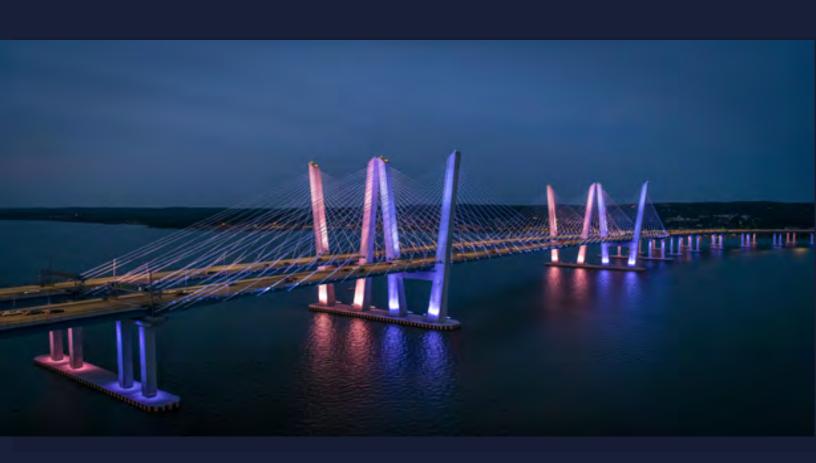

NOTE A - TOTAL REVENUES (pages 1 & 2):

Total revenues for the month are \$92,291,717 an increase of \$21,602,235 or 30.56%. Toll revenues for the month are \$83,592,819 an increase of \$19,271,511 or 29.96%. Total toll revenues increased for April 2024 compared to April 2023 due to a Thruway wide toll adjustment implemented on January 1, 2024.

Total revenues year-to-date are \$335,486,850, an increase of \$66,864,289 or 24.89%. Toll revenues year-to-date are \$305,901,051 an increase of \$63,251,679 or 26.07%. Year-to-date passenger revenues increased \$38,556,574 or 30.10% and commercial revenues increased \$24,695,105 or 21.56%. Additional information regarding traffic and E-ZPass usage is detailed on Pages 21-23.

NOTE B - TOTAL DEPARTMENTAL OPERATING EXPENSES (pages 4 & 10):

For the year, Departmental Operating Expenses are \$132,225,679, an increase of \$7,023,448 or 5.61% compared with April 2023.

The increase is due to several factors. Personal service costs are higher in 2024 due to salary increases included in recently approved collective bargaining agreements as well as other salary actions taken to ensure adequate staffing levels. In addition, there was an increase in bridge inspection contracts and E-ZPass Administrative payments due to timing.

NOTE C - DEBT ISSUANCE (page 9):

On February 15, 2024, the Authority issued General Revenue Bonds – Series P, which generated proceeds of \$1.02 billion. These proceeds were used to: (1) fund a portion of the Authority's Multi-Year Capital Program; (2) make a deposit to the Senior Debt Service Reserve Fund; (3) fund capitalized interest on the Series P bonds; (4) refund certain amount of the Authority's Series J Bonds; (5) purchase certain tendered bonds of the Authority's Series M bonds; and (6) pay bond issuance costs.

Of the \$1.02 billion, \$303.0 million is to fund the multi-year capital program, \$466.6 million is for the refunding of the Series J bonds, and \$254.7 is for the tender of the Series M bonds.

NOTE D - REVENUE, DEPARTMENTAL OPERATING EXPENSES AND BUDGET (page 10):

Year to date revenues are over budget by \$22,759,700 or 7.04%. This is primarily due to an increase in Net Toll Revenue and associated fees related to an increase in traffic above forecasted levels and an increase in interest revenue due to higher than expected interest rates on investments.

Year to date operating expenses are under budget by \$5,082,957 or 3.70%. This is primarily due to lower than budgeted personal service costs and subsequent labor allocations, timing of contract payments as as well as the timing of of finalizing fiber marketing fee agreements. These are offset by higher Tolls by Mail and E-Zpass Administration fees and snow and ice control due to icy winter weather.

Year to date State Police Operating Expenses are under budget by \$3,499,102 or 14.78%. This is primarily due to lower than budgeted personal service costs and automobile purchases.

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NOTE E - SERVICE AREAS (pages 13, 14 & 15):

In January 2021 the Authority entered into a 33-year agreement with Empire State Thruway Partners, LLC (Empire) for the design, construction, finance, operation, and maintenance of the Authority's 27 Service Areas. Empire will rebuild 23 of the 27 service area restaurant buildings and perform significant renovations to the remaining four. Empire's initial investment to rebuild and renovate the service areas is estimated to be \$300 million. Additionally, over the life of the agreement Empire will invest another \$99 million into future renovations and improvements.

The construction work is occurring in two phases as detailed below. Phase 1 began in July 2021 when Empire assumed control of 16 service areas previously operated by HMSHost Corporation and Delaware North Corporation. Phase 2 began in January 2023 when Empire assumed control of the remaining 11 service areas that were operated by McDonald's Corporation until December 2022.

Commencing with the reopening of each new restaurant building, the agreement requires Empire to pay rent calculated as a percentage of gross sales, subject to a guaranteed annual minimum per location. In addition, the agreement has ancillary rent provisions tied to the operation of commercial vehicle fueling stations at 5 of the service areas and advertising opportunities at all service areas. Sales generated by Empire during the operation of a restaurant prior to reconstruction (interim operations) are not subject to rent provisions. Over the life of the agreement, base rent calculated as a percentage of sales is forecasted to be \$85 million, of which \$51 million is guaranteed.

