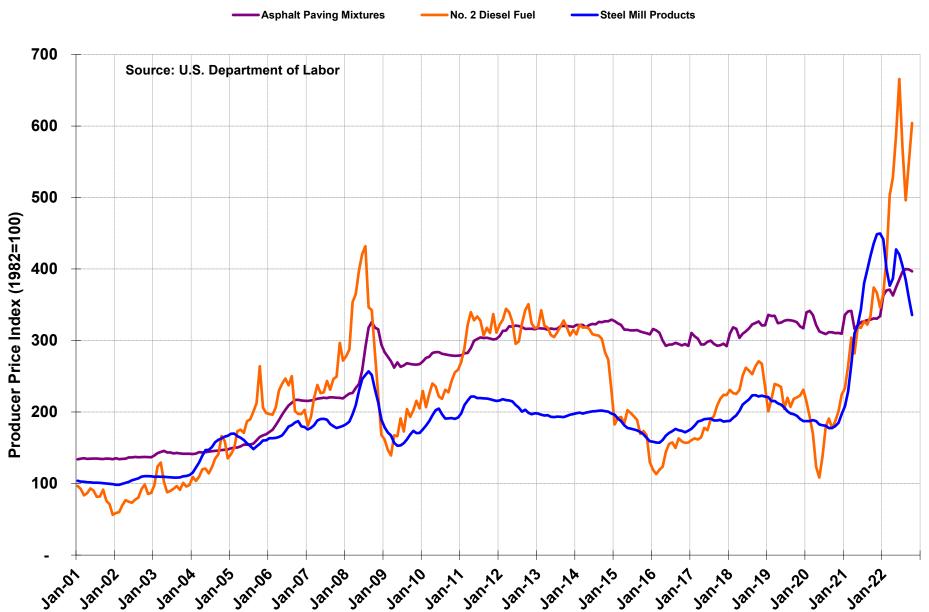

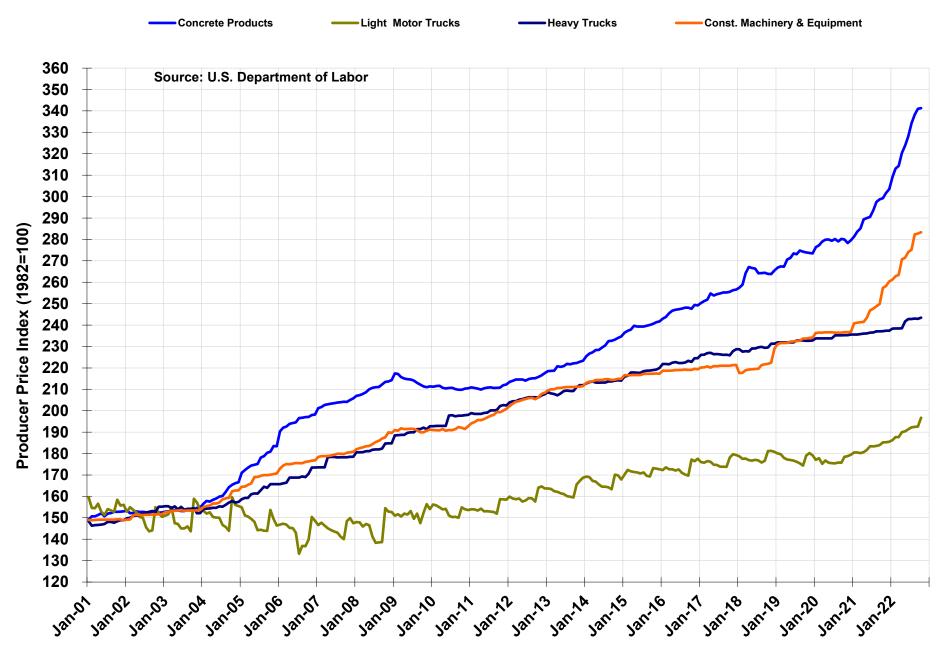
2022 Capital Fund Balances at End of Month



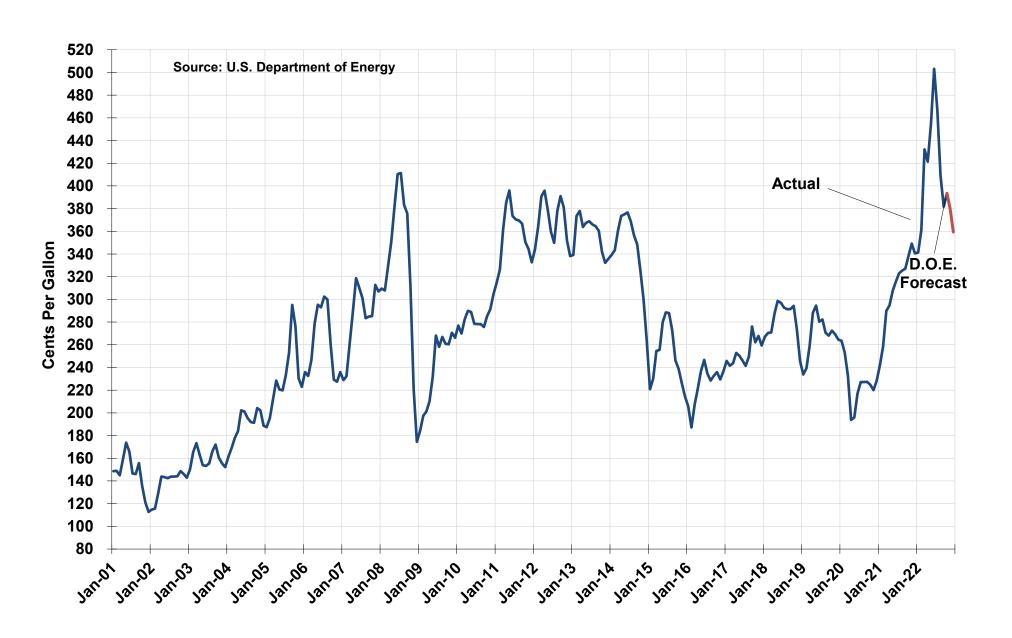
Producer Prices: Construction Inputs

Average Retail Price of Gasoline in U.S. All Grades

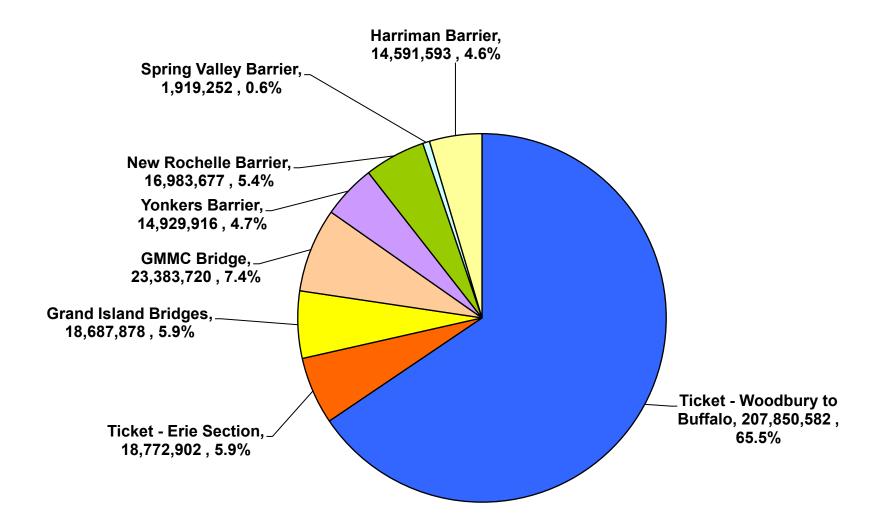

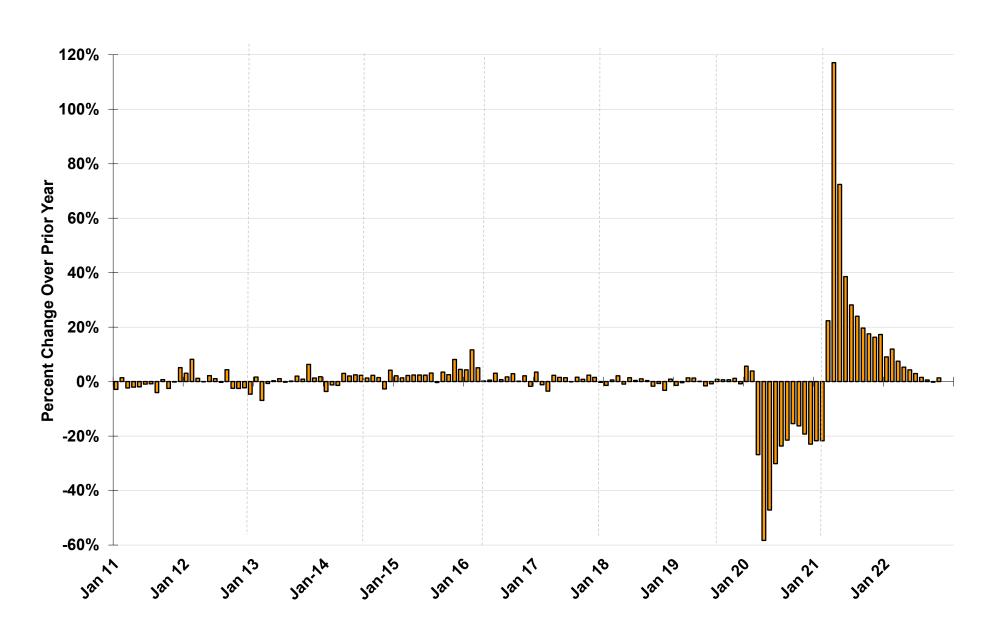

2022 YTD Total Thruway Trips, By Location



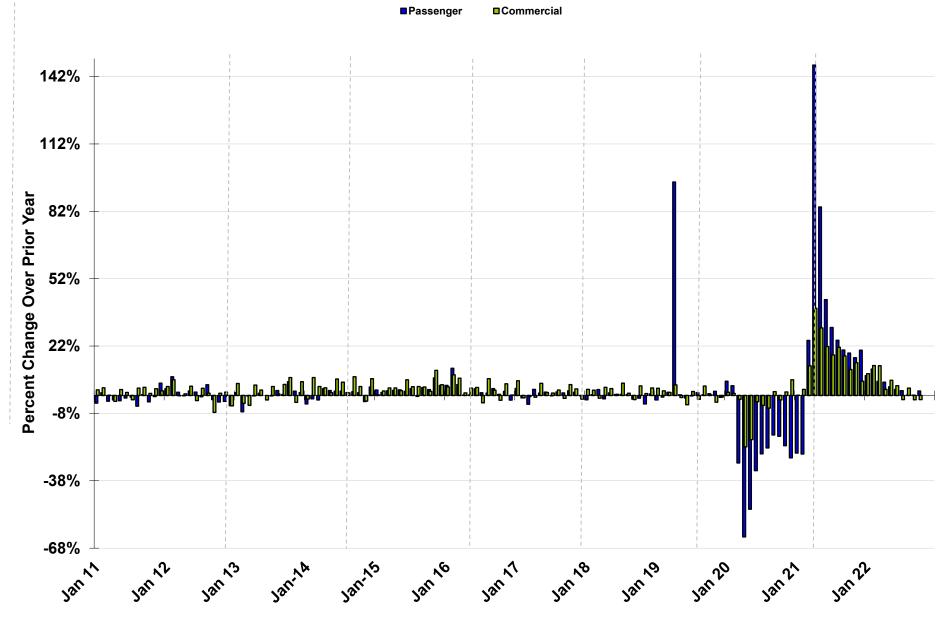
Percent Change in Monthly Thruway Traffic

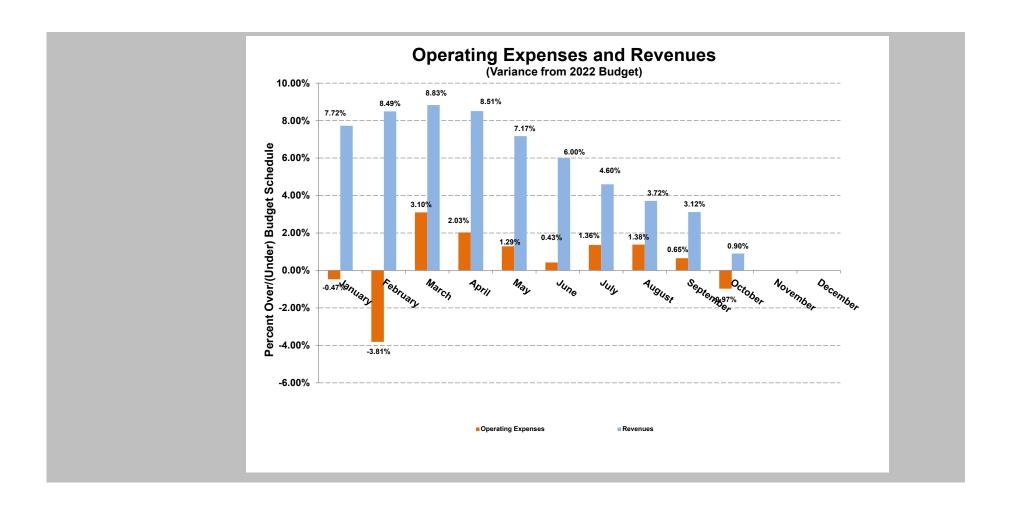
Total Passenger and Commercial Revenue Trips

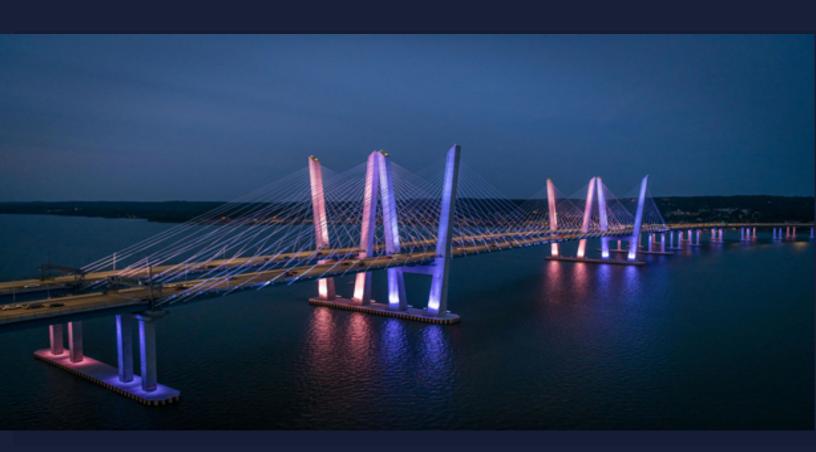

NOTE A - TOTAL REVENUES (pages 1 & 2):

Total revenues for the month are \$72,195,893, an increase of \$2,695,223 or 3.88%. Toll revenues for the month are \$64,867,901, an increase of \$1,304,473 or 2.05%. The increase in revenue is attributed to a toll adjustment implemented in January 2022 for traffic using the Governor Mario M. Cuomo Bridge.

Total revenues year-to-date are \$824,306,714, an increase of \$69,106,939 or 9.15%. Toll revenues year-to-date are \$749,120,377, an increase of \$51,694,770 or 7.41%. Year-to-date passenger revenues increased \$29,738,222 or 8.01% and commercial revenues increased \$21,956,548 or 6.73%.

NOTE B - TOTAL DEPARTMENTAL OPERATING EXPENSES (pages 4 & 10):

For the year, Departmental Operating Expenses are \$330,789,799, an increase of \$21,518,085 or 6.96% compared with November 2021.

The increase is primarily due to the payment of marketing fees related to the fiber optic system as well as E-ZPass and Tolls by Mail administration and professional service costs. Higher costs associated with personal services, snow and ice control, fuel and auto parts also contributed to the increase.

NOTE D - SERVICE AREAS (pages 13 & 14):

In January 2021 the Authority entered into a 33-year agreement with Empire State Thruway Partners, LLC (Empire) for the design, construction, finance, operation, and maintenance of the Authority's 27 Service Areas. Empire will rebuild 23 of the 27 service area restaurant buildings and perform significant renovations to the remaining four. Empire's initial investment to rebuild and renovate the service areas is estimated to be \$300 million. Additionally, over the life of the agreement Empire will invest another \$99 million into future renovations and improvements.

The initial construction work will occur in two phases as detailed below. Phase 1 commenced in July 2021 when Empire assumed control of 16 service areas previously operated by HMSHost Corporation and Delaware North Corporation. Phase 2 will begin in January 2023 when Empire assumes control of the remaining 11 service areas that will continue to be operated by McDonald's Corporation until then.

Commencing with the reopening of each new restaurant building, the agreement requires Empire to pay rent calculated as a percentage of gross sales, subject to a guaranteed annual minimum per location. In addition, the agreement has ancillary rent provisions tied to the operation of commercial vehicle fueling stations at 5 of the service areas and advertising opportunities at all service areas. Sales generated by Empire during the operation of a restaurant prior to reconstruction (interim operations) are not subject to rent provisions. Over the life of the agreement, base rent calculated as a percentage of sales is forecasted to be \$85 million, of which \$51 million is guaranteed.

During the period of January 1, 2021 through July 29, 2021 HMSHost's obligation to pay rent was suspended.

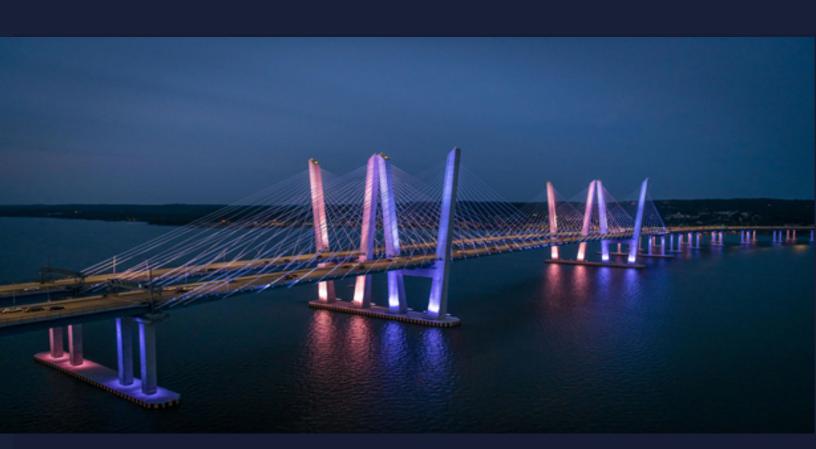

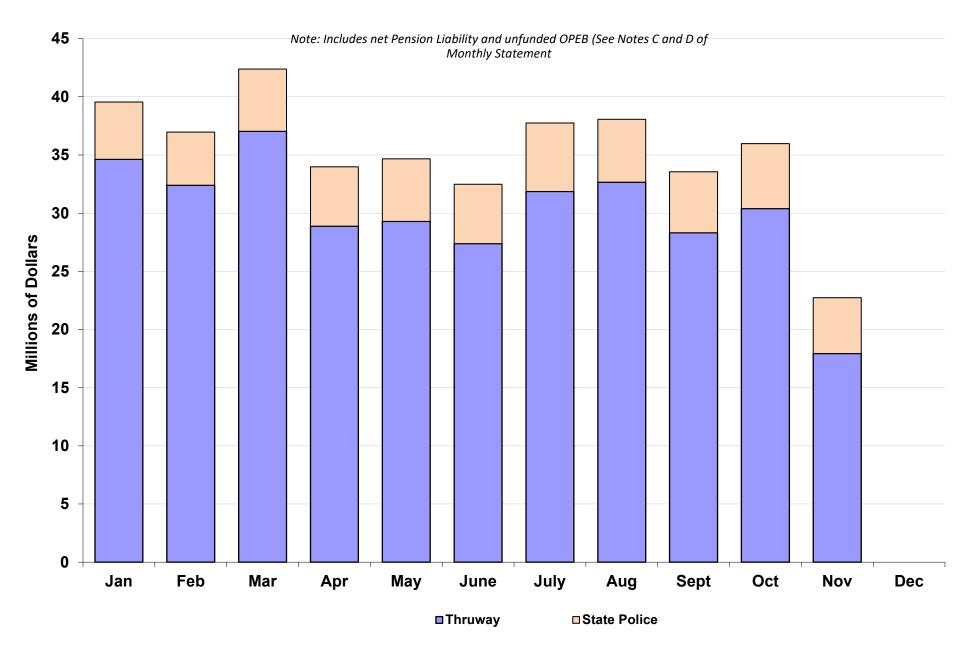

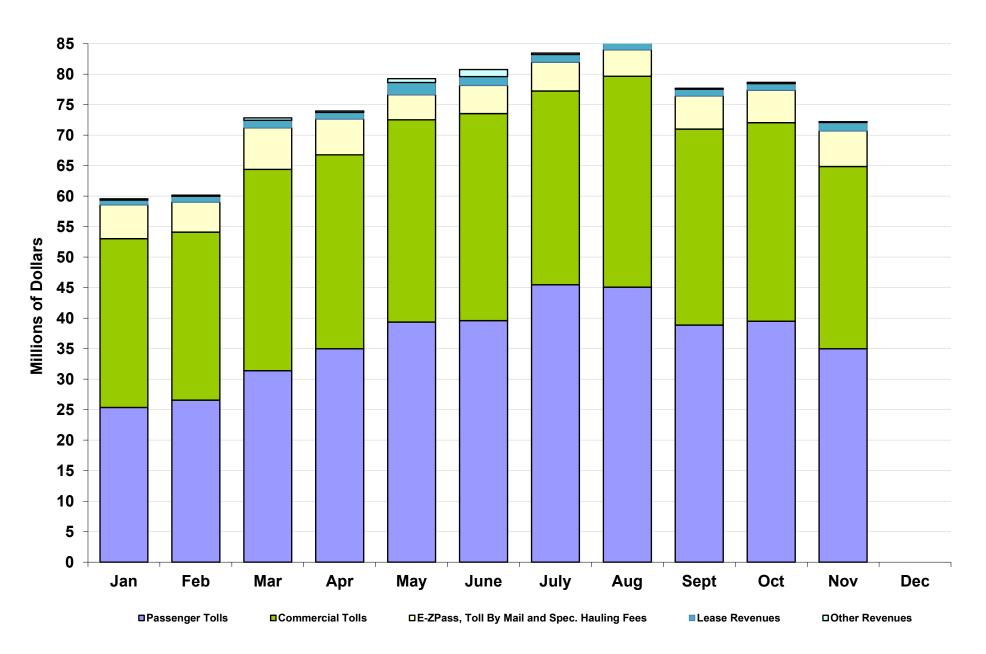

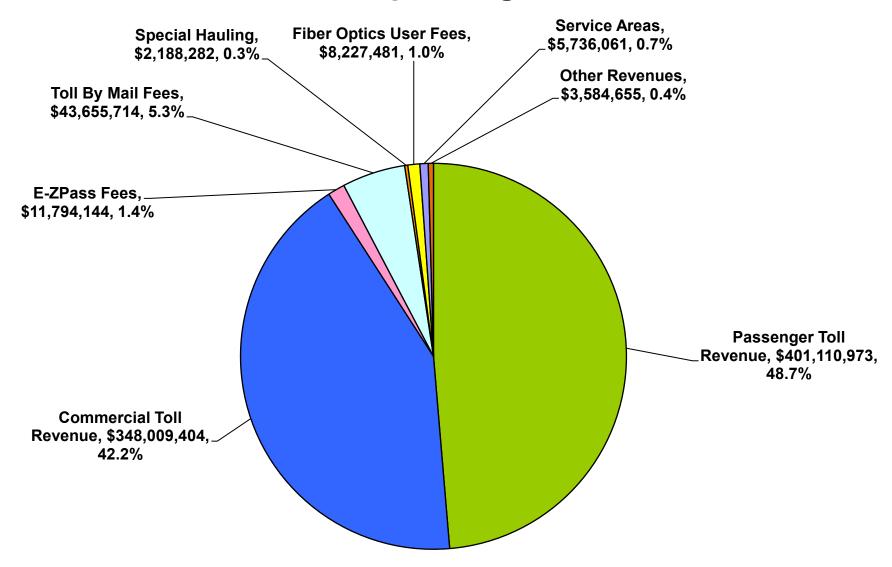

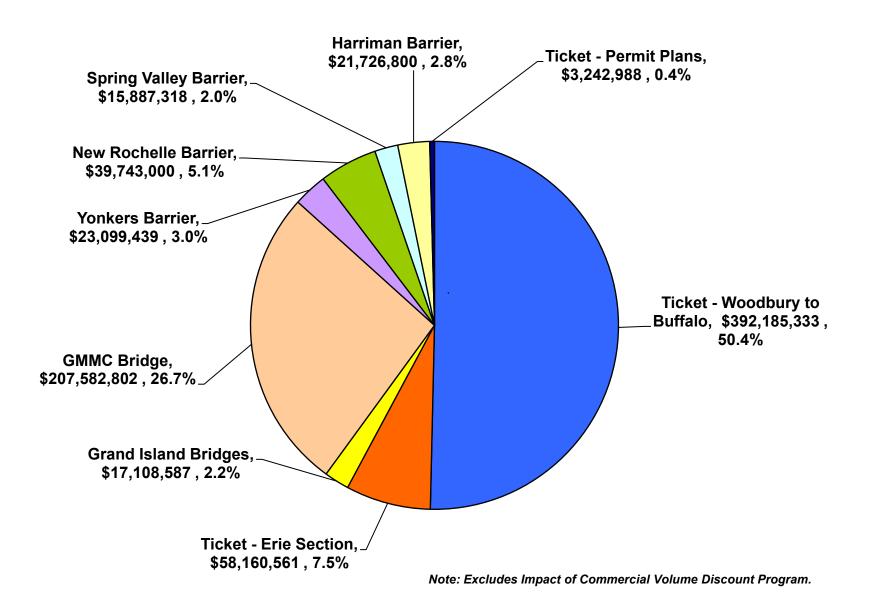
2022 YTD Operating Revenues



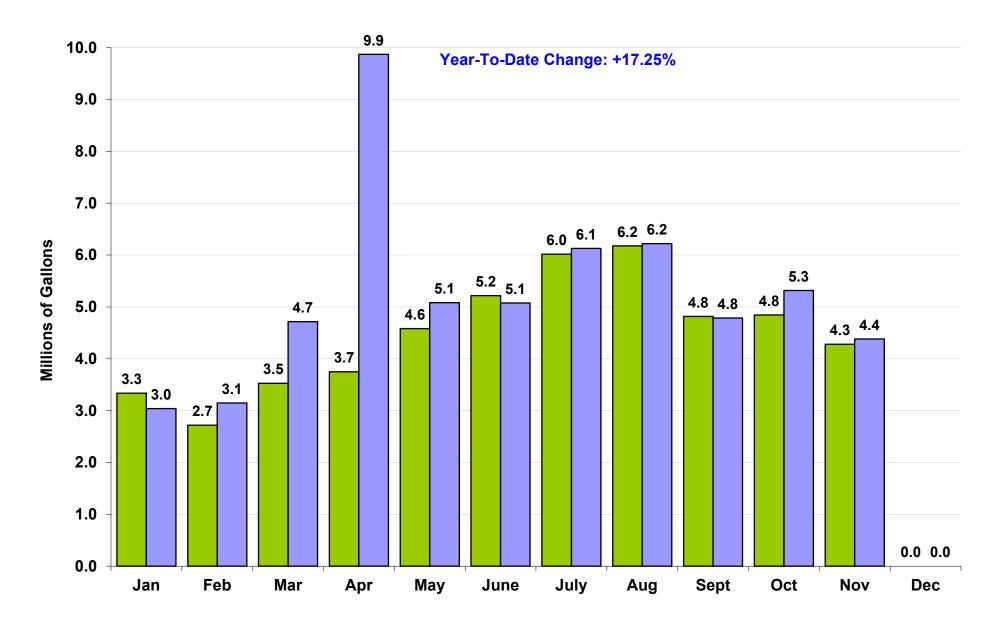
2022 YTD Operating Revenue



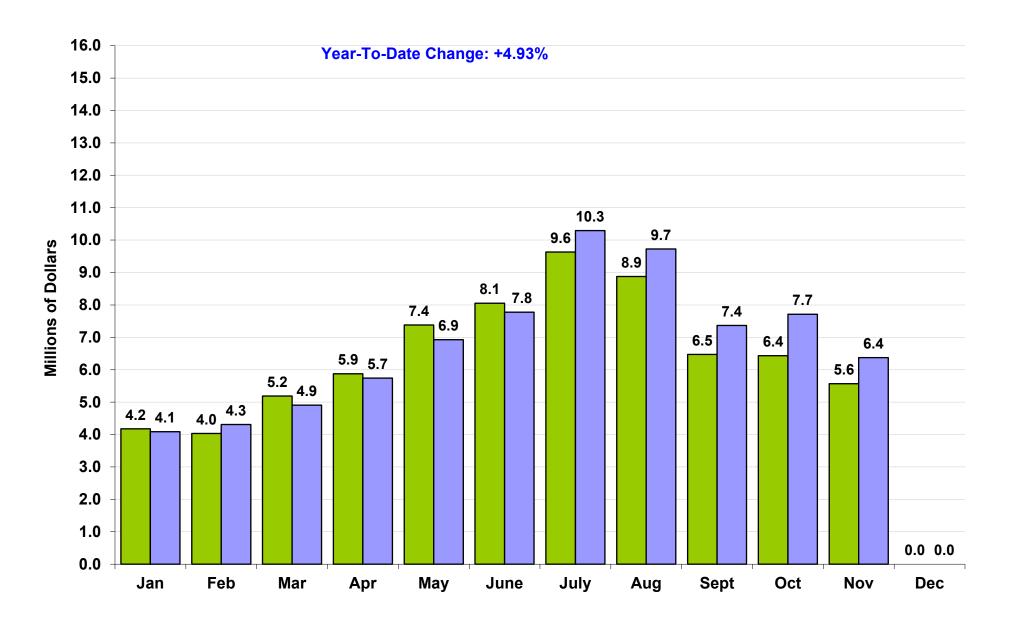
2022 YTD Toll Collections, By Location

Restaurant Sales at Service Plazas

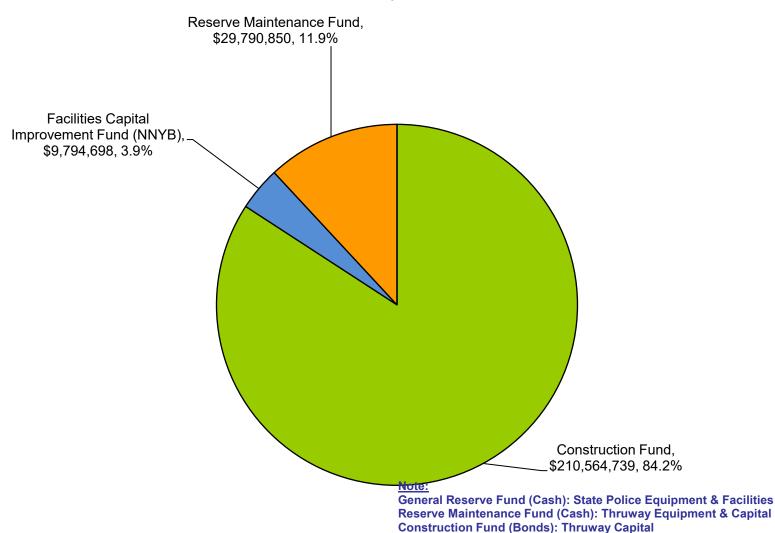

2022 YTD Capital Program Expenses, by Fund

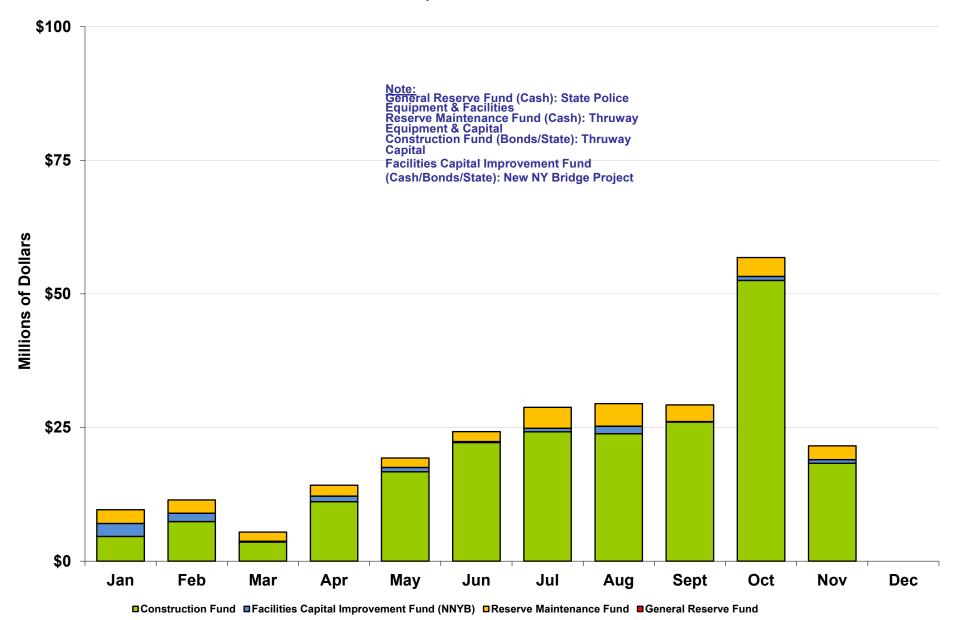

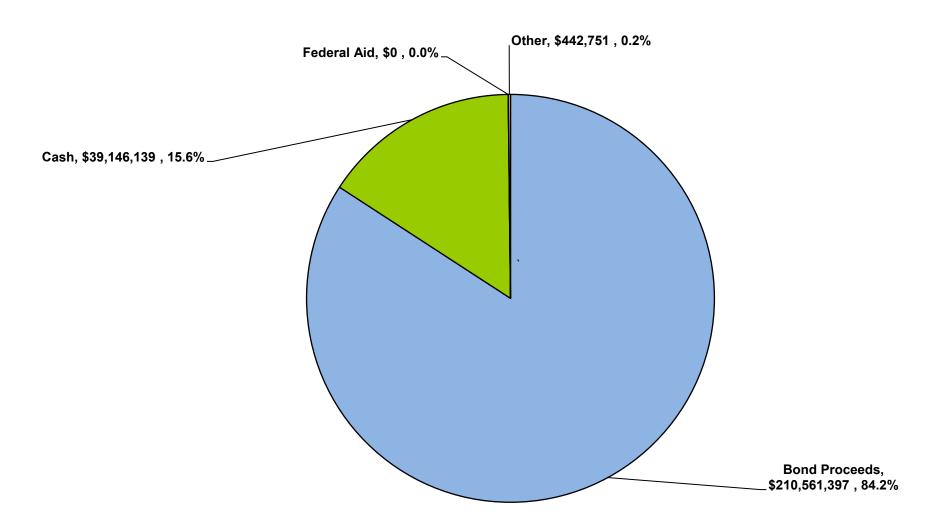
2022 YTD Capital Program Expenses, By Fund