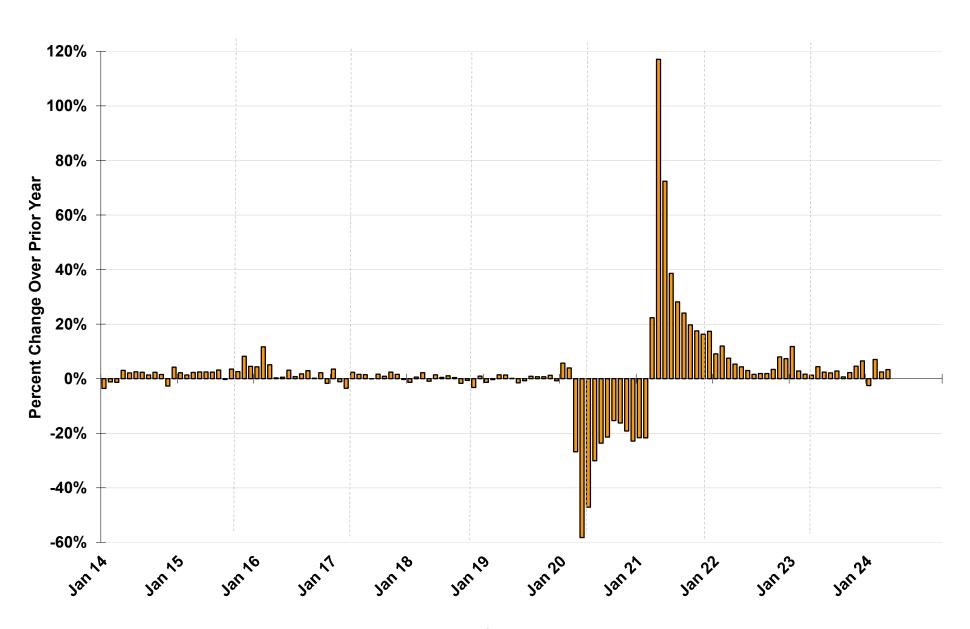

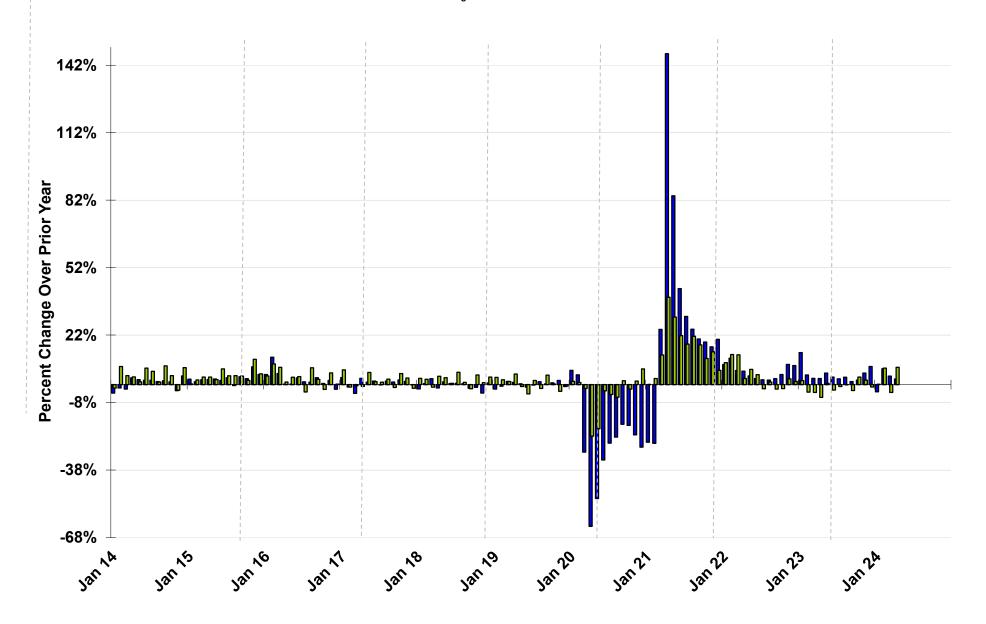

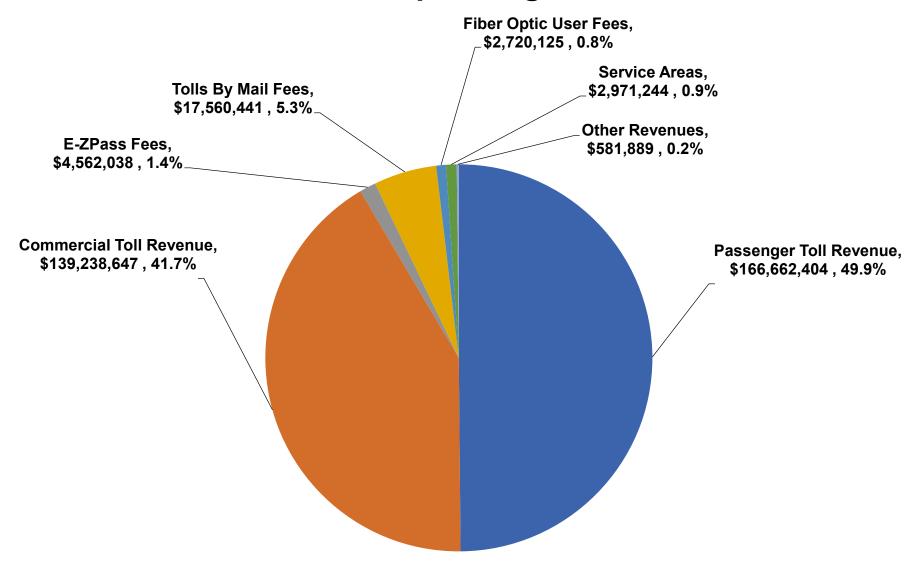

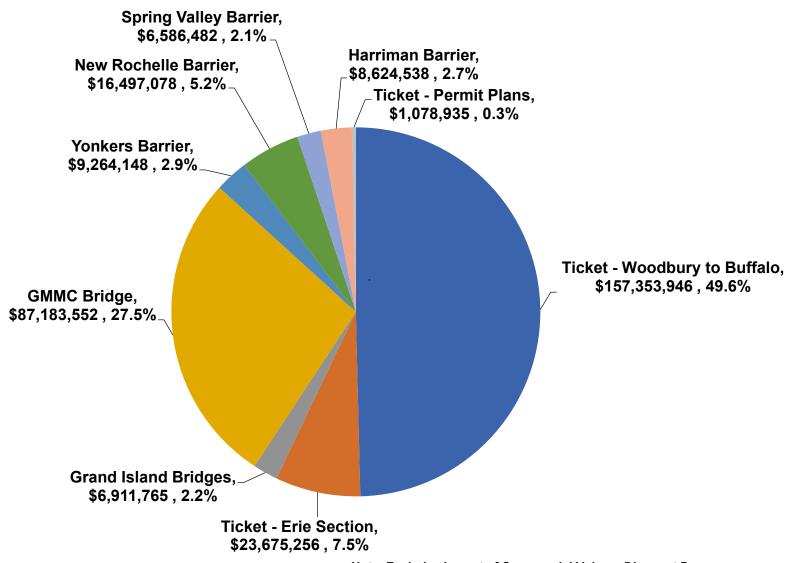

2024 YTD Operating Revenue

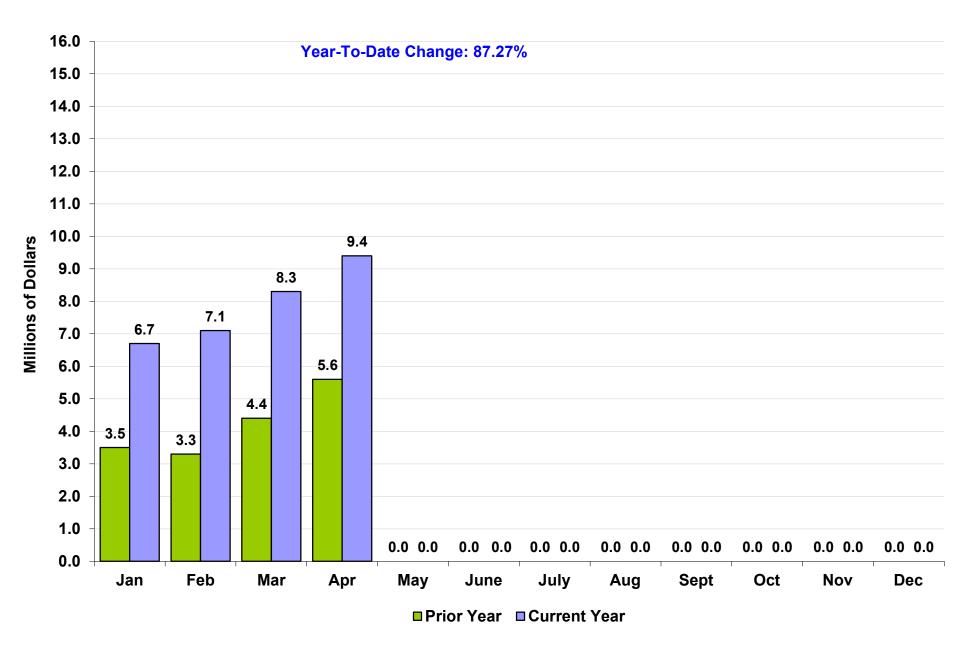


2024 YTD Toll Collections, By Location

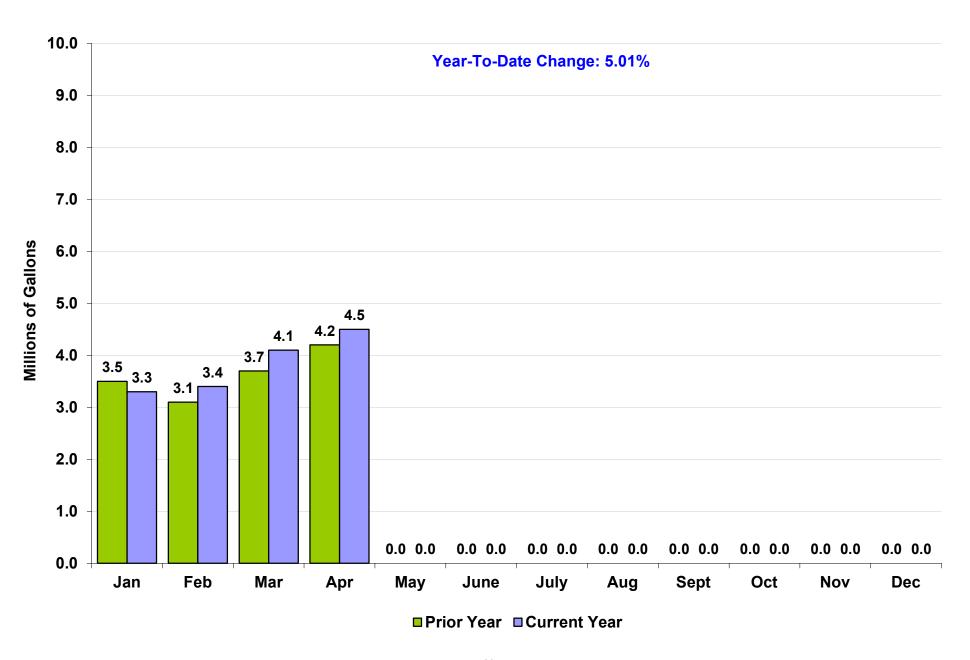

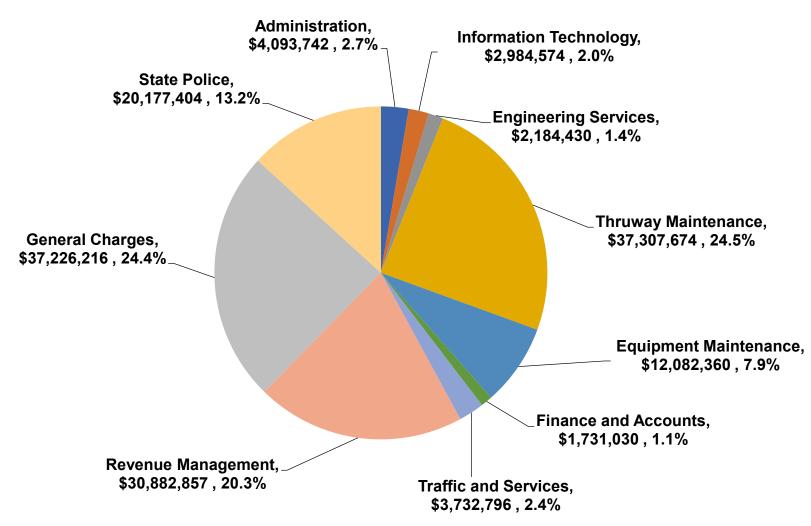
Restaurant Sales at Service Plazas



Fuel Deliveries to Service Areas

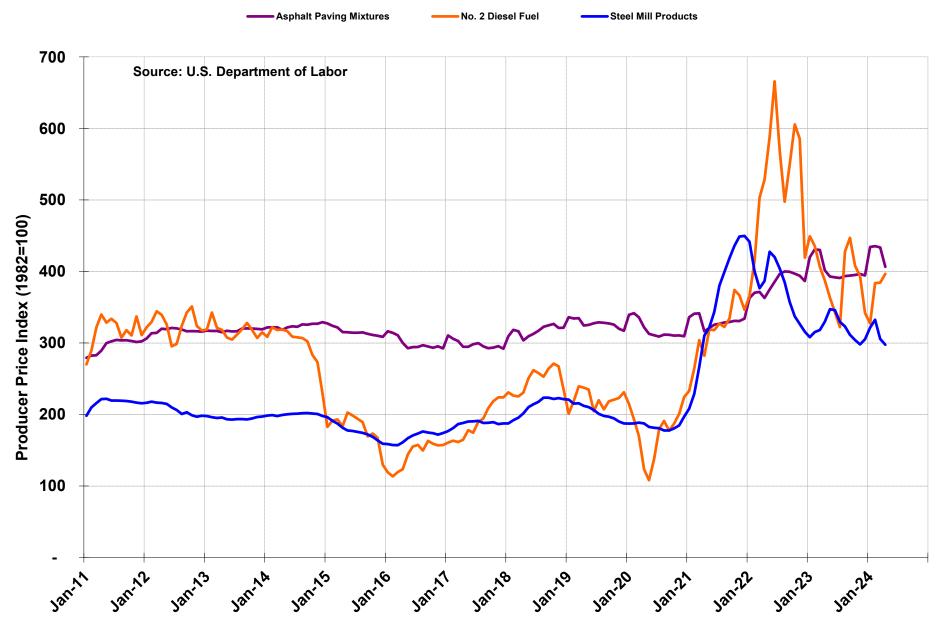


2024 YTD Operating Expenses

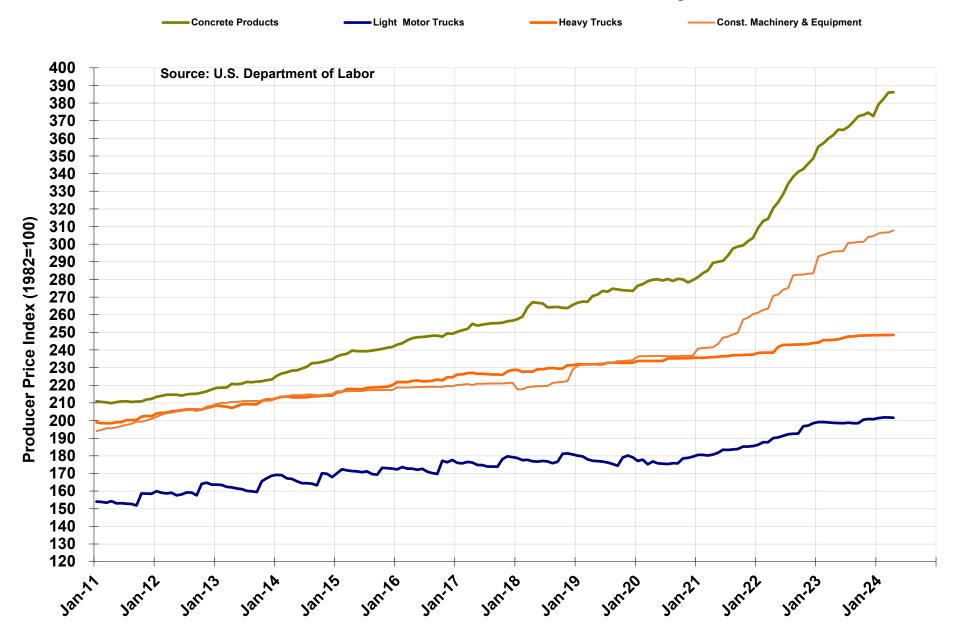

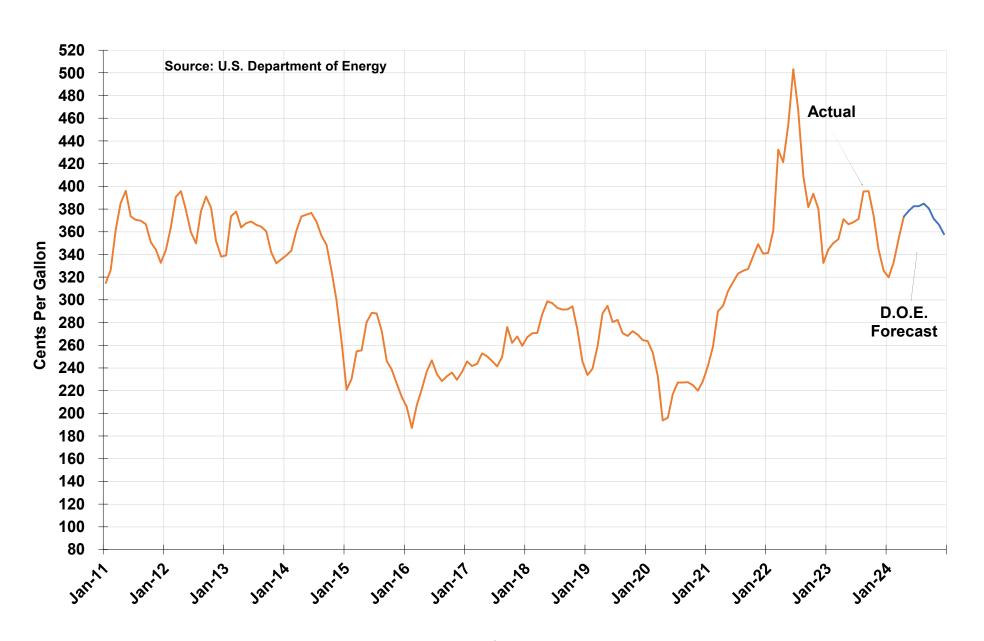
Producer Prices: Construction Inputs

NOTE A - TOTAL REVENUES (pages 1 & 2):

Total revenues for the month are \$100,457,518 an increase of \$21,971,439 or 27.99%. Toll revenues for the month are \$92,443,127 an increase of \$19,762,069 or 27.19%. Toll revenues have increased in 2024 due to a Thruway wide toll adjustment implemented on January 1, 2024.

Total revenues year-to-date are \$435,944,368, an increase of \$88,835,728 or 25.59%. Toll revenues year-to-date are \$398,344,178 an increase of \$83,013,748 or 26.33%. Year-to-date passenger revenues increased \$50,617,023 or 30.01% and commercial revenues increased \$32,396,725 or 22.09%. Additional information regarding traffic and E-ZPass usage is detailed on Pages 21-23.

NOTE B - TOTAL DEPARTMENTAL OPERATING EXPENSES (pages 4 & 10):

For the year, Departmental Operating Expenses are \$170,176,638, an increase of \$13,517,895 or 8.63% compared with May 2023.

The increase is due to salary increases included in recently approved collective bargaining agreements, other salary actions taken to ensure adequate staffing levels, health insurance costs, the timing of bridge inspection contract payments, and payments for the administrative costs relating to E-Zpass and Tolls by Mail.

NOTE C - DEBT ISSUANCE (page 9):

On February 15, 2024, the Authority issued General Revenue Bonds – Series P, which generated proceeds of \$1.02 billion. These proceeds were used to: (1) fund a portion of the Authority's Multi-Year Capital Program; (2) make a deposit to the Senior Debt Service Reserve Fund; (3) fund capitalized interest on the Series P bonds; (4) refund certain amount of the Authority's Series J Bonds; (5) purchase certain tendered bonds of the Authority's Series M bonds; and (6) pay bond issuance costs.

Of the \$1.02 billion, \$303.0 million is to fund the multi-year capital program, \$466.6 million is for the refunding of the Series J bonds, and \$254.7 is for the tender of the Series M bonds.

NOTE D - REVENUE, DEPARTMENTAL OPERATING EXPENSES AND BUDGET (page 10):