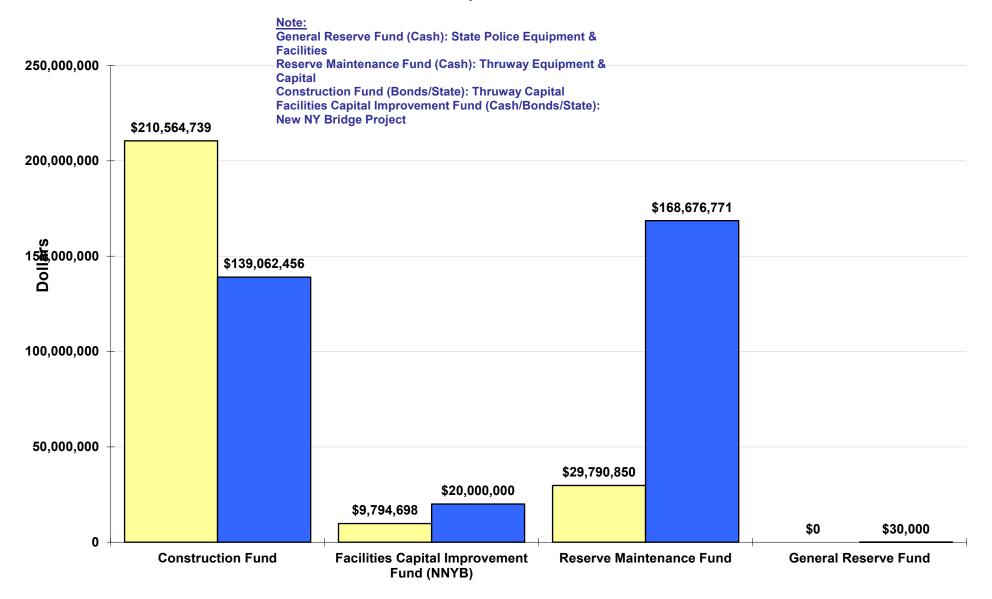
2022 YTD Capital Funding Sources

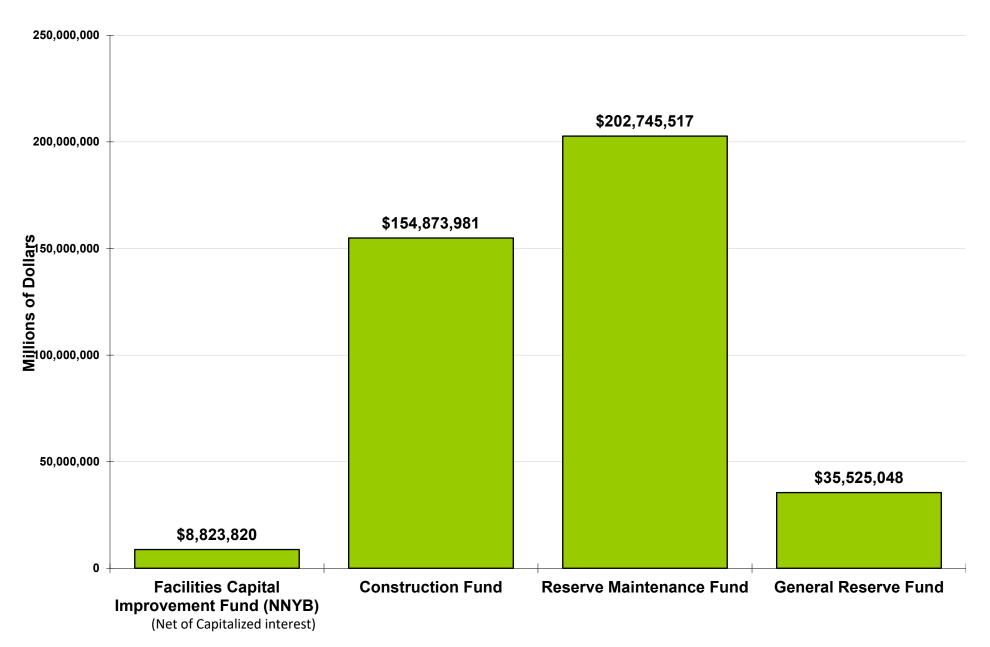

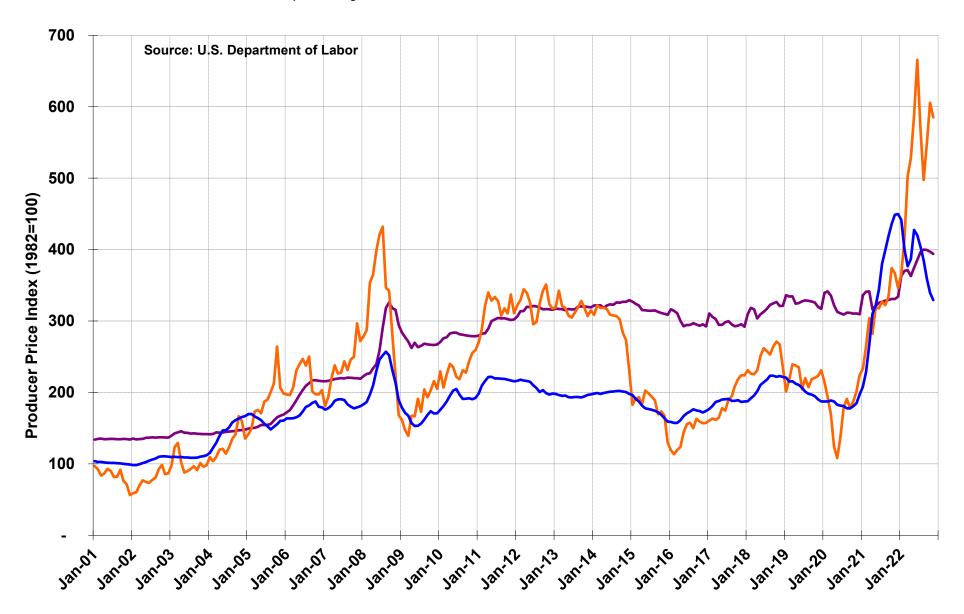

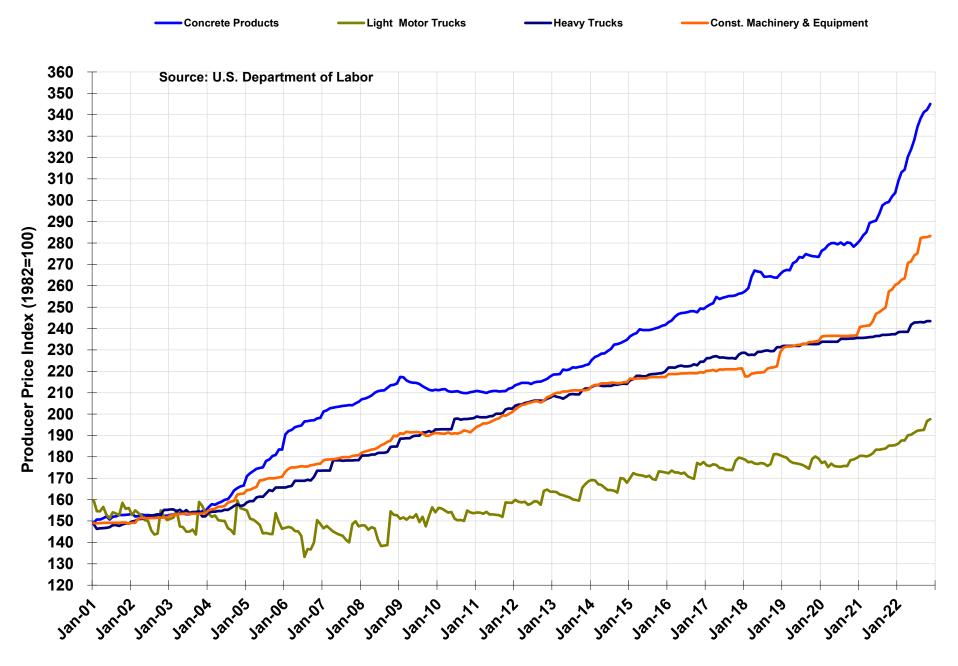


Producer Prices: Construction Inputs

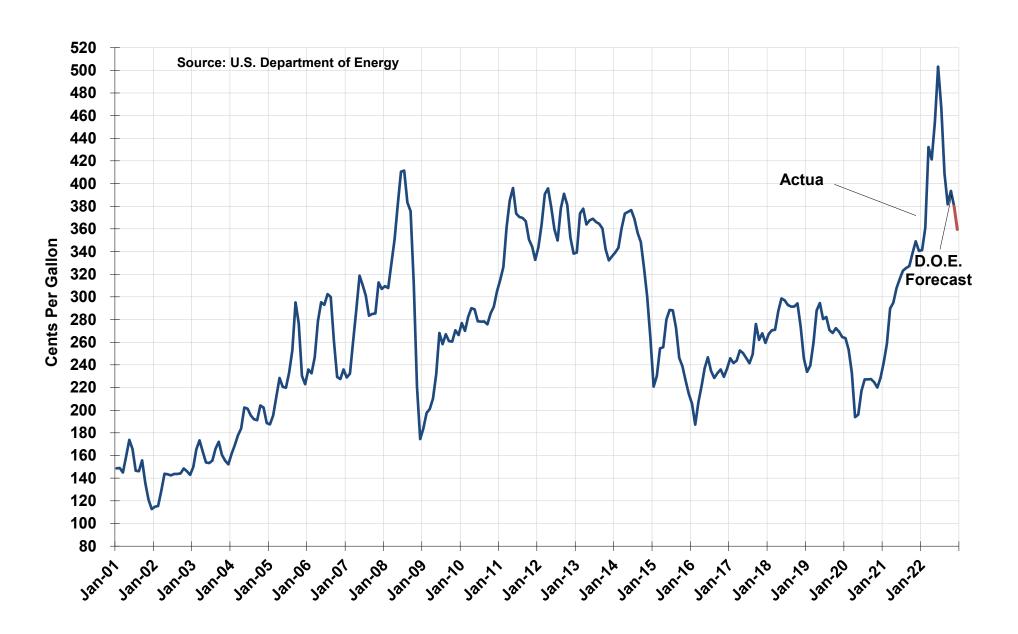
Asphalt Paving Mixtures No. 2 Diesel Fuel Steel Mill Products

Average Retail Price of Gasoline in U.S. All Grades

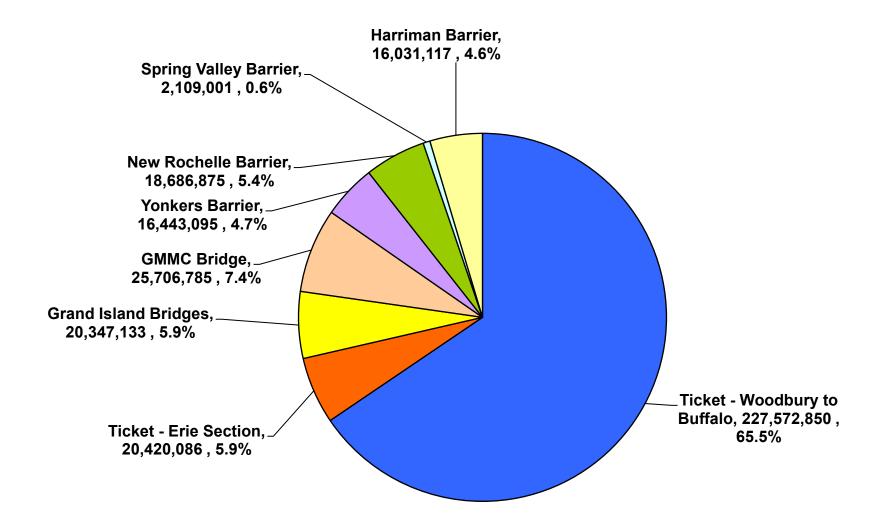

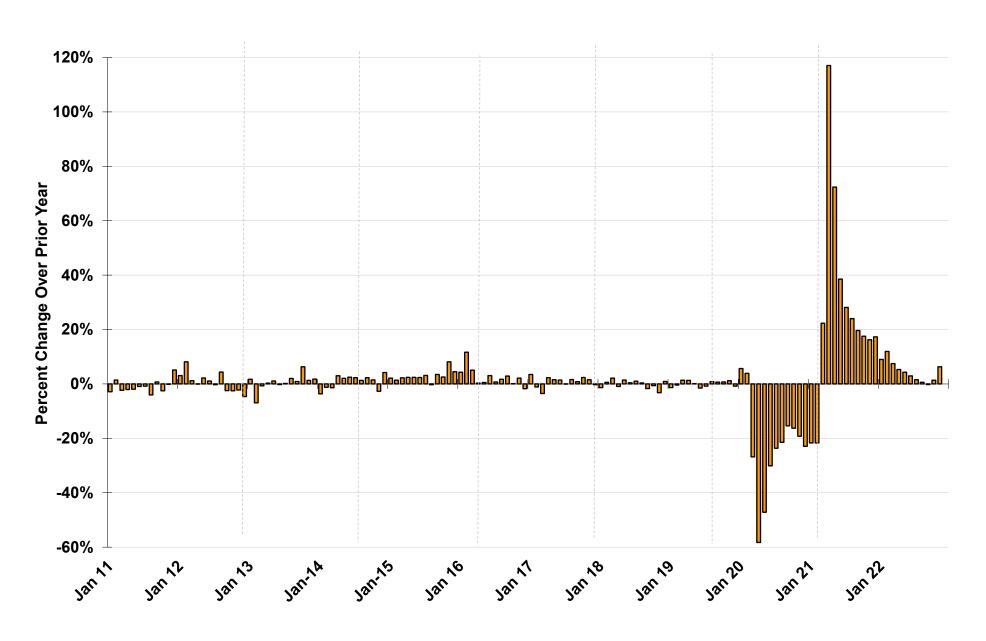

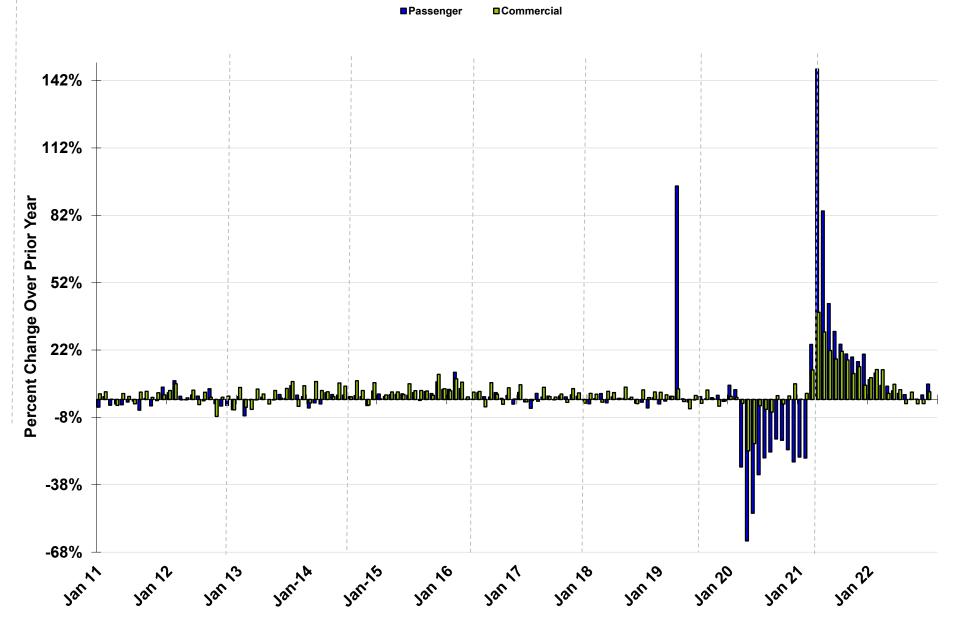
2022 YTD Total Thruway Trips, By Location

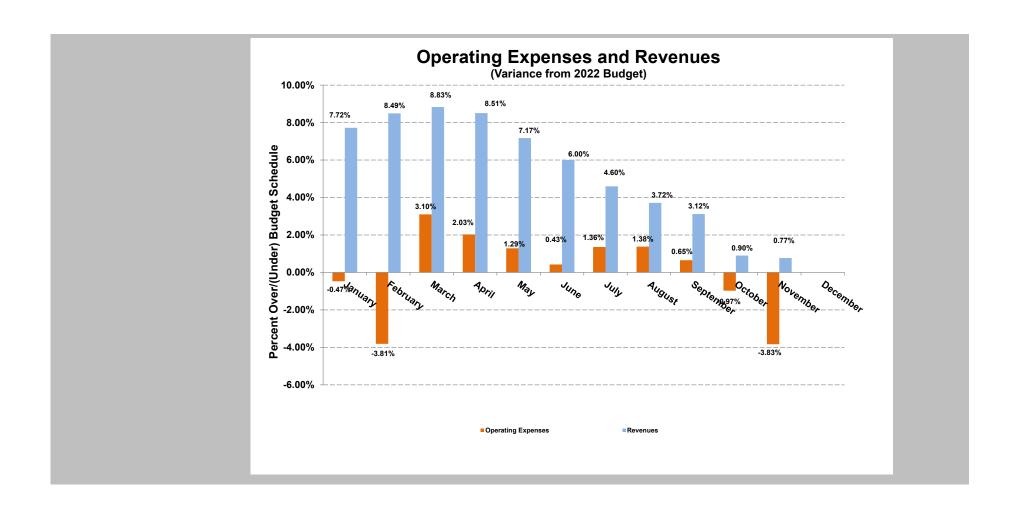


Percent Change in Monthly Thruway Traffic Total Passenger and Commercial Revenue Trips

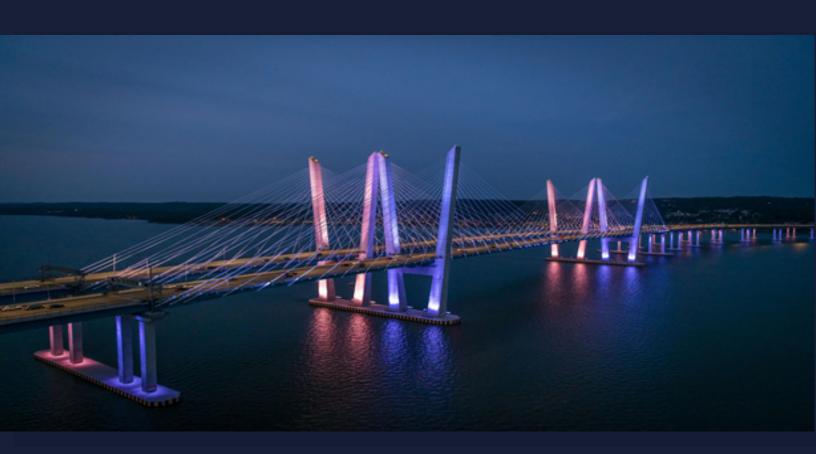

NOTE A - TOTAL REVENUES (pages 1 & 2):

Total revenues for the month are \$76,614,003, an increase of \$5,400,935 or 7.58%. Toll revenues for the month are \$71,278,586, an increase of \$8,435,024 or 13.42%. The increase in revenue is attributed to a toll adjustment implemented in January 2022 for traffic using the Governor Mario M. Cuomo Bridge. Additionally, E-ZPass toll revenue adjustments finalized in 2022 resulted in an increase in December 2022 toll revenue.

Total revenues year-to-date are \$899,939,246, an increase of \$73,526,403 or 8.90%. Toll revenues year-to-date are \$820,398,963, an increase of \$60,129,794 or 7.91%. Year-to-date passenger revenues increased \$35,488,936 or 8.77% and commercial revenues increased \$24,640,858 or 6.93%.

NOTE B - GASB 87, LEASES AND GASB 94, PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS (pages 1, 2, 3, 4, 6 & 15):

Effective December 2022 the Authority has adopted GASB Statement No. 87, Leases and GASB Statement 94, Public-Private Partnerships. The primary objective of these statements is to enhance the relevance and consistency of information about governments' leasing activities. The statements establish a single model for lease accounting based on the principle that leases are financings of the right to use an underlying asset.

Under GASB 87, a lessee is required to recognize a lease liability and an intangible right-to-use lease asset, and a lessor is required to recognize a lease receivable and a deferred inflow of resources for obligations and/or revenues that are fixed in nature.

Under GASB 94, if a government is a lessor in a public-private partnership that requires a lease to make a significant capital investment to construct assets on behalf of a lessor, the lessor is required to recognize the capital assets at the time they are placed in service with a corresponding deferred inflow equal to the amount invested by a leasee. In addition, a lessor is required to recognize a lease receivable and a deferred inflow of resources for revenues that are fixed in nature.

As of December 31, 2022, the Authority is the lessee on several office space and communication tower leases with remaining terms of 1 to 9 years; and is the lessor on the agreements detailed on Page 15.

In addition, the Authority is the lessor in a public-private partnership agreement for the design, construction, finance, operation and maintenance of the Authority's 27 Service Areas. This agreement is subject to GASB 94. Additional information can be found on Page 15 and Note G.

The Authority has restated Net Position by \$280,236 to comply with these accounting standards, but has not restated 2021 activity on the Statement of Revenues, Expense and Changes in Net Position or the Statement of Net Position.

NOTE D - PENSIONS (pages 7, 8 & 10):

The Authority's financial results comply with Government Accounting Standards Board Statement 68 (GASB 68) "Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions" and GASB 71, "Pension Transition for Contributions Made Subsequent to the Measurement Date."

GASB 68 and 71 establish accounting and financial reporting standards for pensions provided to Thruway Authority employees via the New York State and Local Employees' Retirement System (NYSLRS). These accounting standards require the net pension liability for the entire NYSLRS to be measured as a portion of the present value of projected payments to be provided through the pension plan to current active and inactive employees that is attributed to those employees' past periods of service (total pension liability), less the amount of the pension plan's fiduciary net position. A proportionate share of this net pension liability is then allocated to the Thruway Authority based on Thruway Authority's pensionable wages in comparison to the NYSLRS's total pensionable wages.

To comply with GASB 68 and 71, our financial statements may include an adjustment to reflect the difference between the amount of revenues set aside to fund contributions to NYSLRS and the expense reported to comply with GASB 68 and 71.

NOTE E - RETIREE HEALTH INSURANCE (pages 7, 8 & 10):

The Authority's financial results comply with Government Accounting Standards Board Statement 75 (GASB 75) "Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions." GASB 75 establishes accounting and reporting standards for "other post-employment benefits" offered by state and local governments. Other post-employment benefits (OPEB) are employee benefits other than pensions that are received after employment ends. OPEB benefits provided by the Authority consist of medical and prescription drug benefits provided via the New York State Health Insurance Program (NYSHIP).

The Authority is required to fund payments to NYSHIP to provide health insurance coverage, in the current year, for our current retirees. To comply with GASB 75, our financial statements may include an adjustment to reflect the difference between the amount paid to NYSHIP for retiree health insurance coverage and the expense reported to comply with GASB 75.

The following Departmental Operating Expenses exceeded the normal year-to-date expenditure percentage of 100%:

Center for Strategic Excellence

The overrun of 5.03% is due to higher than budgeted personal service costs.

Equipment Maintenance

The overrun of 6.12% is due to higher than budgeted costs associated with auto parts and repairs as well as AETC equipment maintenance and training.

Undistributed Charges

The overrun of 8.04% is due to higher than budgeted costs associated with service area remediation expense.

NOTE G - SERVICE AREAS (pages 13, 14 & 16):

In January 2021 the Authority entered into a 33-year agreement with Empire State Thruway Partners, LLC (Empire) for the design, construction, finance, operation, and maintenance of the Authority's 27 Service Areas. Empire will rebuild 23 of the 27 service area restaurant buildings and perform significant renovations to the remaining four. Empire's initial investment to rebuild and renovate the service areas is estimated to be \$300 million. Additionally, over the life of the agreement Empire will invest another \$99 million into future renovations and improvements.

The initial construction work will occur in two phases as detailed below. Phase 1 began in July 2021 when Empire assumed control of 16 service areas previously operated by HMSHost Corporation and Delaware North Corporation. Phase 2 began in January 2023 when Empire assumed control of the remaining 11 service areas that were operated by McDonald's Corporation until December 31, 2022.

Commencing with the reopening of each new restaurant building, the agreement requires Empire to pay rent calculated as a percentage of gross sales, subject to a guaranteed annual minimum per location. In addition, the agreement has ancillary rent provisions tied to the operation of commercial vehicle fueling stations at 5 of the service areas and advertising opportunities at all service areas. Sales generated by Empire during the operation of a restaurant prior to reconstruction (interim operations) are not subject to rent provisions. Over the life of the agreement, base rent calculated as a percentage of sales is forecasted to be \$85 million, of which \$51 million is guaranteed.

During the period of January 1, 2021 through July 29, 2021 HMSHost's obligation to pay rent was suspended.