Year to date revenues are over budget by \$32,036,785 or 7.65%. This is primarily due to an increase in Net Toll Revenue and associated fees related to an increase in traffic above forcasted levels and an increase in interest revenue due to higher than expected interest rates on investments.

Year to date operating expenses are under budget by \$5,585,788 or 3.25%. This is primarily due to lower than budgeted personal service costs and subsequent labor allocations, timing of contract payments, and the timing of finalizing fiber marketing fee agreements. These are offset by higher Tolls by Mail and E-ZPass Administration fees and snow and ice control due to icy winter weather.

Year to date State Police Operating Expenses are under budget by \$4,279,734 or 14.46%. This is primarily due to lower than budgeted personal service costs and automobile purchases.

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NOTE E - SERVICE AREAS (pages 13, 14 & 15):

In January 2021 the Authority entered into a 33-year agreement with Empire State Thruway Partners, LLC (Empire) for the design, construction, finance, operation, and maintenance of the Authority's 27 Service Areas. Empire will rebuild 23 of the 27 service area restaurant buildings and perform significant renovations to the remaining four. Empire's initial investment to rebuild and renovate the service areas is estimated to be \$300 million. Additionally, over the life of the agreement Empire will invest another \$99 million into future renovations and improvements.

The construction work is occurring in two phases as detailed below. Phase 1 began in July 2021 when Empire assumed control of 16 service areas previously operated by HMSHost Corporation and Delaware North Corporation. Phase 2 began in January 2023 when Empire assumed control of the remaining 11 service areas that were operated by McDonald's Corporation until December 2022.

Commencing with the reopening of each new restaurant building, the agreement requires Empire to pay rent calculated as a percentage of gross sales, subject to a guaranteed annual minimum per location. In addition, the agreement has ancillary rent provisions tied to the operation of commercial vehicle fueling stations at 5 of the service areas and advertising opportunities at all service areas. Sales generated by Empire during the operation of a restaurant prior to reconstruction (interim operations) are not subject to rent provisions. Over the life of the agreement, base rent calculated as a percentage of sales is forecasted to be \$85 million, of which \$51 million is guaranteed.