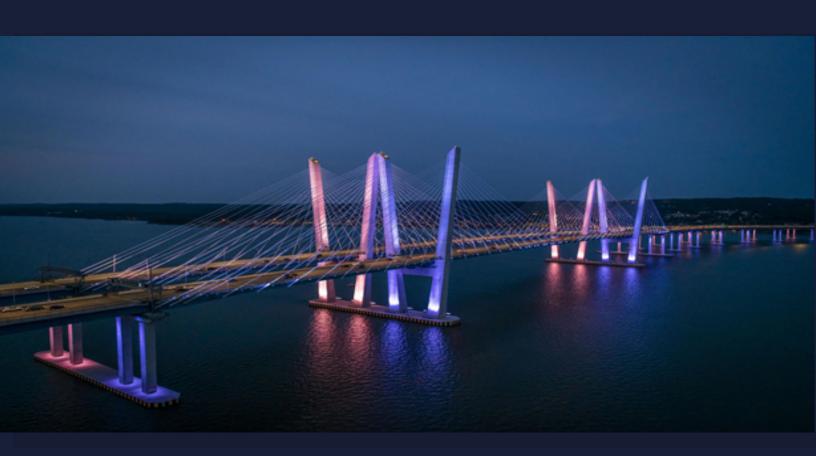

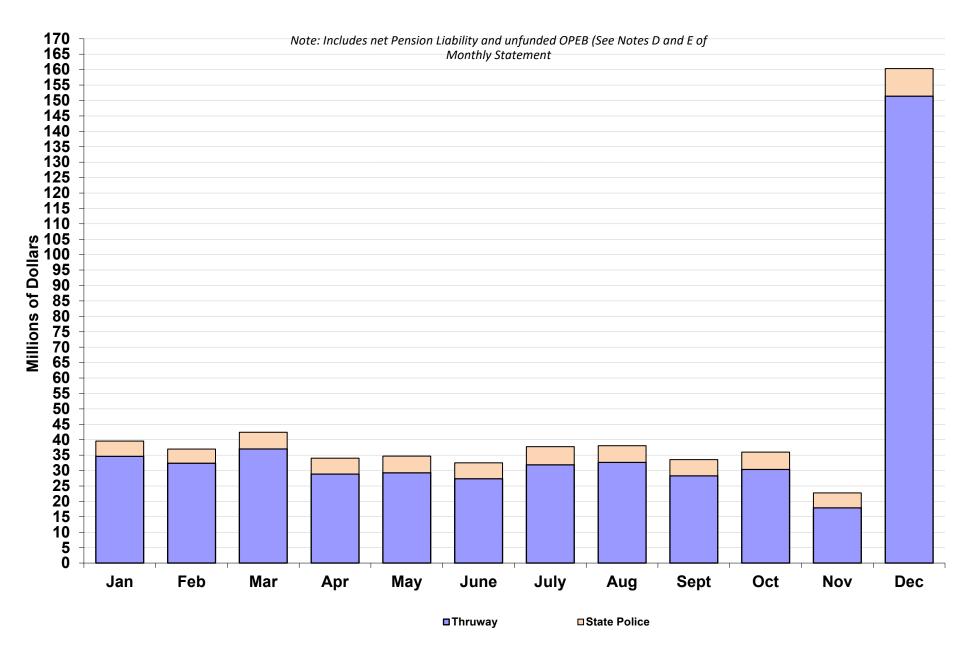

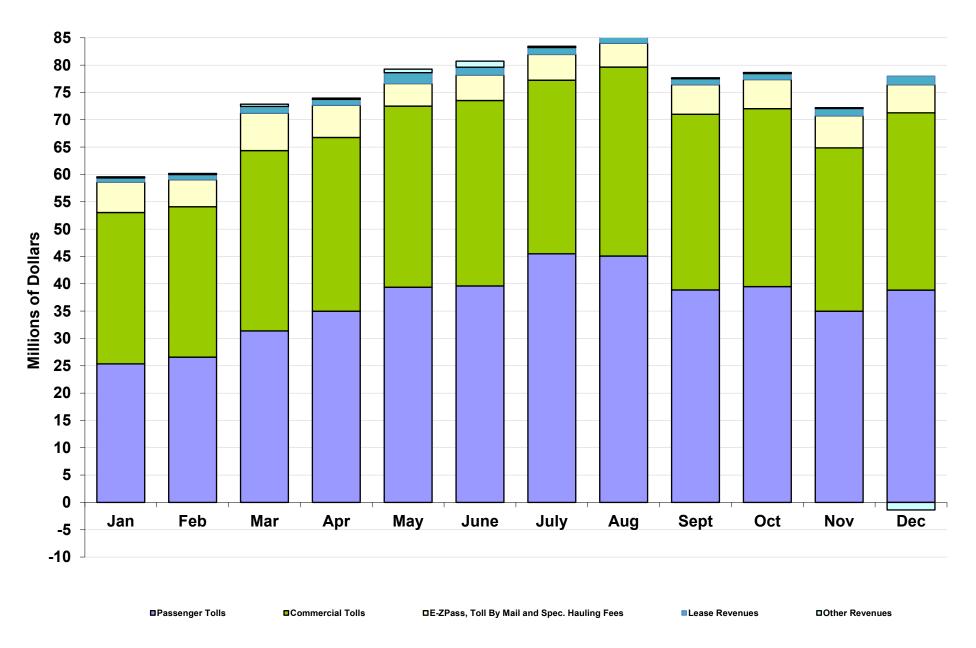

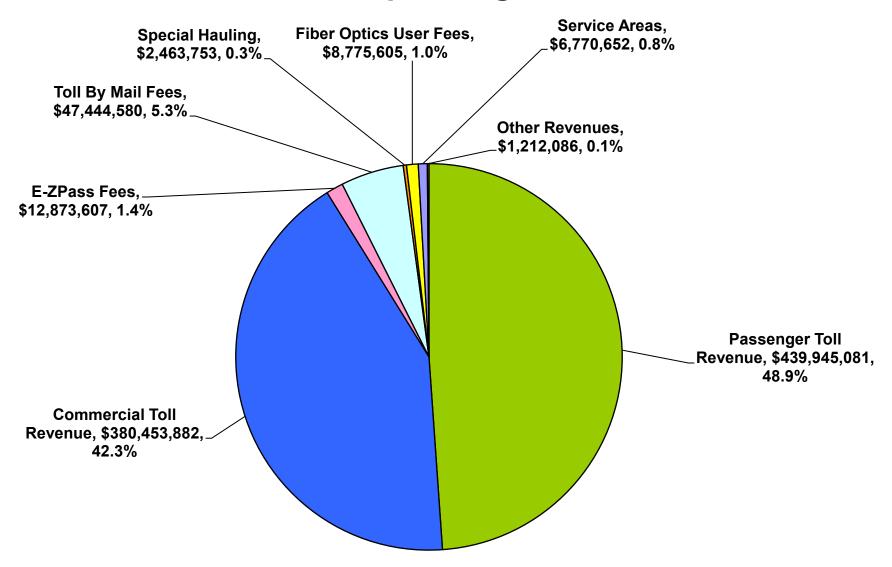

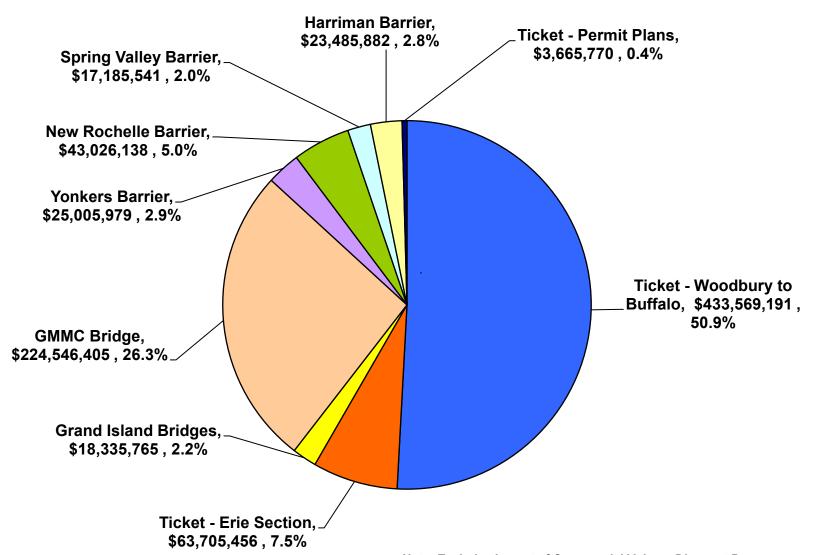
2022 YTD Operating Revenues



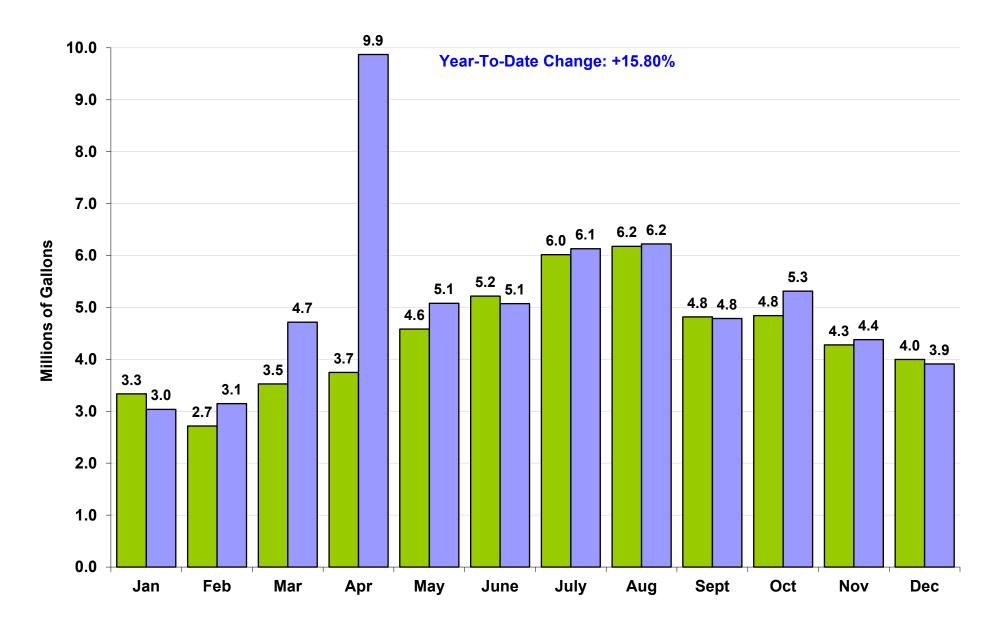
2022 YTD Operating Revenue



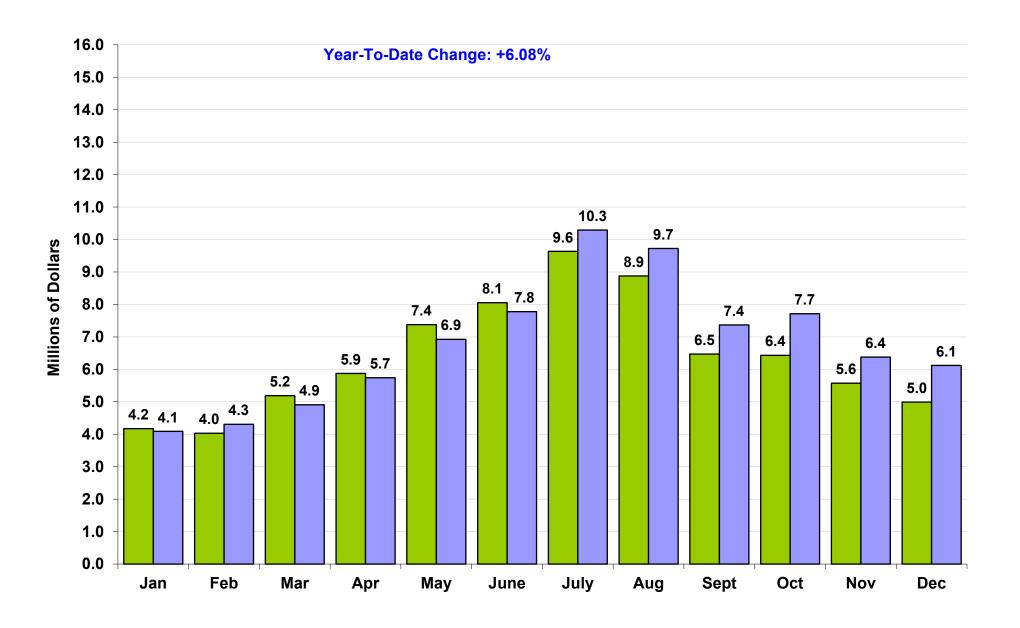
2022 YTD Toll Collections, By Location

Restaurant Sales at Service Plazas

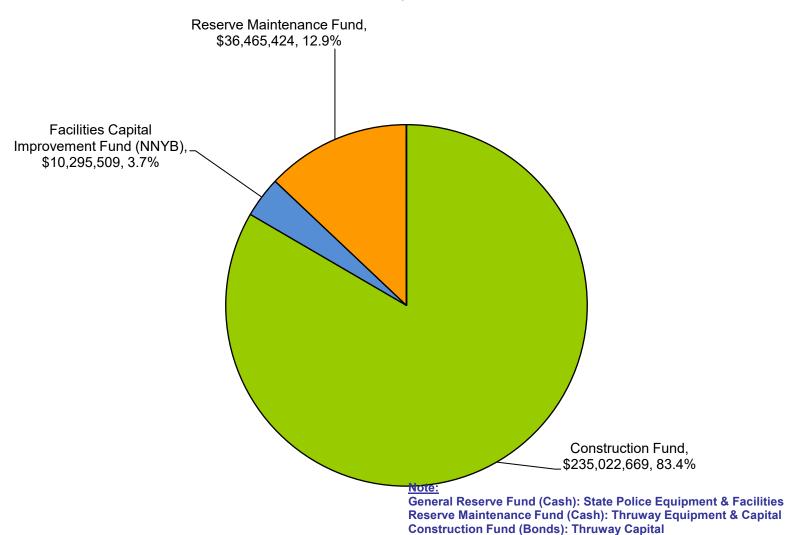

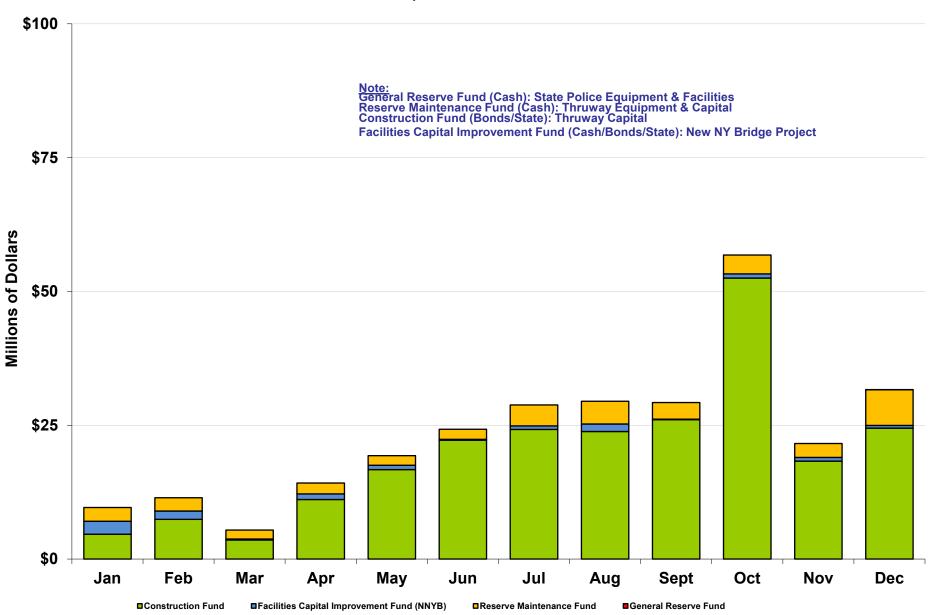

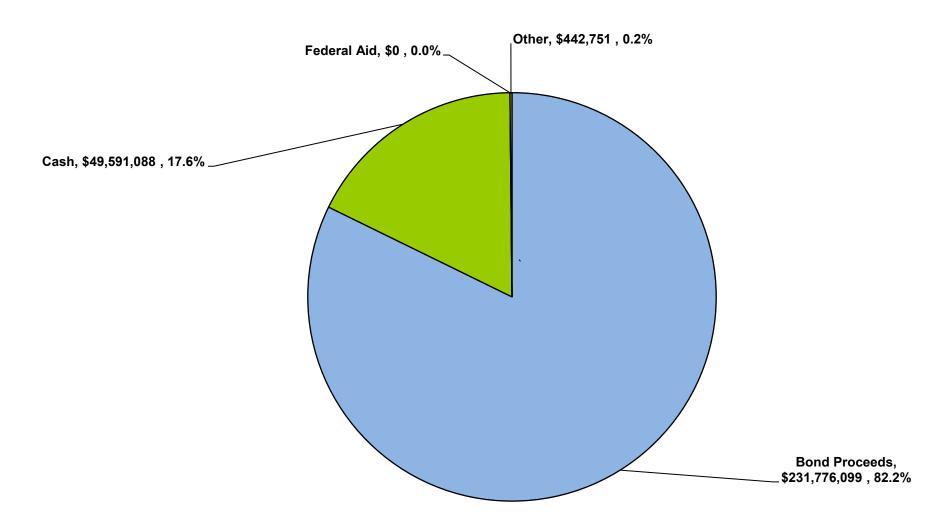
2022 YTD Capital Program Expenses, By Fund

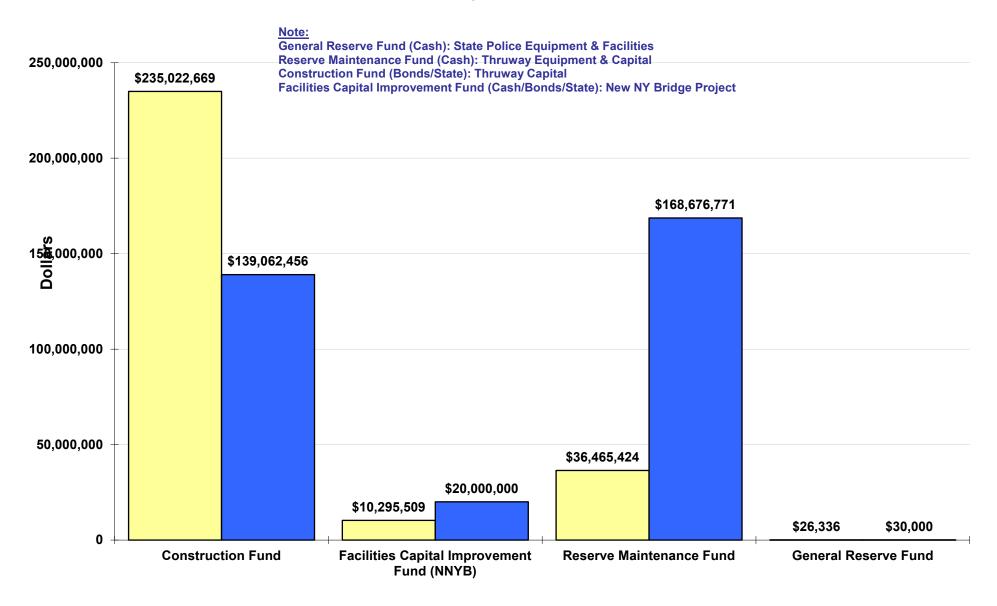
2022 YTD Capital Funding Sources

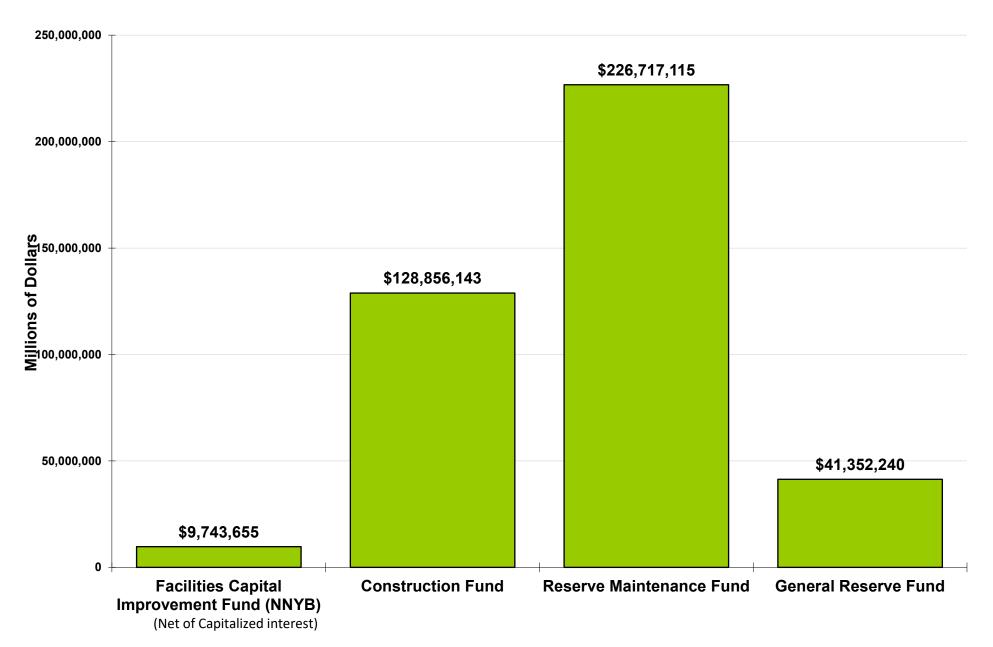


2022 YTD Capital Expenses, By Fund

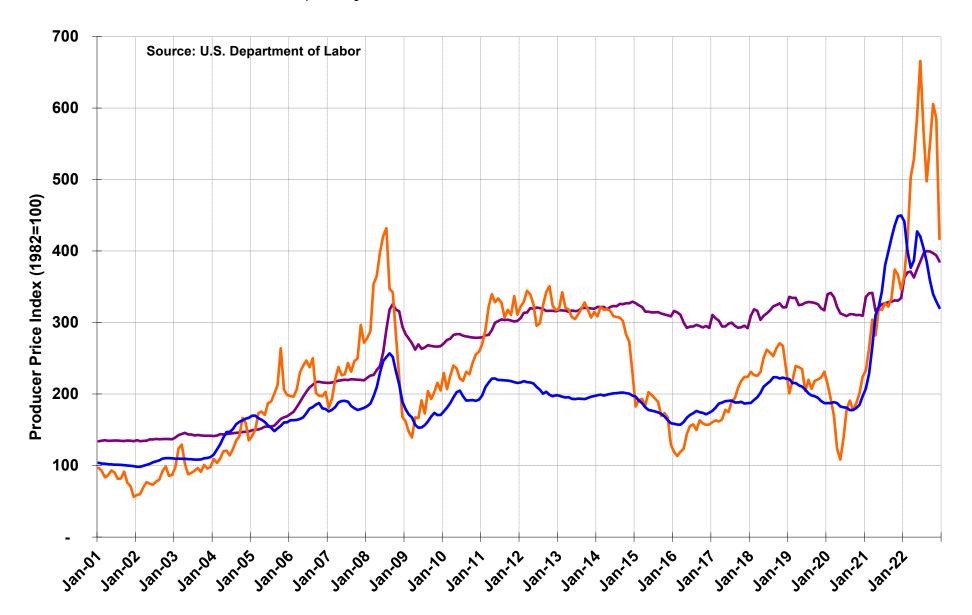


2022 Capital Fund Balances at End of Month

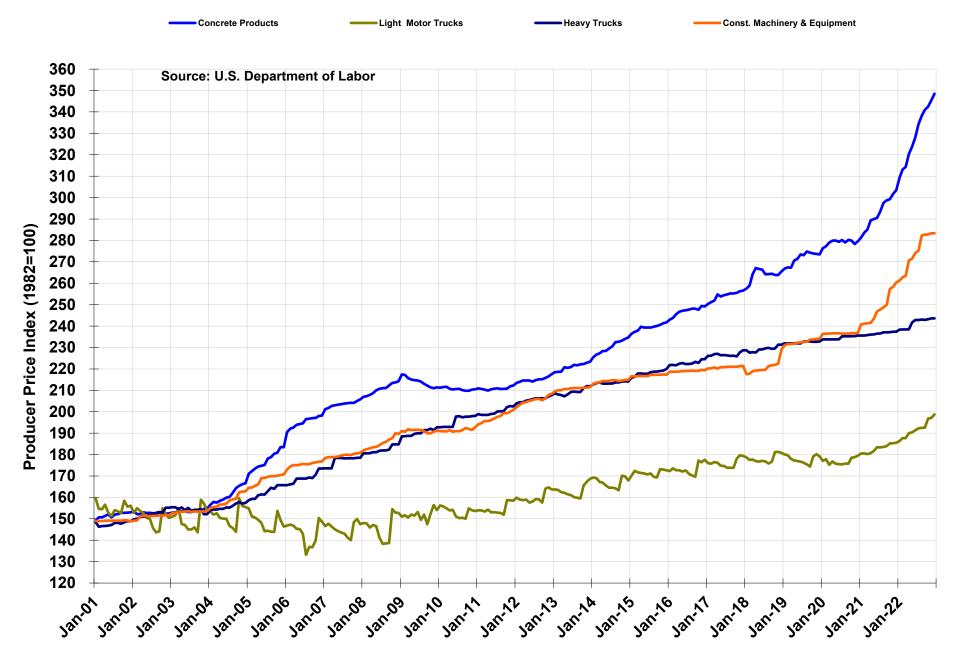


Producer Prices: Construction Inputs

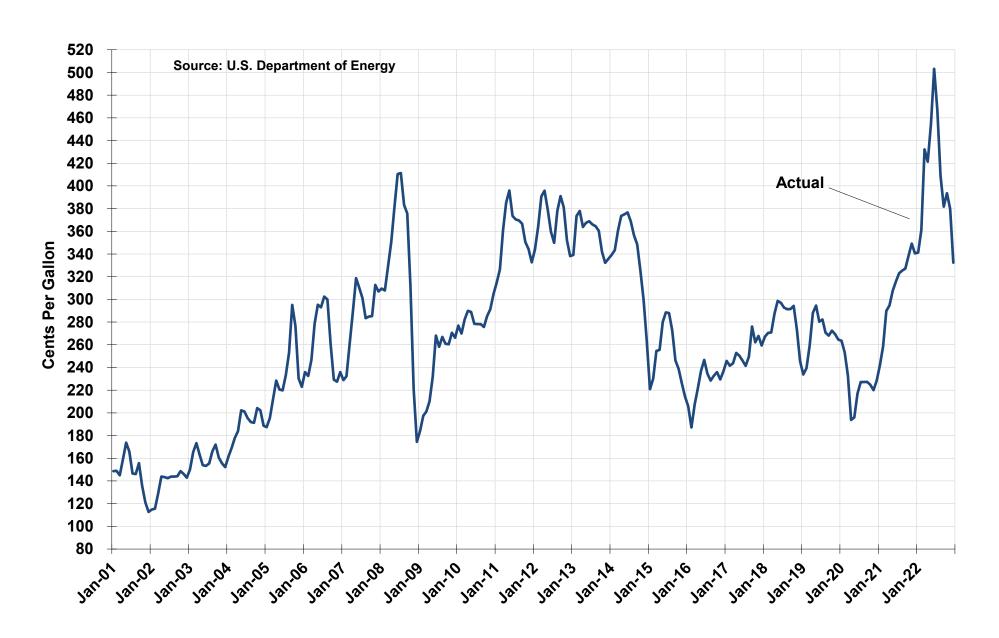
Asphalt Paving Mixtures No. 2 Diesel Fuel Steel Mill Products

Average Retail Price of Gasoline in U.S. All Grades

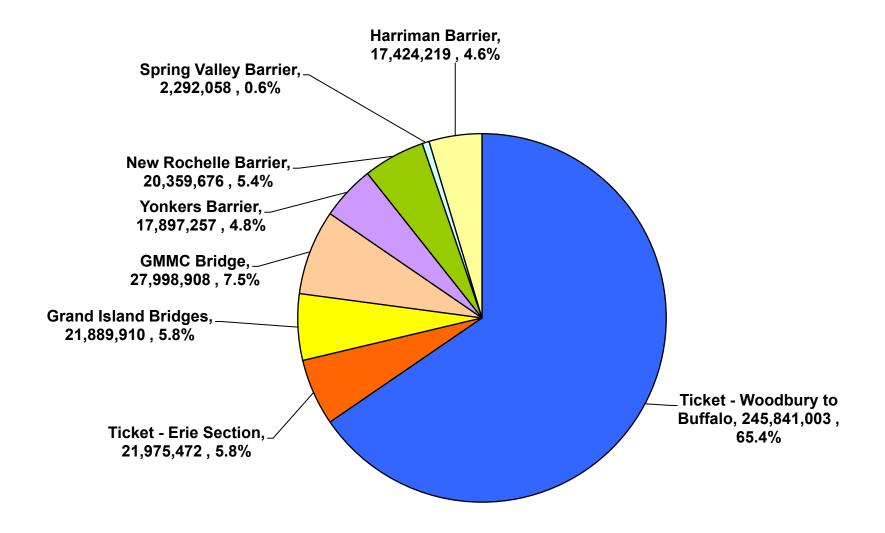

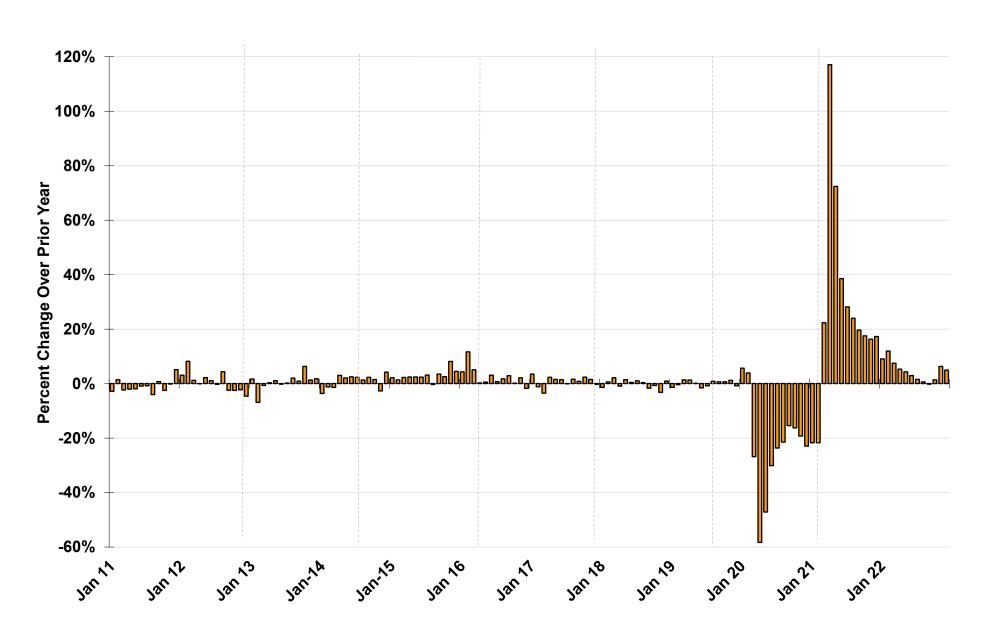

2022 YTD Total Thruway Trips, By Location

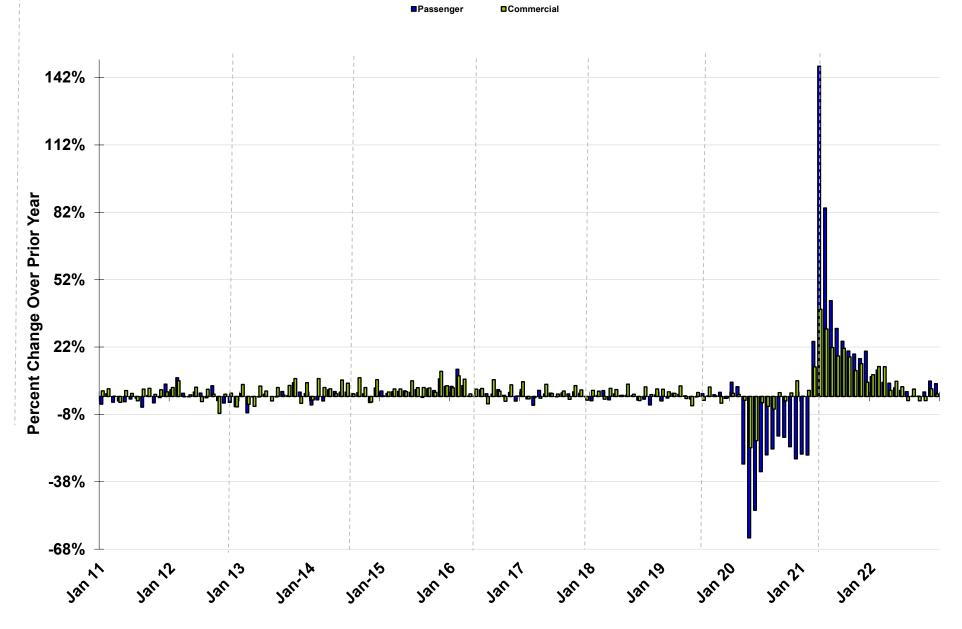


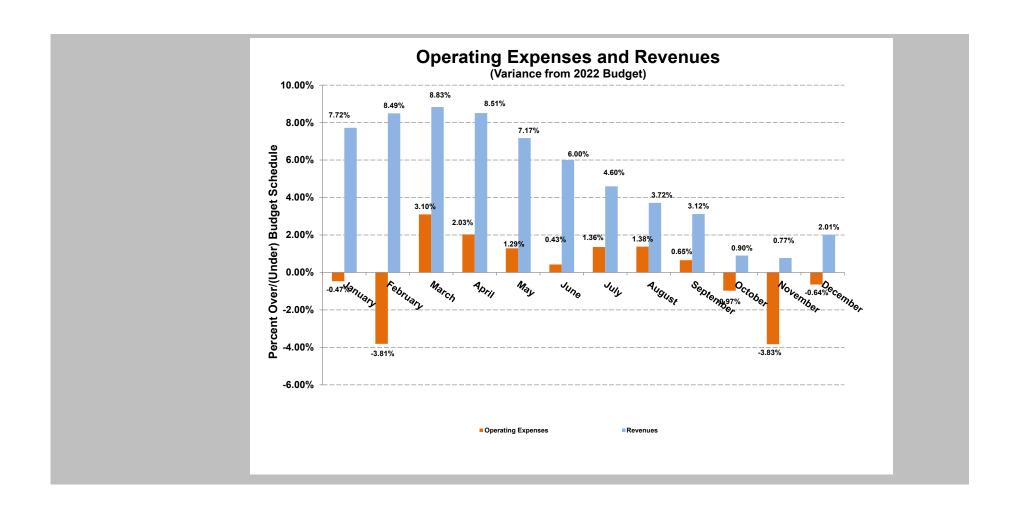
Percent Change in Monthly Thruway Traffic

SUBJECT: Review and Approval of the Authority's Annual Investment Report

A copy of this report must be submitted to the Office of the State Comptroller, the Senate Finance Committee and the Assembly Ways and Means Committee.

Exhibit A is the policy statement FINANCIAL INVESTMENTS. This policy was last approved at Board Meeting 753 on March 28, 2022 and there have been no updates since.

Exhibit B covers the annual independent audit by BST, LLC and Exhibit C is a listing of investment income for the calendar year 2022. The Authority does not pay fees or commissions on its investment transactions.

The Thruway Authority is responsible for the security and investment of all monies held in the various funds established by bond resolutions. The specific bond resolutions authorize the Authority to perform this function.

Authority funds are invested in accordance with the policy statement, investment guidelines issued by the State Comptroller and the respective bond resolutions. Funds administered by the Authority may be invested in obligations of or guaranteed by the United States

of America or the State of New York (other than obligations of the Authority), debt of state or local governments, agencies of the federal government, commercial paper, bankers' acceptances, time deposits and repurchase agreements. All bond resolutions permit such investments.

The policy statement FINANCIAL INVESTMENTS, attached hereto, provides the basic rules and structure for the investment of funds by the New York State Thruway Authority. The policy states the investment objectives and provides the guidelines for making investments and administering the program.

The Department of Finance and Accounts has reviewed the policy statement and believes that it meets all requirements established by the State Legislature and the Investment Guidelines for Public Authorities developed by the Office of the State Comptroller.

RECOMMENDATION:

ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY

A. General Information

- 1. All Thruway Authority funds authorized in Section 502 of the General Revenue Bond Resolution adopted August 3, 1992, as amended January 5, 2007, are applicable to the production of investment income. These funds are either administered by the Authority or by the appointed Trustee.
 - a. Sections 503-514 of the General Revenue Bond Resolution describe the purpose of these funds and provide for the investment of such funds.
 - b. Section 1303 of the General Revenue Bond Resolution includes the authorization to place revenues and other moneys of the Authority held or set aside under the Resolution in time deposits as well as demand deposits. Such deposits shall be secured by direct obligations of the United States of America or the State of New York of a market value at least equal to the amount of such deposits.
- 2. Sections 502-511 of the Local Highway and Bridge Service Contract Bond Resolution, adopted August 23, 1991, as further amended and supplemented on September 17, 2003, describe the purpose of these funds. Sections 701 and 702 provide for the security and investment of such funds to be administered by the Thruway Authority.
- 3. Sections 503-511 of the Highway and Bridge Trust Fund Bond Resolution, adopted May 19, 1994, describe the purpose of these funds. Sections 701 and 702 provide for the security and investment of such funds to be administered by the Thruway Authority.
- 4. Sections 503-510 of the State Personal Income Tax Revenue Bonds (Transportation) General Bond Resolution, adopted June 27, 2002, as amended and supplemented on June 6, 2022, describe the purpose of these funds. Section A-701 of Annex A, which contains the State Personal Income Tax Revenue Bonds Standard Resolution Provisions, provides for the security and investment of such funds to be administered by the Thruway Authority.
- 5. Sections 503-511 of the Second Highway and Bridge Trust Fund Bond Resolution, adopted February 27, 2003, describe the purpose of these funds. Sections 701 and 702 provide for the security and investment of such funds to be administered by the Thruway Authority.

B. Investment of Funds Administered by the Authority

- 1. In accordance with Chapter 330 of the Laws of 1991, moneys of the Authority and funds administered by the Authority may be invested in obligations in which the Comptroller may invest pursuant to Section 98-a of the State Finance Law. Investments in commercial paper, agencies of the federal government and bankers acceptances are now permitted by statute if defined in the authorizing bond resolution. All Bond Resolutions permit such investments.
- 2. The Authority may sell such investments at any time.
- 3. Interest earned is credited to the appropriate fund in accordance with the respective Bond Resolution.

C. <u>Investment of Funds Administered by the Trustee</u>

- 1. The following funds administered by the Trustee are invested by the Trustee, if, and as the Authority directs, pursuant to the respective Bond Resolution:
 - a. Senior Debt Service Reserve Fund;
 - b. Senior Debt Service Fund;
 - c. Junior Indebtedness Debt Service Reserve Account;
 - d. Junior Indebtedness Debt Service Payment Account;
 - e. Local Highway and Bridge Service Contract Bond Service Funds;
 - f. Highway and Bridge Trust Fund Debt Service Fund;
 - g. State Personal Income Tax Revenue Bonds (Transportation) Debt Service Fund.
- 2. The Trustee sells any of such investments if directed by the Authority.
- 3. Interest earned on all funds is credited to the appropriate fund in accordance with the respective Bond Resolution.

D. Investment Objectives

The basic investment objectives of the Thruway Authority provide for:

- 1. The protection of funds by investing as outlined by the Bond Resolutions (see Section A above);
- 2. The preservation of principal;
- 3. Proper application of funds;
- 4. The maintenance of demand bank balances at minimum levels consistent with sound operations;
- 5. The maximization of income from all Authority funds available for investment.

E. <u>Investment Practices</u>

1. Authority Bond Resolutions define investment obligations. Currently, in accordance with Chapter 330 of the Laws of 1991, moneys of the Authority may be invested in obligations in which the Comptroller may invest pursuant to Section 98-a of the State Finance Law.

Demand and time deposits can be placed with a bank or trust company as defined by law and must be secured by direct obligations of the United States or of the State of New York having a market value at least equal to the deposits. These statutory investment requirements serve as the basic guidelines followed for all Authority investments.

2. The Authority has a designated custodian and third-party fiduciary of collateral held in escrow for demand and time deposits.

The Authority also has designated an institution to hold in safekeeping securities purchased by the Authority, including securities purchased under repurchase agreements, for all funds except Debt Service and Debt Service Reserve Funds. The safekeeping of securities for these funds is administered by the Trustee.

3. It is the Authority's policy to purchase securities with the intention of holding them to maturity. In addition to the security of the funds invested, the goal of the investment program is to maximize investment income through interest earnings.

4. The factors considered for each investment made by the Authority are as follows:

a. Maximizing Interest Income

Knowledge of market conditions is maintained daily. Current interest yields by type of investment together with forecasts of future interest trends are reviewed and analyzed to determine investment policy that will maximize earnings. As a result, the Authority's concentration of investments may vary depending on market yields of various types of investment and the availability of collateral.

b. Cash Disbursement Requirements

To insure cash availability, near term and annual disbursement requirements are continually updated. Monthly cash requirements for operating expenses are projected and forecasts of capital expenditures and reserve maintenance disbursements are made. Investments for one month or less are made in time deposits, discount notes, commercial paper, repurchase agreements and Treasury bills with maturities coinciding with payroll dates and projected payment needs. Longer term investments are also made in commercial paper, time deposits and U.S. Treasuries or government agencies with maturities allowing for cash availability during the construction season, on debt service payment dates and other periods requiring large cash availability. Funds are also available in the Authority's checking accounts for current disbursement requirements.

c. Term of Investments

Market conditions and cash flow requirements are considered in determining the term of an investment. In addition, rates offered by institutions are often contingent on the length of time funds are required by them. As a result, depositories may request a specific term for the investment which could be agreeable to the Authority because of the attractive rate offered. The term of an investment is also influenced by the maturity dates of other investments within the fund. An over concentration of short or long-term maturities within some funds is avoided.

d. Type of Investment and Amount Available for Investment

• Each type of investment is typically associated with a different minimum amount. Treasury bills, Treasury notes and Treasury bonds require a minimum purchase of \$100 and then can be purchased in increments of \$100. Agency issues require a minimum purchase of \$1,000 and then can be purchased in increments of \$1,000. (Note: Some agency or Treasury issues may require a minimum purchase of \$5,000.)

Repurchase agreements generally must be for amounts of at least \$1,000,000 and certificates of deposit start at \$100,000. Usually, Authority investments are made for amounts of at least \$100,000.

- The typical term or maturity for each type of investment varies as well. Treasury bills when first sold usually carry terms of four weeks, three months, six months or one year. Treasury notes when first sold usually carry a maturity of two to ten years while Treasury bonds carry maturities of 30 years.
- Certificates of deposit generally range in term from seven days to one year. Repurchase agreements generally range from overnight to six months. The Authority generally utilizes repurchase agreements for investments normally not exceeding 60 days.
- Also, some institutions have minimum investment amounts required for time deposits and repurchase agreement transactions. Therefore, the amount available for investment may influence the institutions contacted for rate quotations from time to time.

e. Availability of Collateral

U.S. Government securities available for sale under repurchase agreements or available as collateral for time deposits are held in different proportions by banks. Therefore, the availability of appropriate collateral influences the type of investment and the bank in which an investment is placed.

f. Revenue Projections

Near term and annual revenue projections are used as a basis for current investment decisions. Monthly charge account payments and other revenue receipts are anticipated and invested or are used for current disbursements as required. Short-term revenue investments are made for the period prior to the date revenues are required to be paid into the Operating Fund or remitted to the Trustee for allocation as required by Section 504 of the General Revenue Bond Resolution.

g. <u>Investment Concentration</u>

- Funds in the Senior Debt Service, Senior Debt Service Reserve Funds, the Junior Indebtedness Debt Service Payment Account and the Junior Indebtedness Debt Service Reserve Account must be held by the Trustee. Inasmuch as the balance in the Senior Debt Service Fund and the Junior Indebtedness Debt Service Payment Account represents accrued senior debt service and accrued junior debt service, respectively, for the current year, investments in this fund are generally less than one year.
- The Authority may maintain a higher concentration of deposits in demand accounts if market conditions are such that the earnings rate credit earned on these accounts is higher than what could be earned on permitted investments. (Demand accounts are fully collateralized with the pledged securities held by a third party custodian.)
- The Authority's bond proceeds, operating reserves, retirement funding, debt service and revenue fund balances generally represent almost all of the investment portfolio and are required for near term disbursements. Investments purchased with these funds normally mature within 18 months. As a result, the portfolio relationship of U.S. Treasuries, agencies or time deposits will vary depending on market conditions. Working capital in the Operating Fund is invested in short-term instruments.
- The Authority will maintain an investment concentration in each portfolio not to exceed the percentages noted for the authorized investment instruments. The Chief Financial Officer is authorized to approve any deviation from these limits on a case by case basis.

For example, if the Authority had a total of \$100 million in its investment portfolio to be invested, \$85 million could be invested in Federal Agencies of which only \$40 million could be invested in FHLB paper.

• The Authority has established Investment Guidelines that include standards for the diversification of investments both by type and investment institution. These Guidelines are periodically reviewed and approved by the Authority's Chief Financial Officer.

h. Financial Strength of Institutions

- The Authority has established a list of approved banks and broker/dealers. Banks and broker/dealers must meet established criteria and be approved by the Chief Financial Officer to be placed on this list. The list specifies the investment instruments that may be purchased from the approved bank or broker/dealer.
- Investments in time deposits are made only with commercial banks. Their annual reports are reviewed to determine satisfactory financial strength. The required collateral is held by the Authority's third party custodian.
- Purchases of U.S. Treasuries and other securities require the seller to transfer securities
 to the Authority's custodian. The financial strength of the dealer or bank is not a factor
 in the purchase of securities inasmuch as they are only the seller of the obligations
 which are transferred through the Federal Reserve Bank or Depository Trust Company
 book entry system.
- The Authority enters into repurchase agreements only with dealers or banks on the Federal Reserve's most recent list of primary reporting dealers in government securities and executes a master written agreement with each dealer or bank prior to the initial repurchase transaction.

F. Description of Investments Used by the New York State Thruway Authority

1. <u>U.S. Treasury Securities</u>

a. Treasury Bills

Short-term, direct obligations of the U.S. Government that are usually issued with maturities of four weeks, three months, six months or one year. Bills are issued in amounts of \$100 and up in multiples of \$100. Bills do not bear a stated interest rate; the interest is calculated by taking the difference between the discount price paid at purchase and the face amount (par) collected at maturity.

b. Treasury Notes

Direct obligations of the U.S. Government to pay a specified rate of interest for a specified period of time on the face value (par) of the instrument. Interest is paid semi-annually and the life of notes is usually limited to ten years or under. Treasury notes can usually be purchased in \$100 denominations and require a \$100 minimum purchase.

c. Treasury Bonds

Direct obligations of the U.S. Government to pay a specified rate of interest for a specified period of time on the face value (par) of the bond. Interest is paid semi-annually and the life of the bonds is 30 years. Treasury bonds can usually be purchased in \$100 denominations and require a \$100 minimum purchase.