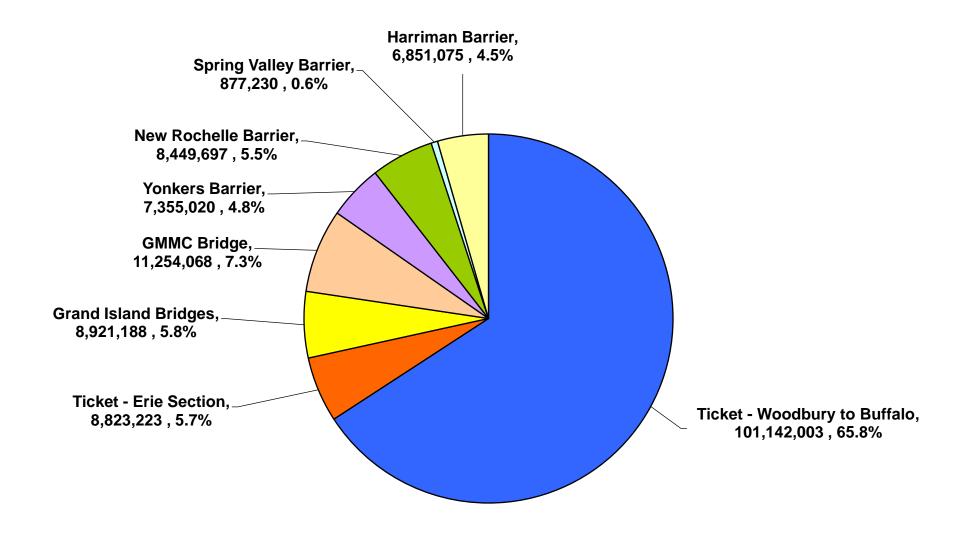

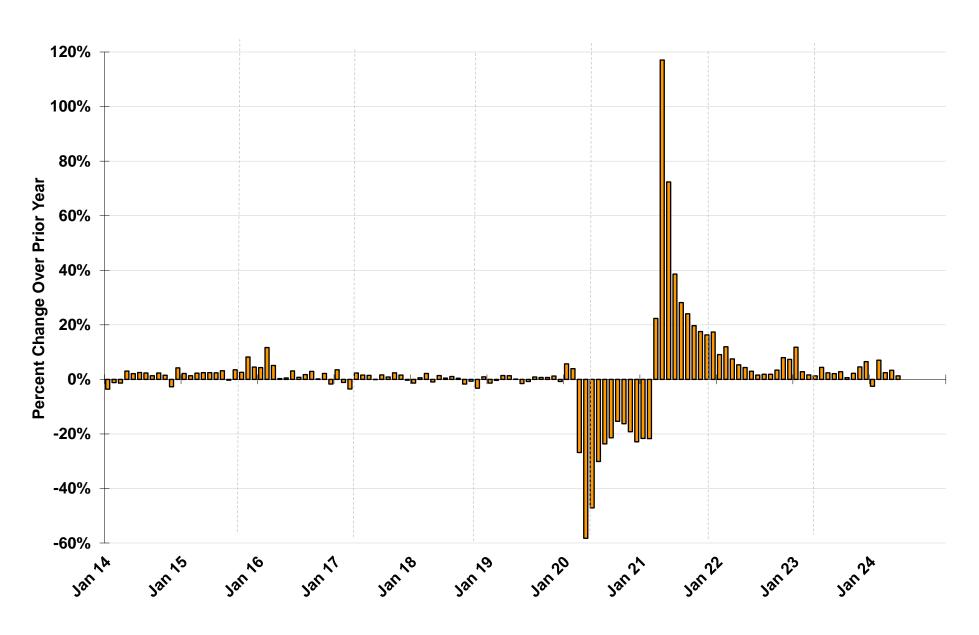

2024 YTD Total Thruway Trips, By Location

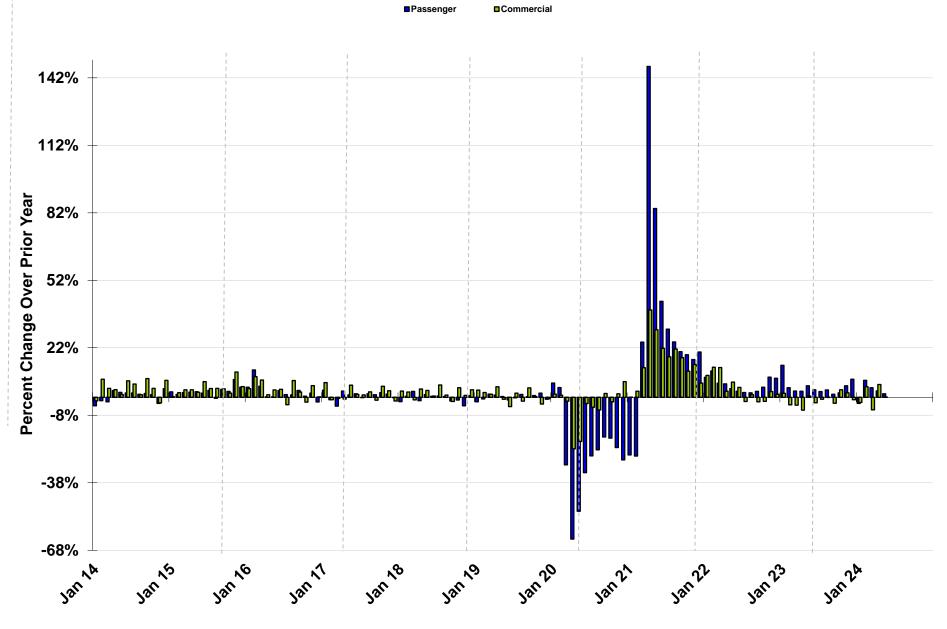


Percent Change in Monthly Thruway Traffic

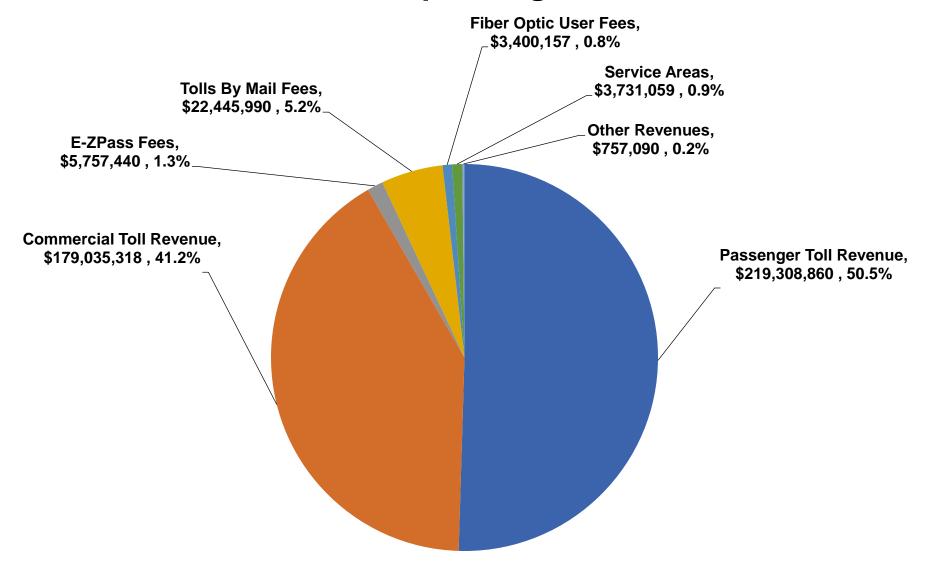
Total Passenger and Commercial Revenue Trips



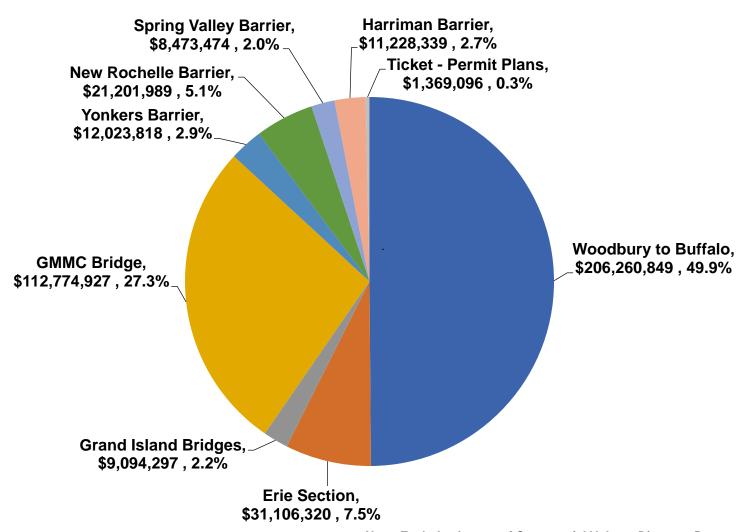
Percent Change in Monthly Thruway Traffic By Passenger and Commercial Revenue Trips



2024 YTD Operating Revenue

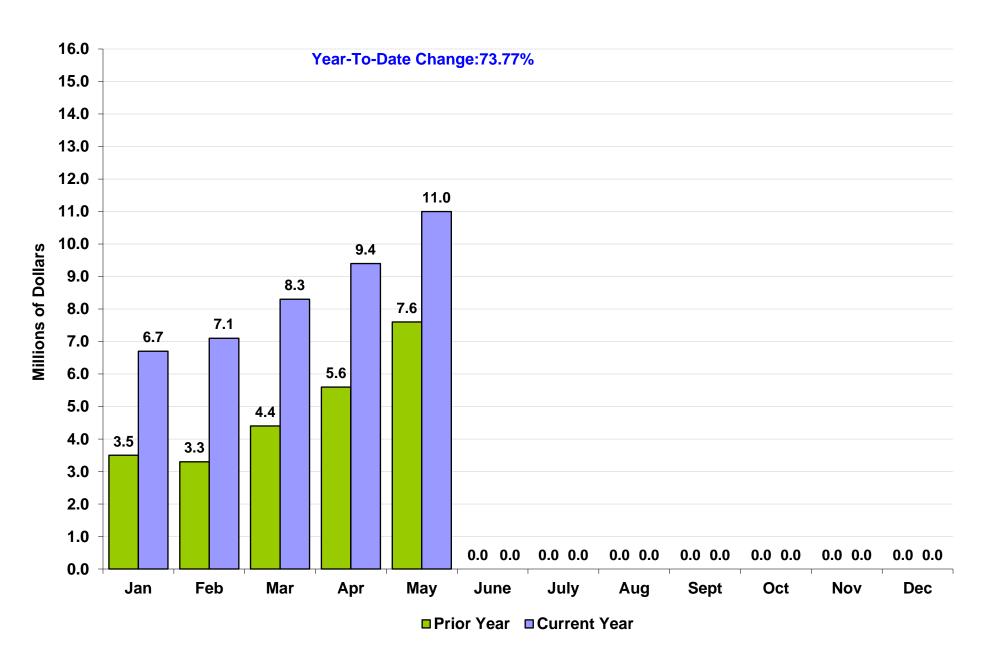


2024 YTD Toll Collections, By Location

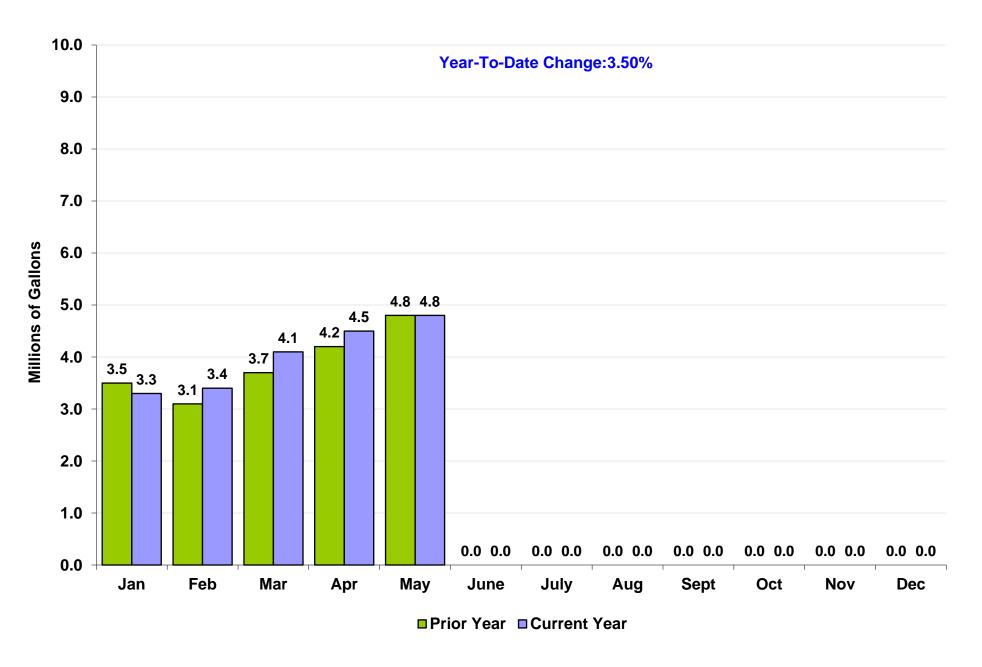

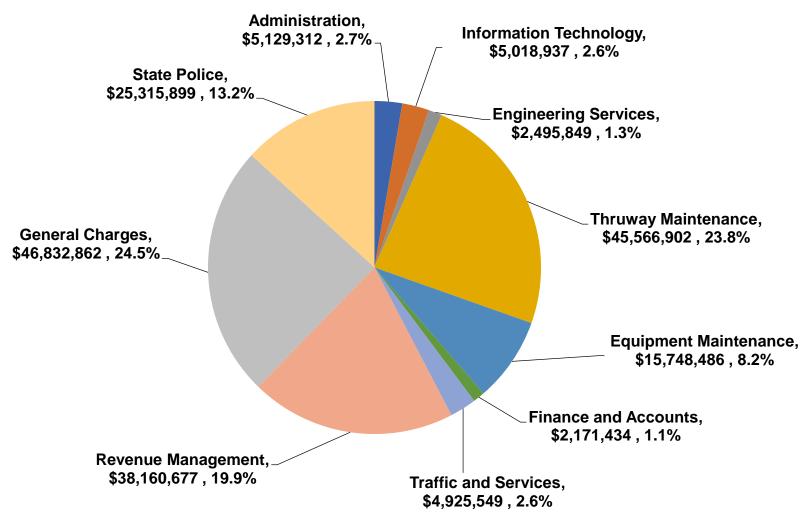
Restaurant Sales at Service Plazas



Fuel Deliveries to Service Areas



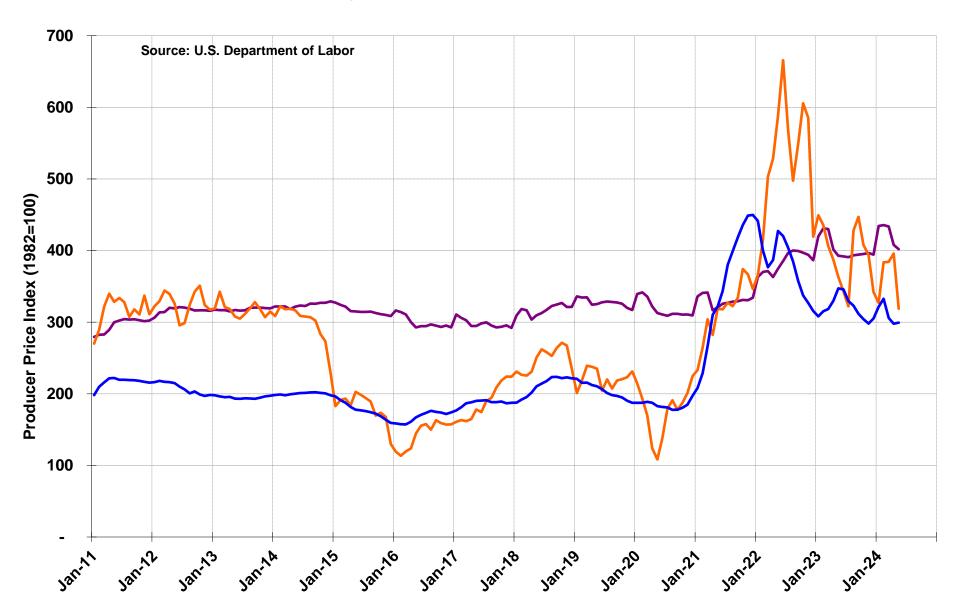
2024 YTD Operating Expenses



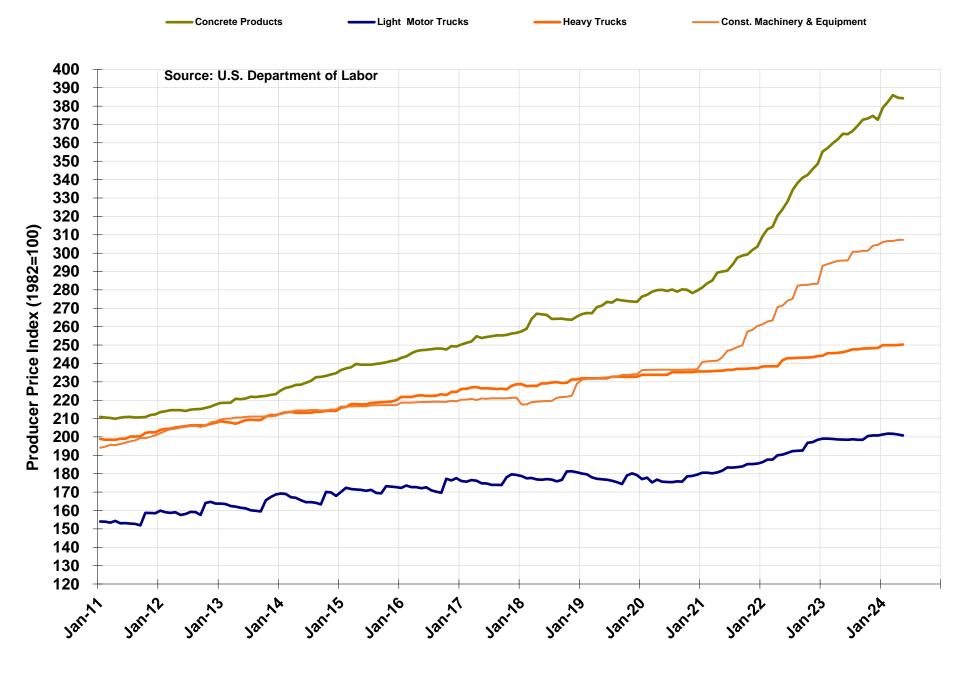

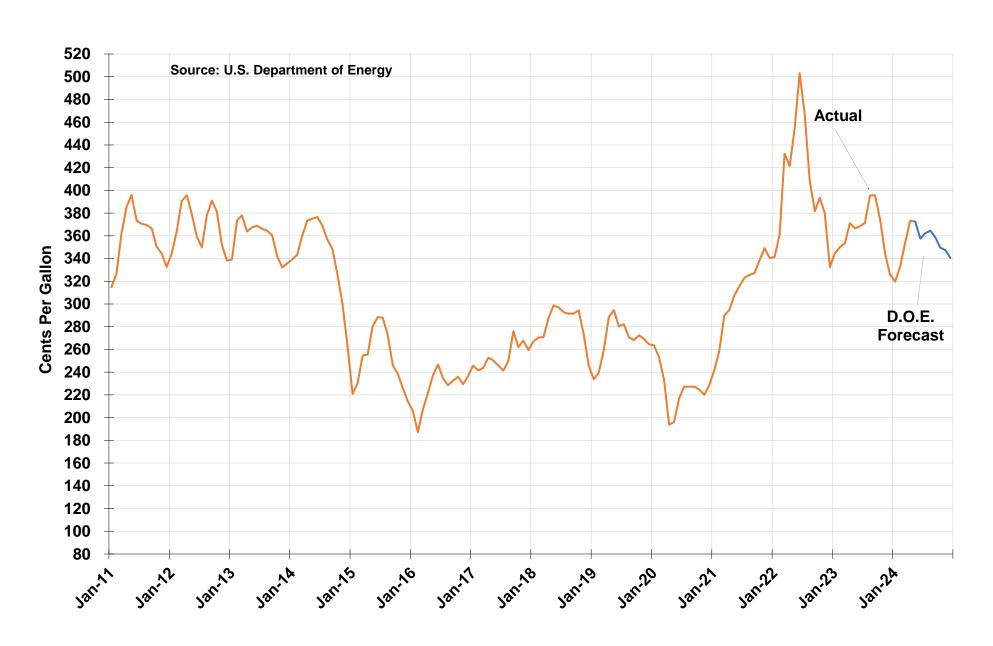
Asphalt Paving Mixtures No. 2 Diesel Fuel Steel Mill Products

NOTE A - TOTAL REVENUES (pages 1 & 2):

Total revenues for the month are \$98,377,568 an increase of \$17,332,164 or 21.39%. Toll revenues for the month are \$90,719,504 an increase of \$16,911,437 or 22.91%. Toll revenues have increased in 2024 due to a Thruway wide toll adjustment implemented on January 1, 2024.