2. Federal Agencies

Obligations sponsored or guaranteed by government agencies and not direct obligations of the United States. Securities invested in may include bonds with a stated coupon for a fixed period of time paying interest at maturity or discount notes. Discount notes, the more common, are sold at a discount from par and earn interest on the basis of the actual number of days until maturity. At the time of investment, such agencies or its obligations must be rated at the highest rating of all independent rating agencies. In addition, no more than \$250,000,000 may be invested in the obligations of any one agency.

3. Municipal Debt

Obligations of state or local government municipal bond issuers which are rated in one of the two highest Rating Categories by S&P and Moody's or obligations of state or local government municipal bond issuers, the principal of and interest on which, when due and payable, have been insured by an insurance policy or guaranteed by a letter of credit and which are rated in one of the two highest Rating Categories by S&P and Moody's.

4. Certificate of Deposit

A negotiable or non-negotiable receipt from a bank for deposit of funds for a specified period of time at a specified rate of interest. Certificates of deposit generally range from seven days to one year and the minimum amount is \$100,000.

5. Repurchase Agreement

Consists of a primary reporting bank or dealer selling U.S. Treasury securities or securities of a federal agency for cash to the Authority which, at the same time, agrees to buy them back on an established date and at an agreed upon rate of interest. Generally, the Authority uses this type of investment for periods ranging from overnight to 60 days.

Repurchase agreements generally start at \$1,000,000. Payment is made against the delivery of the securities. Delivery is required. Substitution of the securities is permitted by the Authority in accordance with the Authority's repurchase agreement with the bank or broker.

6. Commercial Paper

Negotiable unsecured promissory notes issued for a specific face amount that mature on a specific future date. Maturities range from 1 to 270 days. Commercial paper is generally sold at a discount with the full face value paid at maturity. It is generally issued in book entry form, with minimum denominations beginning at \$100,000. The Authority can only purchase commercial paper in the highest Rating Category by S&P and Moody's (A-1+/P-1 and A-1/P-1). In addition, the issuer must have maintained such rating for similar obligations during the preceding six month period. No more than \$250,000,000 may be invested in the obligations of any one corporation.

7. Bankers' Acceptances

A bankers' acceptance is a promised future payment, or time draft, which is accepted and guaranteed by a bank and drawn on a deposit at the bank. After acceptance, the draft becomes an unconditional liability of the bank. The holder of the draft can sell it for cash at a discount to a buyer who is willing to wait until the maturity date for the funds in the deposit. They are widely used in international trade for payments that are due for a future shipment of goods and services. Maturities range from 30 to 180 days, but the Authority may only invest in bankers' acceptances maturing within 90 days. Bankers' acceptances are typically sold in multiples of \$100,000. No more than \$250,000,000 may be invested in such bankers' acceptances of any one bank or trust company.

G. Procedures Used in Making Investments

As approved by Board Resolution, a written contract is not required for certain investment transactions entered into by the Authority as it is neither practical nor a regular business practice for the types of investment instruments purchased by the Authority. Detailed records are maintained by the Authority indicating the banks or broker/dealers contacted for the purchase of each investment and the investment instrument and firm selected for the purchase.

1. <u>U.S. Treasury Securities</u>

When purchasing U.S. Treasury obligations (bills, notes and bonds), the Authority contacts a minimum of four security dealers or banks for the best rate offered for the investment. When a determination is made regarding which dealer or bank the Authority will make the purchase from, funds are transferred to the appropriate bank, for use by the bank to purchase the securities. The bank releases the funds covering the purchase only after advice from the Federal Reserve Bank that the securities have been received through the Federal Reserve book entry system.

2. Federal Agencies

When purchasing federal agency obligations (bonds, debentures and notes) the Authority contacts a minimum of four security dealers or banks for the best rate offered for the investment. When a determination is made regarding which dealer or bank the Authority will make the purchase from, funds are transferred to the appropriate bank, similar to the procedure for purchasing Treasury securities noted in number 1 above. The bank releases the funds covering the purchase only after advice from the Federal Reserve Bank that the securities have been received through the Federal Reserve book entry system.

3. Certificates of Deposit

- a. When certificates of deposit are purchased, a determination is made regarding the length of time for which the investment should be purchased.
- b. In order to determine current market rates, interest rate quotations are obtained from at least two banks or trust companies as defined by law. There are currently a number of banks in which the Authority has contracted to purchase certificates of deposit in which appropriate collateral has been pledged in accordance with the General Bond Resolutions. The determination regarding which banks are to be contacted is based upon the availability of collateral and the amount of monies already invested with that bank.

- c. Funds are generally invested with the bank paying the highest rate of interest, providing there is sufficient collateral to cover such investment. These banks, in addition to posting collateral, have expressed interest in issuing certificates of deposit, have demonstrated an ability and willingness to provide competitive interest rates and are financially sound.
- d. Funds to cover the certificates of deposit are wired directly to the bank in which the certificate of deposit is purchased. There are two written agreements executed between the Authority and each bank. These agreements are an undertaking and an assignment of securities. These agreements commit the bank from which the Authority has purchased a certificate of deposit to the Authority's terms and conditions of sale and indemnifies and holds the Authority harmless for any loss of funds. Only with the approval of the Authority are adjustments made in the amount of collateral held by the designated custodian and third party fiduciary. Collateral is priced to insure that the market value of the securities pledged is equal to or greater than the amount invested in certificates of deposit.
- e. When the market value of the collateral is not sufficient to cover the investments currently held, additional collateral is immediately pledged.
- f. When a certificate of deposit matures, and the funds are not immediately needed, they are generally rolled over with the same bank. However, if the bank is not paying a competitive rate of interest, the funds are transferred to another bank or invested in other authorized investments.

4. Repurchase Agreements

- a. The Authority enters into repurchase agreements with those banks or brokers appearing on the Federal Reserve Bank's most current list of primary reporting dealers in government securities. In addition, the Authority enters into a written agreement with each bank or broker prior to investing in repurchase agreements. The written agreement commits the broker or bank to the repurchase of the securities and provides for the Authority's right to sell the securities should the bank or broker default at the time the repurchase agreement matures.
- b. When a repurchase agreement investment is made by the Authority, funds are wired to the appropriate bank. The bank releases the funds covering the purchase only after the securities (direct obligations of, or guaranteed by, the U.S. Government or Agencies of the Government if allowed by the authorizing Bond Resolution) are received by the bank based on advice from the Federal Reserve Bank that the securities have been received through the Federal Reserve book entry system. The requirement is payment only against delivery, which is the same requirement used when Treasury or Agency securities are

purchased outright. The Authority also receives written confirmation of the securities purchased underlying the repurchase agreement. The description of the securities is provided at the time the investment is made to enable the Authority to price the securities and determine that the market value is sufficient to cover the principal and interest payment to be made at maturity and provide a margin of safety.

- c. During the term of a repurchase agreement, the Authority will allow the bank or broker to substitute securities for the original securities purchased in accordance with the Authority's repurchase agreement with the bank or broker.
- d. Repurchase agreements may be for overnight investments or periods generally not exceeding 60 days. This requirement protects the Authority from significant fluctuations occurring in the market value of the securities. Should the market value not be equal to the amount of the investment and the interest to be paid at maturity, additional securities are delivered to cover the investment.

5. Commercial Paper

Generally, purchases of commercial paper are used for investments not exceeding 180 days. When purchasing commercial paper the Authority contacts a minimum of four security dealers for the highest yield offered. Upon determining the successful dealer, funds are wire transferred to the appropriate bank. The bank releases the funds covering the purchase only after receipt of the actual securities or advice from the Depository Trust Company that the securities are in the Authority's name in the book entry system.

6. Bankers' Acceptances

Bankers' acceptances would be purchased using the same procedure for purchasing commercial paper, however, the maximum term is 90 days from date of purchase.

H. Procedure for Receiving Securities Through Federal Reserve Book Entry

The appropriate bank receives advice per Fed Wire that their securities account at the Fed is credited and their cash position at the Fed is charged. Payment is made at the same time to the dealer or bank through their cash position at the Fed. When the bank receives this advice, they charge the Thruway account only if authorized by the Authority and reimburse their cash position at the Fed. If securities are not for the Thruway account, the account is not charged and the bank recovers the cost of securities plus interest, if appropriate, from the seller of the securities.

I. Responsibilities

1. Chief Financial Officer

- a. Approves the selection of depository banks and broker/dealers for the purchase and sale of securities and for securing all types of time deposits. Approval will be made based on the response from the bank or firm to the Authority's Broker/Dealer Questionnaire and submission of other required information.
- b. Gives instructions to brokers or bank agents to buy or sell such securities.
- c. Binds and obligates the banking agent or brokers and the Authority at all times in every way for the completion of any contract, arrangement or transaction entered into for or on behalf of the Authority.
- d. Establishes and maintains an internal control structure that provides assurance that the investment objectives of the Authority are met and that the Authority's investments are protected from loss, theft or misuse.
- e. Approves Investment Guidelines as submitted by the Director of Investments and Asset Management.
- f. Submits to the Authority Board and Finance Committee on a quarterly basis a report of the investments purchased within the quarter, the inventory of existing investments and the banks, brokers, agents or dealers from whom the investments were purchased.
- g. Ensures that an independent audit is completed of the Authority's investment activities to ensure compliance with this Policy.
- h. Makes an annual report to the Authority Board and Finance Committee of all investment transactions made by the Chief Financial Officer during the calendar year.
- i. Submits for Authority Board and Finance Committee approval an annual report which includes guidelines for making investments, the results of the annual independent audit, the investment income record and a list of the total fees, commissions or other charges paid to each investment banker, agent, dealer and adviser rendering investment associated services since the last report.

An examination involves performing procedures to obtain evidence about whether the Authority complied with the specified requirements. The nature, timing, and extent of the procedures selected depend on our judgment, including an assessment of the risks of material noncompliance, whether due to fraud or error. We believe that the evidence we obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a reasonable basis for our opinion.

Our examination does not provide a legal determination on the Authority's compliance with Section 201.3.

We are required to be independent and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with relevant ethical requirements relating to the engagement.

In our opinion, the Authority complied, in all material respects, with Section 201.3 during the year ended December 31, 2022.

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we are required to report material weaknesses and significant deficiencies in internal control, violations of provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements, and abuse that are material to the Authority's compliance with Section 201.3 and any fraud or illegal acts that are more than inconsequential that come to our attention during our examination. We are also required to obtain views of management on those matters. We performed our examination to express an opinion on the Authority's compliance with Section 201.3 and not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on internal control over compliance with Section 201.3 or other matters; accordingly, we express no such opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of Authority management, the Board of Directors, and New York State and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

SUBJECT: Annual Report of 2022 Procurement Contracts

In accordance with Section 2879 of the Public Authorities Law, the Authority is required to prepare, approve and submit to the New York State (NYS) Division of the Budget an annual report on procurement contracts. Included in the report are schedules of all personal service contracts, all purchasing contracts, all construction contracts, a summary of all bond sales and the guidelines for awarding such contracts. A copy of this report is also submitted to the NYS Office of the State Comptroller, the NYS Department of Economic Development, the NYS Senate Finance Committee and the NYS Assembly Ways and Means Committee.

The 2022 schedules of personal service contracts and purchasing contracts are attached as Exhibits A1 (Non-Engineering Personal Service Contracts), A2 (Engineering and Architectural Contracts), A3 (Purchasing Contracts) and A4 (Construction Contracts). These schedules identify the consultants/vendors providing goods or services, the amounts of the contracts, a description of the goods or services provided and the status of the contract.

In addition, the Authority is required to submit annually a bond sale report summarizing all bond sales that occurred during the calendar year. Information regarding these sales is included in the attached report marked Exhibit B.

The guidelines for awarding procurement contracts are found in the Policy Statement entitled PROCUREMENT CONTRACTS (25-5-01). This Policy Statement is attached as Exhibit C. Unless otherwise authorized by the Board, staff of the Authority followed these guidelines in

the awarding of procurement contracts during 2022. In addition, at this time the State Comptroller pre-approves the award of contracts in excess of \$50,000. Part of the pre-approval process includes a review of the award for compliance with applicable statutes and policy requirements, which consist of compliance with State Finance Law Sections 139-j and 139-k, and performance of an affirmative review of a contractor's or Professional Firm's responsibility. This performance review is designed to provide reasonable assurance that the proposed contractor or Professional Firm is responsible and considers such issues as: integrity; performance on other governmental contracts; legal ability to supply the product or perform the services; and financial and organizational capability.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Finance Committee approve this item and authorize Authority staff to present this item to the Authority Board.

Introduction

This Policy, established pursuant to Section 2879 of the New York State Public Authorities Law, sets forth the guidelines of the New York State Thruway Authority (Authority) regarding the Authority's use, awarding, monitoring and reporting of Procurement Contracts. These guidelines are not intended and shall not be deemed to grant or confer any rights or remedies to or upon any third party.

Except as otherwise provided herein, all Authority Procurement Contracts are subject to this Policy. Attachment 1 sets forth a representative (but not exclusive) list of the types of goods purchased, and a description of those areas of responsibility and oversight requiring the use of services and the reasons for the use of services in such areas.

I. Definitions

- A. "Discretionary Purchase" is a procurement made below statutorily established monetary threshold amounts (e.g., not exceeding \$500,000 for the purchase of commodities and/or services from Small Business Concern or NYS-certified MWBE firms, and without a dollar cap for SDVOBE firms) and at the discretion of the Authority, without the need for a formal competitive bid process. For the purpose of determining whether a purchase is within the discretionary thresholds, the aggregate amount of all purchases of the same commodities and/or services to be made within the 12- month period commencing on the date of purchase shall be considered. A change to or a renewal of a discretionary purchase shall not be permitted if the change or renewal would bring the reasonably expected aggregate amount of all purchases of the same commodities and/or services from the same provider within the 12- month period commencing on the date of the first purchase to an amount greater than \$500,000, pursuant to State Finance Law § 163.
- B. "Emergency" shall mean an unanticipated, sudden or unexpected event or escalation of an event beyond the control of the Authority which, if not immediately corrected, would endanger: a) the life, health, safety or welfare of any person, or b) the continued public use or function of a transportation or other facility or property of the Authority or the State of New York.
- C. "Foreign Business Enterprise" shall mean a business enterprise, including a sole proprietorship, partnership or corporation, which offers for sale, lease or other form of exchange, goods sought by the Authority and which are substantially produced outside New York State, or services sought by the Authority and which are substantially performed outside New York State. For purposes of construction services, a Foreign

Business Enterprise shall mean a business enterprise, including a sole proprietorship, partnership or corporation, which has its principal place of business outside New York State.

- D. "Goods" include equipment, material and supplies of any kind. Procurement Contracts that include both goods and services may be classified as for "goods" where 60% or more of the total projected contract value will be for the purchase of equipment, material or supplies.
- E. "Minority Owned Business Enterprise" shall have the same meaning as that set forth in Public Authorities Law Section 2879.
- F. "New York State Business Enterprise" shall mean any business enterprise which offers for sale, lease or other form of exchange, goods or services sought by the Authority which are substantially manufactured, produced, assembled or performed within New York State.
- G. "New York State Resident" shall have the same meaning as that set forth in Public Authorities Law Section 2879.
- H. "Procurement Contract" shall mean any written agreement for the acquisition of goods or services of any kind, in the actual or estimated amount of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) or more. Construction contracts and design-build contracts are included within the scope of the definition of a Procurement Contract pursuant to this Policy, but are not Procurement Contracts pursuant to Public Authorities Law Section 2879. A Procurement Contract does not include contracts valued under \$15,000, agreements for the settlement or compromise of any action, proceeding or claim by or against the Authority, certain financial, insurance and healthcare products that do not readily lend themselves to a competitive solicitation, contracts for the direct and indirect placement of advertisements with radio, television, print and electronic media, periodicals, subscriptions, reference materials or professional research tools, written materials, fees or tuition associated with continuing education courses, training courses, conferences, seminars and symposiums, funding agreements, co-funding agreements, grants or memberships in various industry groups, professional societies or similar cooperative associations, or any cooperative projects and procurement activities conducted or sponsored by such organizations in which the Authority participates.
- I. "Professional Firm" shall mean any individual or sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, association or other legal entity permitted by law to practice the professions of architecture, engineering or surveying.
- J. "Services" shall mean services of a consulting, professional or technical nature provided by outside consultants/contractors (individuals, partnerships or firms who are not and do

not employ officers or employees of the Authority) for a fee or other compensation.

- K. "Service Disabled Veteran Owned Business Enterprise" shall have the same meaning as that set forth in Article 17-B of the Executive Law Section 369-H.
- L. "Small Business Concern" is a business that is resident in New York State, is independently owned and operated, not dominant in its field and employs not more than 100 people.
- M. "Women Owned Business Enterprise" shall have the same meaning as that set forth in Public Authorities Law Section 2879.

II. Selection of Contractors for Goods

Except as otherwise provided in this Policy, the Authority shall award Procurement Contracts for goods to the lowest responsible bidder as will best promote the Authority's interests, taking into consideration: the reliability of the contractor; the quality of the goods to be furnished; the goods' conformity with the specifications; the terms of delivery; and/or such other criteria as the Authority determines appropriate. The Authority shall solicit bidders for applicable contracts pursuant to Article 4-C of the New York State Economic Development Law (e.g., advertise in the Contract Reporter). The Authority shall solicit price quotes from at least three (3) sources, if available.