Total revenues year-to-date are \$534,321,936, an increase of \$106,167,892 or 24.80%. Toll revenues year-to-date are \$489,063,682 an increase of \$99,925,185 or 25.68%. Year-to-date passenger revenues increased \$62,049,185 or 29.52% and commercial revenues increased \$37,876,000 or 21.17%. Additional information regarding traffic and E-ZPass usage is detailed on Pages 22-24.

NOTE B - TOTAL DEPARTMENTAL OPERATING EXPENSES (pages 4 & 10):

For the year, Departmental Operating Expenses are \$195,398,616, an increase of \$6,750,846 or 3.58% compared with June 2023.

The increase is due to salary increases included in recently approved collective bargaining agreements, other salary actions taken to ensure adequate staffing levels, and health insurance costs, offset by a decrease in Employee Benefit Fund expense.

NOTE C - DEBT ISSUANCE (page 9):

On February 15, 2024, the Authority issued General Revenue Bonds – Series P, which generated proceeds of \$1.02 billion. These proceeds were used to: (1) fund a portion of the Authority's Multi-Year Capital Program; (2) make a deposit to the Senior Debt Service Reserve Fund; (3) fund capitalized interest on the Series P bonds; (4) refund certain amount of the Authority's Series J Bonds; (5) purchase certain tendered bonds of the Authority's Series M bonds; and (6) pay bond issuance costs.

Of the \$1.02 billion, \$303.0 million is to fund the multi-year capital program, \$466.6 million is for the refunding of the Series J bonds, and \$254.7 is for the tender of the Series M bonds.

NOTE D -REVENUE, DEPARTMENTAL OPERATING EXPENSES AND BUDGET (page 10):

Year to date revenues are over budget by \$27,624,690 or 5.23%. This is primarily due to an increase in Net Toll Revenue and associated fees related to an increase in traffic above forcasted levels and an increase in interest revenue due to higher than expected interest rates on investments.

Year to date operating expenses are under budget by \$10,564,339 or 5.13%. This is primarily due to lower than budgeted personal service costs, timing of contract payments, and the timing of finalizing fiber marketing fee agreements. These are offset by higher than budgeted health insurance costs as well as Tolls by Mail and E-ZPass Administration fees.

Year to date State Police Operating Expenses are under budget by \$5,430,506 or 15.29%. This is primarily due to lower than budgeted personal service costs and automobile purchases.

NOTE E - SERVICE AREAS (pages 13, 14 & 15):

In January 2021 the Authority entered into a 33-year agreement with Empire State Thruway Partners, LLC (Empire) for the design, construction, finance, operation, and maintenance of the Authority's 27 Service Areas. Empire will rebuild 23 of the 27 service area restaurant buildings and perform significant renovations to the remaining four. Empire's initial investment to rebuild and renovate the service areas is estimated to be \$300 million. Additionally, over the life of the agreement Empire will invest another \$99 million into future renovations and improvements.

The construction work is occurring in two phases as detailed below. Phase 1 began in July 2021 when Empire assumed control of 16 service areas previously operated by HMSHost Corporation and Delaware North Corporation. Phase 2 began in January 2023 when Empire assumed control of the remaining 11 service areas that were operated by McDonald's Corporation until December 2022.

Commencing with the reopening of each new restaurant building, the agreement requires Empire to pay rent calculated as a percentage of gross sales, subject to a guaranteed annual minimum per location. In addition, the agreement has ancillary rent provisions tied to the operation of commercial vehicle fueling stations at 5 of the service areas and advertising opportunities at all service areas. Sales generated by Empire during the operation of a restaurant prior to reconstruction (interim operations) are not subject to rent provisions. Over the life of the agreement, base rent calculated as a percentage of sales is forecasted to be \$85 million, of which \$51 million is guaranteed.

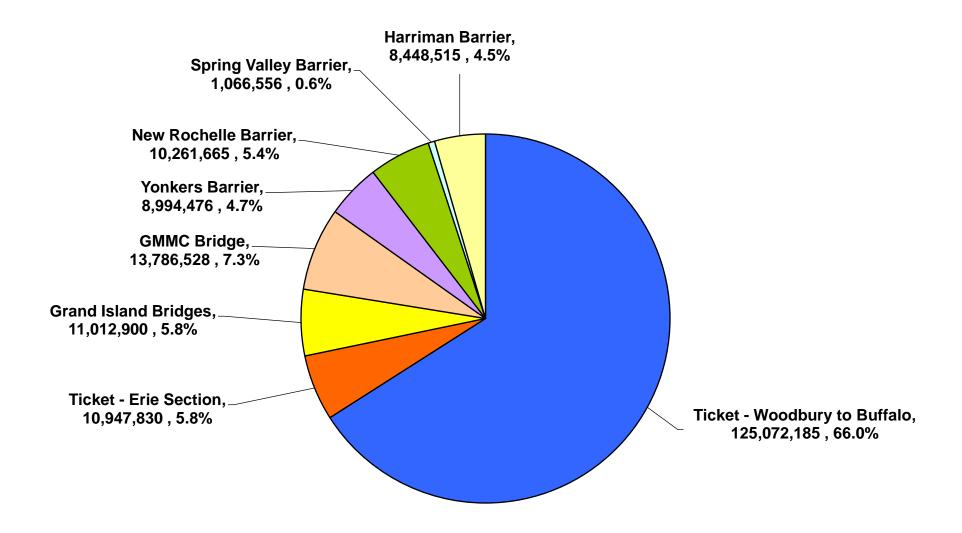

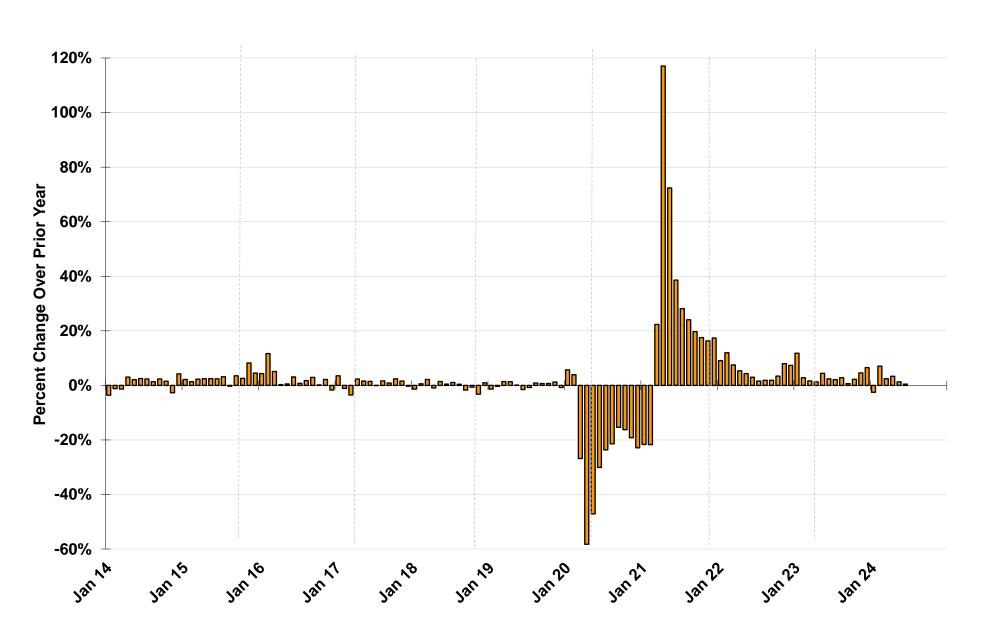

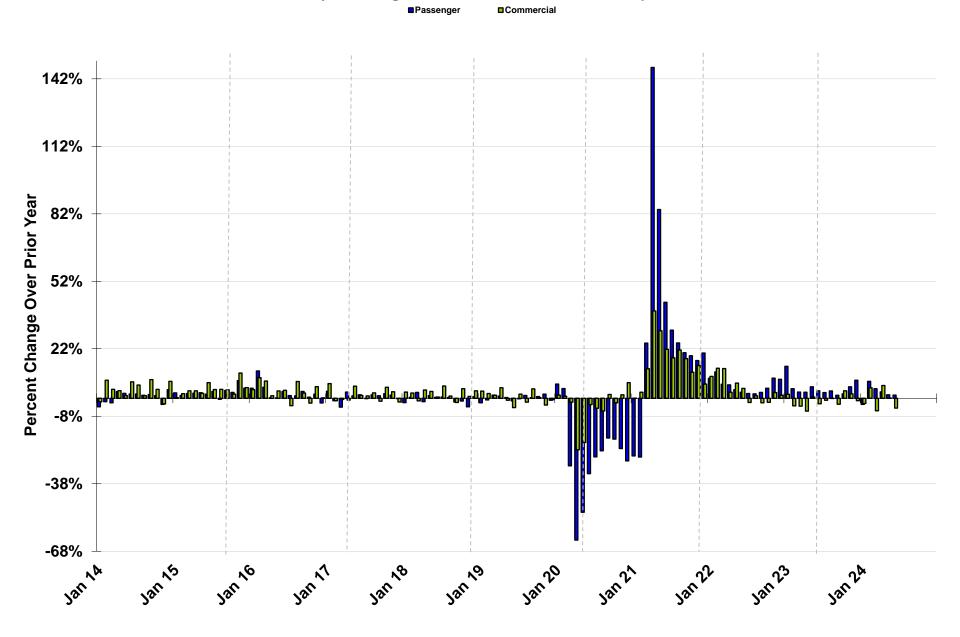


Percent Change in Monthly Thruway Traffic

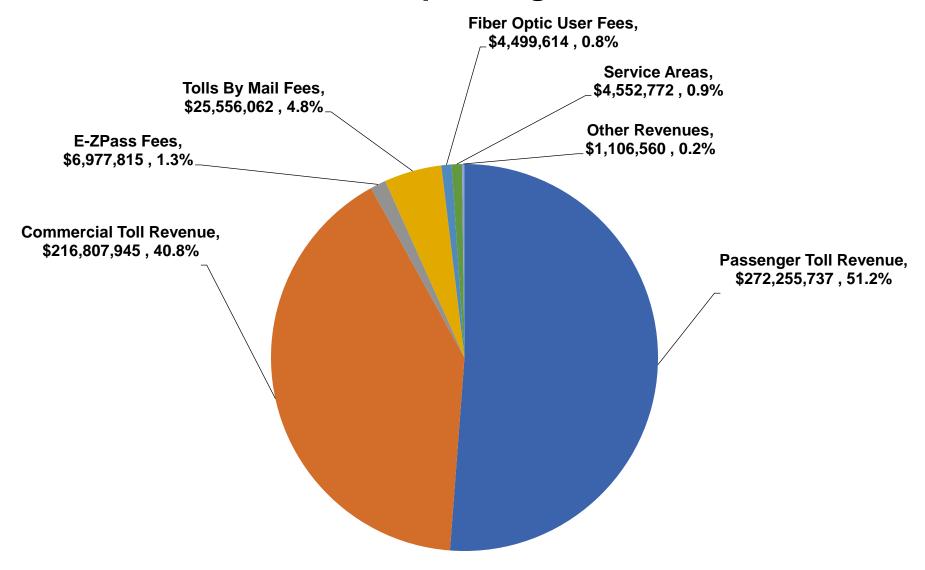
Total Passenger and Commercial Revenue Trips



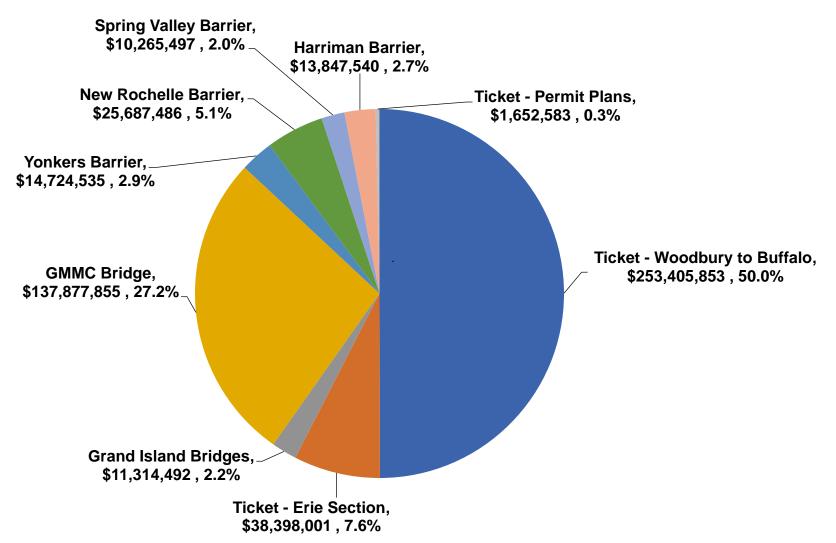
Percent Change in Monthly Thruway Traffic By Passenger and Commercial Revenue Trips