III. Selection of Contractors for Services

- A. The Authority may contract for services when, because of one or more of the following factors or considerations, it is more beneficial for such services to be contracted for than performed by employees of the Authority:
 - 1. lack of or unavailability of sufficient staff, facilities, equipment or other resources;
 - 2. requirement of special expertise or abilities not adequately possessed by Authority employees;
 - 3. timing;
 - 4. short term or infrequent need for the service; or
 - 5. distance of the location(s) where the services must be performed from Authority offices or facilities.
- B. Except as otherwise provided in this Policy, the Authority shall award Procurement

Contracts for professional services, except those to Professional Firms, to a responsive and responsible contractor on the basis of best value, taking into account: the contractor's experience and capability to perform the required services, the adequacy of contractor's staff to be assigned to Authority work, the overall quality and responsiveness of the contractor's proposal, the contractor's fee structure and overall price; and/or such other criteria as the Authority determined appropriate. Procurement Contracts for construction and design-build services shall be awarded in compliance with all applicable laws. The Authority shall solicit proposals for applicable contracts pursuant to Article 4-C of the New York State Economic Development Law (e.g., advertise in the Contractor Reporter). The Authority shall solicit price quotes from at least three (3) sources, if available.

- C. The Authority shall award Procurement Contracts for the services of Professional Firms on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualification for the type of professional services required and at fair and reasonable fees. The Authority shall not refuse to negotiate with a Professional Firm solely because the ratio of the "allowable indirect costs" to direct labor costs of the Professional Firm or the hourly labor rate in any labor category of the Professional Firm exceeds a limitation generally set by the Authority in the determination of the reasonableness of the estimated cost of services to be rendered by the Professional Firm, but rather the Authority should also consider the reasonableness of cost based on the total estimated cost of the service of the Professional Firm which should include, among other things, all the direct labor costs of the Professional Firm for such services plus all "allowable indirect costs," other direct costs, and negotiated profit of the Professional Firm. "Allowable indirect costs" of a Professional Firm are defined as those costs generally associated with overhead which cannot be specifically identified with a single project or contract and are considered reasonable and allowable under specific state contract or allowability limits.
- D. The Director of Procurement Services may, in consultation with the appropriate Authority program managers, designate those services other than the services of Professional Firms for which cost will be the only criterion for determining best value.

IV. Waiver of Competition

The Authority Board may waive the use of the competitive procedure for Procurement Contracts provided in this Policy based upon one or more of the following findings:

- A. There is a need to respond to an Emergency.
- B. A condition exists that makes it impractical or not in the Authority's best interest to seek competition due to the specialized nature of the goods or services required.
- C. There is a historical relationship, the continuation of which is in the best interests of the Authority.

- D. There is a need for confidentiality.
- E. The proposed project requires specialized knowledge of, or proximity to, the Authority.

- G. There is a specific contractor selection that is necessary or convenient to the operations of the Authority.

V. General Procurement Requirements

- A. The Authority shall ensure that its Procurement Contracts in an amount equal to or in excess of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) comply with the public notification requirements of Article 4-C of the New York State Economic Development Law.
- B. The Authority shall not enter into a Procurement Contract with any current or former officer or employee of the Authority where such contract would be in contravention of law or would create a conflict of interest.
- C. Pursuant to Public Authorities Law § 2879-a, the Comptroller Regulations and the State Authority Contract Manual, the Authority may be required to submit certain contracts to the New York State Comptroller for approval that are awarded on a Sole Source, Single Source, or other non-competitive basis for the purchase of goods and/or services in an amount in excess of \$1 million, and shall notify the successful bidder therefor. Such contracts or contract amendments shall not be valid and enforceable unless approved by the Comptroller or until 90 days have elapsed from such submission without action by the Comptroller, as further set forth in the referenced law and regulations.
- D. The Executive Director must approve all contractor selections for Procurement Contracts for services based upon the recommendation of either the Non-Engineering Personal Services Committee or the Engineering Selection Committee.
- E. The Authority may utilize the Procurement Contracts of other Federal, State or local entities to purchase goods or services provided it would be in the Authority's best interests to do so.
- F. The Authority shall comply with State Finance Law Sections 139-j and 139-k that place restrictions on attempts to influence during the procurement process, require the recording of attempts to influence made during the restricted period for a procurement, and outline the responsibilities of offerors relative to the procurement process.
- G. The Authority will perform an affirmative review of a contractor's responsibility, in

accordance with applicable laws, rules, regulations and guidelines, prior to the award of a Procurement Contract. This review shall be designed to provide reasonable assurance that a proposed or current contractor is responsible and should consider such issues as: integrity; performance on other governmental contracts; legal ability to supply the product or perform the services; and financial and organizational capability.

H. The Authority will create a record for each Procurement Contract that documents its compliance with this Policy.

VI. Participation of Minority and/or Women-Owned Business Enterprises (MWBEs)

It is the policy of the Authority to comply with the provisions of Article 15-A of the New York State Executive Law, which requires that every Procurement Contract over \$15,000 will afford equality of economic opportunities for minority group members and women and the facilitation of participation by MWBEs. The Authority shall establish separate goals for participation of MWBEs on all Authority contracts where applicable. Furthermore, if the performance of any Procurement Contracts permits or requires the use of a subcontractor, these contracts shall require the prime contractor to act affirmatively to encourage participation by MWBEs in such subcontract and to report the nature and extent of such efforts to the Authority. Authority staff will also review the Directory of MWBEs prior to making discretionary purchases and choose MWBEs when feasible.

All Procurement Contracts, where required, shall comply with Executive Law Article 15-A and the Public Authorities Law, and rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.

- A. In furtherance of the above, and to promote the use of certified MWBEs in Procurement Contracts, the Authority shall:
 - 1. Designate appropriate staff to oversee the Authority's programs established to promote and assist: (i) participation by certified MWBEs in the Authority's procurement opportunities and facilitation of the award of Procurement Contracts to such enterprises; (ii) the utilization of certified MWBEs as subcontractors and suppliers by entities having Procurement Contracts with the Authority; and (iii) the utilization of partnerships, joint ventures or other similar arrangements between certified MWBEs and other entities having Procurement Contracts with the Authority. Such staff will be familiar with the procurement process utilized by the Authority, report directly to the Executive Director and either directly or through their designees participate in the procurement process.
 - 2. Establish appropriate goals for participation of MWBEs in Procurement Contracts and for the utilization of MWBEs as subcontractors and suppliers.

- 3. Provide notice of any procurement to appropriate professional organizations that serve MWBEs so that members of these organizations are apprised of potential opportunities to contract with the Authority.
- 4. Include language regarding equal employment opportunity and non-discrimination in all Procurement Contracts and/or all documents soliciting bids or proposals for Procurement Contracts, and require the contractor to include this language in all subcontracts.
- 5. Include a provision in the Authority's Procurement Contracts expressly providing that any contractor who willfully and intentionally fails to comply with the MWBE participation requirements as set forth in the contract shall be liable to the Authority for liquidated or other appropriate damages as may be determined by the Authority.
- 6. Maintain lists of qualified certified MWBEs that have expressed an interest in doing business with the Authority and ensure such entities receive direct notice of any impending procurements. The Authority shall also consult the lists of certified MWBEs maintained by the Department of Economic Development.
- 7. List applicable goals for participation of certified MWBEs in Procurement Contracts in all solicitations and for the utilization of MWBEs as subcontractors and suppliers by entities having Procurement Contracts with the Authority.
- 8. Conduct procurements in a manner that will enable the Authority to achieve the maximum feasible portion of the goals established and eliminate barriers to participation of MWBEs on Procurement Contracts. The Authority shall include, without limitation:
 - a. the expected degree of MWBE participation;
 - b. provisions relating to joint ventures, under which a bidder may count toward meeting its MWBE participation goal;
 - c. provisions under which the Authority may waive obligations of the contractor relating to MWBE participation after a showing of good faith efforts to comply with the requirements of this Policy and all applicable laws pursuant to the waiver provisions contained in Executive Law Article 15-A; and
 - d. verification that MWBEs listed in a successful bid are actually participating to the extent listed on the project for which the bid was submitted.

- B. In implementing the provisions of this Section VI, the Authority shall:
 - 1. Consider, where practicable, the severability of construction projects and other bundled projects;
 - 2. Implement a program that will enable it to evaluate each Procurement Contract to determine the appropriateness of the established goal;
 - 3. Consider compliance with the requirements of any federal law concerning opportunities for MWBEs which effectuates the purpose of this section; and
 - 4. Consult the most recent disparity study pursuant to Article 15-A of the Executive Law.

VII. Participation of Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Business Enterprises (SDVOBEs)

It is the policy of the Authority to comply with the provisions of Article 17-B of the New York State Executive Law, which requires that every Procurement Contract over \$15,000 will afford equality of economic opportunities to certified SDVOBEs thereby further integrating such businesses into New York State's economy. The Authority will make a good faith effort to achieve SDVOBE participation to the extent such firms are available, and will use its best effort so that SDVOBE firms are included in Procurement Contracts. All Procurement Contracts, where required, shall comply with Executive Law Article 17-B. The Executive Director shall appoint one or more senior staff to oversee the Authority's SDVOBE program.

Before the Authority issues bid documents, or during the Authority's bid development phase, the Authority's procurement staff will consult the Directory of SDVOBEs posted on the OGS website to determine whether the solicitation may be considered for a SDVOBE goal.

Authority staff will also review the Directory of SDVOBEs prior to making discretionary purchases and choose SDVOBEs when feasible.

All procurements subject to Executive Law Article 17-B will contain standard language in solicitations and Procurement Contracts regarding participation of SDVOBEs on State contracts.

VIII. Promotion of New York State Business Enterprises and New York State Residents in Procurement Contracts

The Authority shall promote and solicit the participation by New York State Business Enterprises and New York State Residents in Procurement Contracts in compliance with Public Authorities Law Section 2879 and shall develop procedures consistent with such.

IX. Requirements Regarding Foreign Business Enterprises and Discriminatory Jurisdictions

The Authority will follow the requirements and procedures of Public Authorities Law Section 2879(5) with respect to Procurement Contracts with Foreign Business Enterprises. Accordingly, the Authority shall notify the Department of Economic Development of the award of a Procurement Contract for the purchase of goods or services from a Foreign Business Enterprise in an amount greater than or equal to one million dollars simultaneously with notifying the successful bidder. The Authority will not enter into any such Procurement Contract until at least 15 days have elapsed from notice to the Department of Economic Development, except where the Procurement Contract was awarded on an emergency or critical basis or where the Commissioner of Economic Development waives the notice requirement.

In addition, pursuant to Public Authorities Law Section 2879(5), the Authority will impose restrictions on Foreign Business Enterprises located in Discriminatory Jurisdictions with respect to the solicitation and award of Procurement Contracts.

XI. Delegations

The Authority Board must approve all Procurement Contracts unless such approval has been otherwise delegated in this Policy.

- A. The Executive Director or the Executive Director's designee is authorized to:
 - 1. Execute any Procurement Contract, including any amendments thereto, for expenditures in an amount not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) provided that a Procurement Contract for professional services with a term in excess of one year shall require the Board's review and approval within one year of execution of the Procurement Contract. For a Procurement Contract for professional services with a term in excess of one year that must be awarded prior to the next Board meeting, the initial contract will be issued for the entire intended term of the contract. Based on its total term and value, such contract must be approved in writing by the Executive Director and such contract is subject to the Board's approval at the next Board meeting. If such approval is not granted, the contract will be terminated or amended immediately.
 - 2. Approve an increased expenditure by the Authority not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for any Procurement Contract previously approved by the Authority Board.
 - 3. Approve or extend Procurement Contracts for a period in excess of one year provided such contract or extension does not exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000); provided that Procurement Contracts for professional services may not be extended for a period in excess of one year without approval of the Board.
 - 4. Waive the use of a competitive procedure for any Procurement Contract needed to respond to an Emergency in accordance with the procedure set forth in the Authority Procedure for Declared Emergency Work, the Board resolution authorizing the Authority's Contracts Program, and/or pursuant to an Executive Order of the Governor.
 - 5. Waive the use of a competitive procedure for any Procurement Contract in an amount not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) when the Executive Director or the Executive Director's designee finds one or more of the

conditions set forth in Article IV. B. - H. of this Policy to be present.

- 6. Interpret, implement and administer this Policy, including the development of operational and/or administrative policies, guidance and procedures necessary to carry out its intent. These operational and/or administrative policies should, at a minimum, identify the roles and responsibilities of Authority personnel implementing and administering this Policy and the manner in which those responsibilities are to be fulfilled.
- 7. Appoint a Procurement Integrity Officer whose responsibilities shall include the establishment of processes to prevent or detect improper lobbying influence, to provide guidance to program managers regarding vendor responsibility determinations, to administer the Contract Review and Vendor Responsibility Committee, and to ensure the Authority is in compliance with applicable executive orders, laws, rules and regulations regarding procurement integrity and vendor responsibility.
- B. The Director of Procurement Services or the Director of Procurement Services' designee is authorized to execute Procurement Contracts for goods provided the process used to procure such goods is in accordance with Authority procedures, and the contractor was selected based on a solicitation for bids. The Director of Procurement Services may, without a formal competitive process, execute any Procurement Contract for the purchase of goods or services from a Small Business Concern, certified MWBE, or from a certified SDVOBE, or for goods or technology that are recycled or remanufactured, in an amount not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000).
- C. Procurement Contracts involving the Authority's Contracts Program shall be awarded, amended/supplemented and managed by the Chief Engineer, Executive Director and Chief Financial Officer pursuant to the Board resolutions authorizing the Authority's Contracts Program.

XII. Review and Reporting Requirements

- A. In accordance with Public Authorities Law Section 2879, the Authority Board shall annually review and approve this Policy.
- B. Information related to Procurement Contracts involving the Contract Program shall be included in the submittal to the Board seeking authorization for the Contracts Program for the Board's review and approval.
- C. The Executive Director or designee shall report to the Board quarterly on all Procurement Contracts or amendments thereto that he or she has executed pursuant

D. Following each fiscal year, the Authority Board shall approve an annual report on Procurement Contracts as required by subdivision 7 of section 2879 of the Public Authorities Law. Such annual report will include: (i) this Policy and any amendments hereto; (ii) an explanation of this Policy and any amendments hereof; (iii) a list of the year's Procurement Contracts and their status and selection process; (iv) a list of the aforesaid contracts entered into with New York State Business Enterprises (as defined in Public Authorities Law, Section 2879(3)(i)), and the subject matter and value thereof; (v) a list of the aforesaid contracts entered into with Foreign Business Enterprises and the subject matter and value thereof; (vi) a list of contracts entered into with certified MWBEs and value thereof; (vii) all referrals made and all penalties imposed pursuant to Executive Law Section 316; and (viii) a list of Procurement Contracts exempted from reporting in the Contract Reporter and the basis for each exemption. The annual report on Procurement Contracts, after being approved by the Board, shall be submitted to the Division of the Budget with copies to the Department of Audit and Control, the Department of Economic Development, the Senate Finance Committee and the Assembly Ways and Means Committee.

XIII. Miscellaneous Provisions

- A. The Authority's failure to comply with the provisions of this Policy shall not alter, modify the terms of, affect the validity of, or impair any of the Authority's rights or privileges under any Procurement Contract to which the Authority is a party, nor shall it provide any rights or privileges to an entity seeking a Procurement Contract with the Authority.
- B. The Authority may allow other Federal, State or local entities to purchase goods or services through an Authority Procurement Contract provided it would be in the Authority's best interests to do so and such procurement is acceptable to the contractor.

ATTACHMENT 1

A. Types of Goods Purchased

The following is an illustrative (but not exclusive) list of the types of goods the Authority has purchased in the past and may purchase in the future:

- Office equipment, furniture and supplies such as fax machines, copiers, audio/video equipment, copier toner and paper;
- Computer equipment and supplies such as mainframe components and related equipment, personal computers, software, and peripheral equipment, accessories and supplies;
- Heavy construction equipment such as bulldozers, wheel loaders, crawler loaders, excavators and pavers;
- Marine fleet vessels and related equipment such as barges, tugs and marine generators;
- Motorized automotive truck fleet and related equipment such as diesel and gas trucks of all sizes, plow trucks, plow attachments, material spreaders, aerial lift trucks and tow trucks;
- Prefabricated buildings, building equipment such as furnaces, boilers, and air conditioners, and building maintenance equipment and supplies;
- Uniforms for employees;
- Road maintenance materials such as salt, ice control abrasives and de-icing solutions;
- Highway construction materials such as asphaltic materials, sand, stone, gravel and readymix concrete;
- Property maintenance equipment and supplies such as mowers, tractors and associated equipment;
- Telecommunication systems utilizing conventional and fiber optic technologies including cell phones, pagers, telephone switching equipment, radios, radio towers, equipment and accessories;

B. Types of Services Purchased

The Authority purchases services for a variety of reasons including, but not limited to, the need to: augment in-house staff; provide expertise in specialized areas; provide independent review; serve as a liaison with certain entities; and handle specialized matters expeditiously. The following is an illustrative (but not exclusive) list of the types of services the Authority has purchased in the past or may purchase in the future:

Legal

Provide legal services to the Authority in the areas of bond and note financing, environmental review compliance, litigation, real property matters, labor issues, intellectual property, technology and computer law, insurance law and government relations.

Construction

Construction, reconstruction, repair, rehabilitation, and improvement of highway, bridges and other facilities under the jurisdiction of the Authority.

Expert Witness

Provide the Authority with expert analysis of issues raised in litigation and serve as expert witness at trial as needed. Such issues may include, but shall not be limited to: medical assessment of personal injuries, economic analysis of potential lost earnings and accident reconstruction.

• Audit and Accounting

Provide audit services pertaining to the year-end preparation of financial statements for the Authority in conformance with generally accepted accounting principles. Perform special audits and provide financial advisory services as requested.

• Building Maintenance and Security

Provide building maintenance services such as janitorial, HVAC, rubbish removal, electrical preventive maintenance, elevator inspection and maintenance, and security, including guards.