2024 YTD Operating Revenue

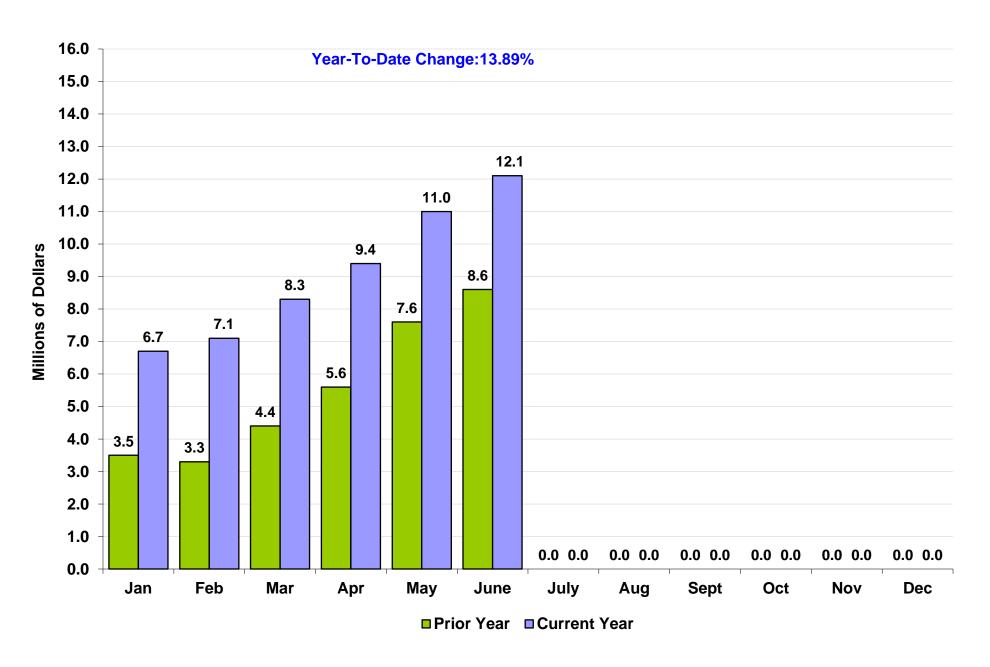


2024 YTD Toll Collections, By Location

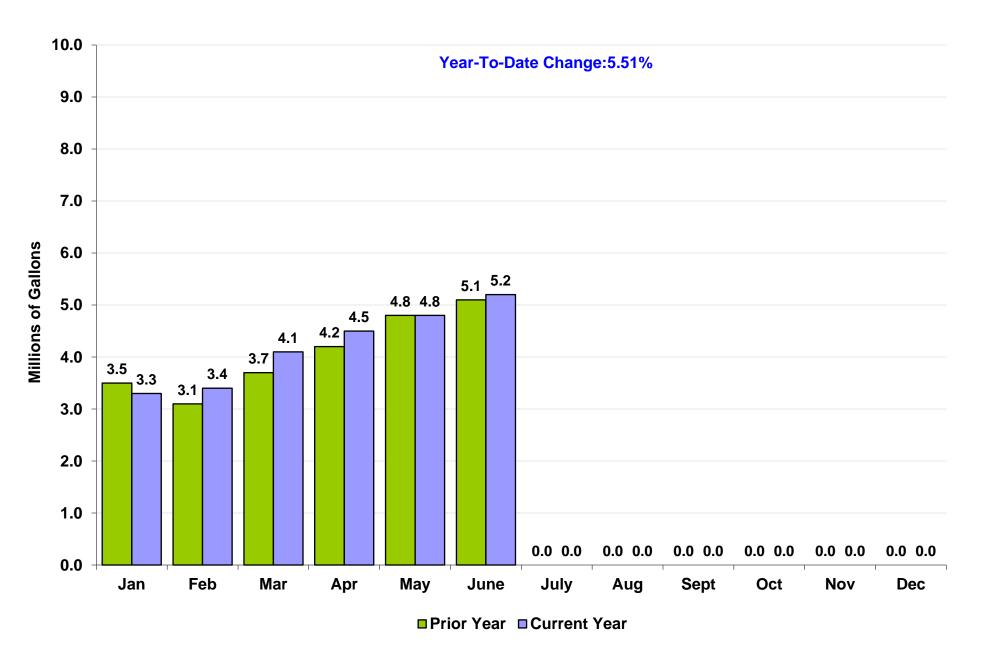

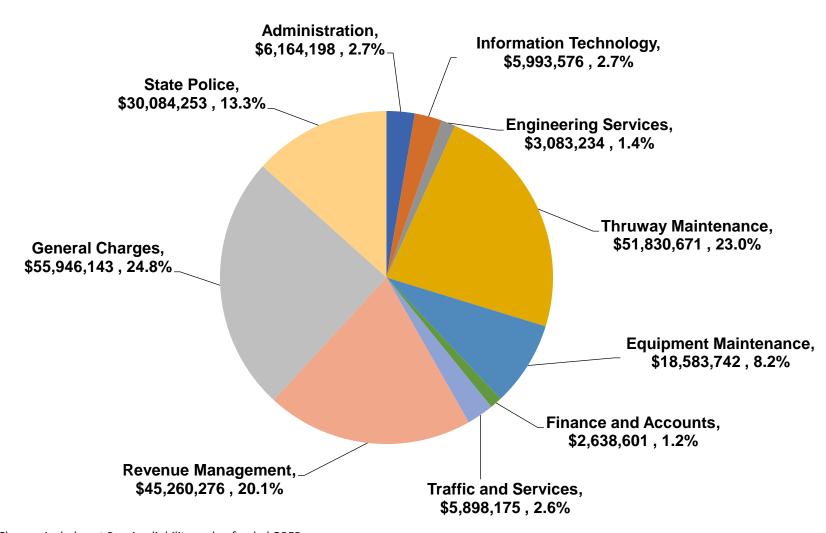
Restaurant Sales at Service Plazas



Fuel Deliveries to Service Areas



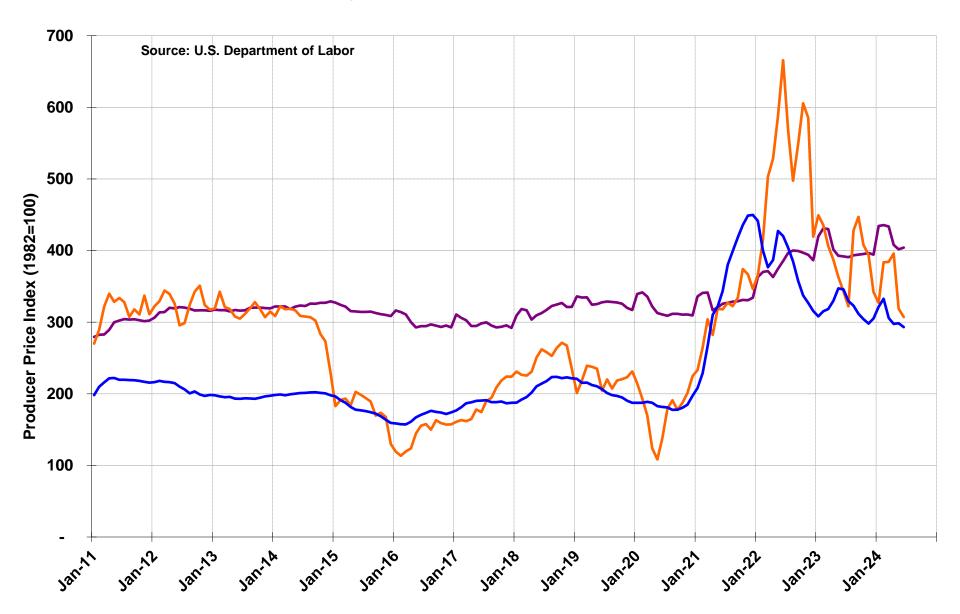
2024 YTD Operating Expenses



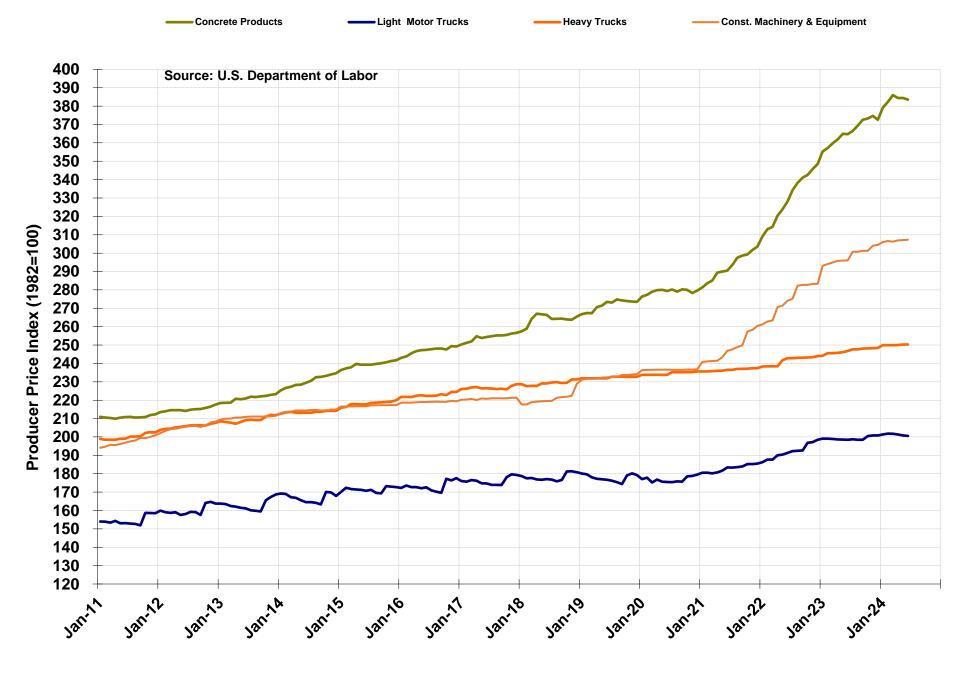

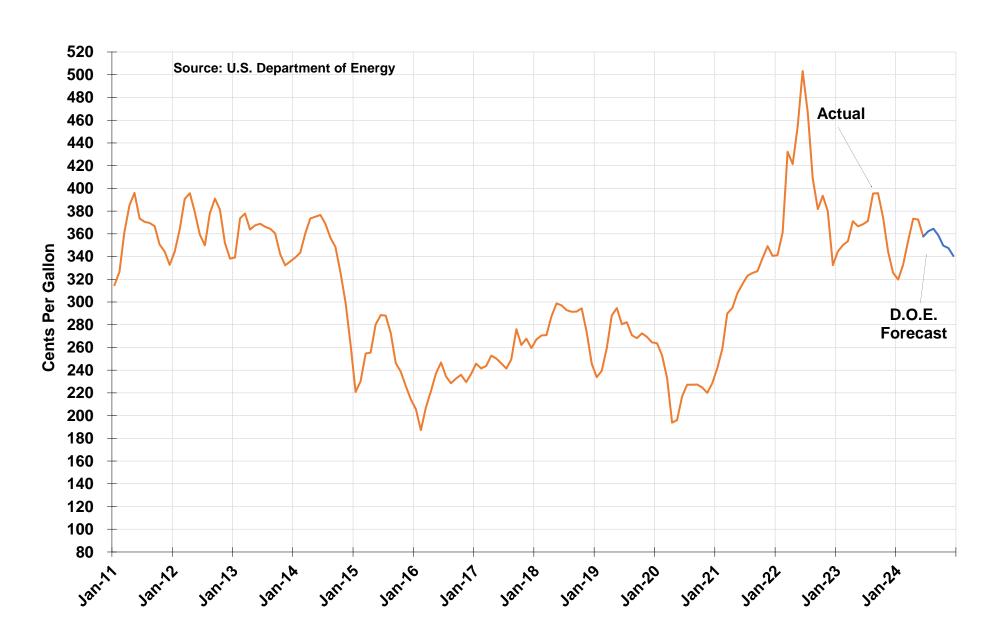
Asphalt Paving Mixtures No. 2 Diesel Fuel Steel Mill Products

NOTE A - TOTAL REVENUES (pages 1 & 2):

Total revenues for the month are \$105,642,746 an increase of \$21,738,228 or 25.91%. Toll revenues for the month are \$97,439,791 an increase of \$20,545,838 or 26.72%. Toll revenues have increased in 2024 due to a Thruway wide toll adjustment implemented on January 1, 2024.

Total revenues year-to-date are \$639,964,682, an increase of \$127,906,120 or 24.98%. Toll revenues year-to-date are \$586,503,473 an increase of \$120,471,023 or 25.85%. Year-to-date passenger revenues increased \$73,716,199 or 28.74% and commercial revenues increased \$46,754,824 or 22.31%. Additional information regarding traffic and E-ZPass usage is detailed on Pages 22-24.

NOTE B - TOTAL DEPARTMENTAL OPERATING EXPENSES (pages 4 & 10):

For the year, Departmental Operating Expenses are \$228,450,533, an increase of \$11,505,346 or 5.30% compared with July 2023.

The increase is due to salary increases included in recently approved collective bargaining agreements, other salary actions taken to ensure adequate staffing levels, health insurance costs, pension costs, E-ZPass administration fees, and the timing of finalizing fiber marketing agreements. These expenses are offset by a decrease in Employee Benefit Fund expense and Environmental Remediation costs.

NOTE C - DEBT ISSUANCE (page 9):

On February 15, 2024, the Authority issued General Revenue Bonds – Series P, which generated proceeds of \$1.02 billion. These proceeds were used to: (1) fund a portion of the Authority's Multi-Year Capital Program; (2) make a deposit to the Senior Debt Service Reserve Fund; (3) fund capitalized interest on the Series P bonds; (4) refund certain amount of the Authority's Series J Bonds; (5) purchase certain tendered bonds of the Authority's Series M bonds; and (6) pay bond issuance costs.

Of the \$1.02 billion, \$303.0 million is to fund the multi-year capital program, \$466.6 million is for the refunding of the Series J bonds, and \$254.7 is for the tender of the Series M bonds.

Year to date revenues are over budget by \$34,163,182 or 5.42%. This is primarily due to an increase in Net Toll Revenue and associated fees related to an increase in traffic above forcasted levels and an increase in interest revenue due to higher than expected interest rates on investments.

Year to date operating expenses are under budget by \$11,839,580 or 4.93%. This is primarily due to lower than budgeted personal service costs and the timing of contract payments. These are offset by higher than budgeted health insurance costs as well as Tolls by Mail and E-ZPass Administration fees.

Year to date State Police Operating Expenses are under budget by \$6,289,050 or 15.18%. This is primarily due to lower than budgeted personal service costs and automobile purchases.

NOTE E - SERVICE AREAS (pages 13, 14 & 15):

In January 2021 the Authority entered into a 33-year agreement with Empire State Thruway Partners, LLC (Empire) for the design, construction, finance, operation, and maintenance of the Authority's 27 Service Areas. Empire will rebuild 23 of the 27 service area restaurant buildings and perform significant renovations to the remaining four. Empire's initial investment to rebuild and renovate the service areas is estimated to be \$300 million. Additionally, over the life of the agreement Empire will invest another \$99 million into future renovations and improvements.

The construction work is occurring in two phases as detailed below. Phase 1 began in July 2021 when Empire assumed control of 16 service areas previously operated by HMSHost Corporation and Delaware North Corporation. Phase 2 began in January 2023 when Empire assumed control of the remaining 11 service areas that were operated by McDonald's Corporation until December 2022.

Commencing with the reopening of each new restaurant building, the agreement requires Empire to pay rent calculated as a percentage of gross sales, subject to a guaranteed annual minimum per location. In addition, the agreement has ancillary rent provisions tied to the operation of commercial vehicle fueling stations at 5 of the service areas and advertising opportunities at all service areas. Sales generated by Empire during the operation of a restaurant prior to reconstruction (interim operations) are not subject to rent provisions. Over the life of the agreement, base rent calculated as a percentage of sales is forecasted to be \$85 million, of which \$51 million is guaranteed.

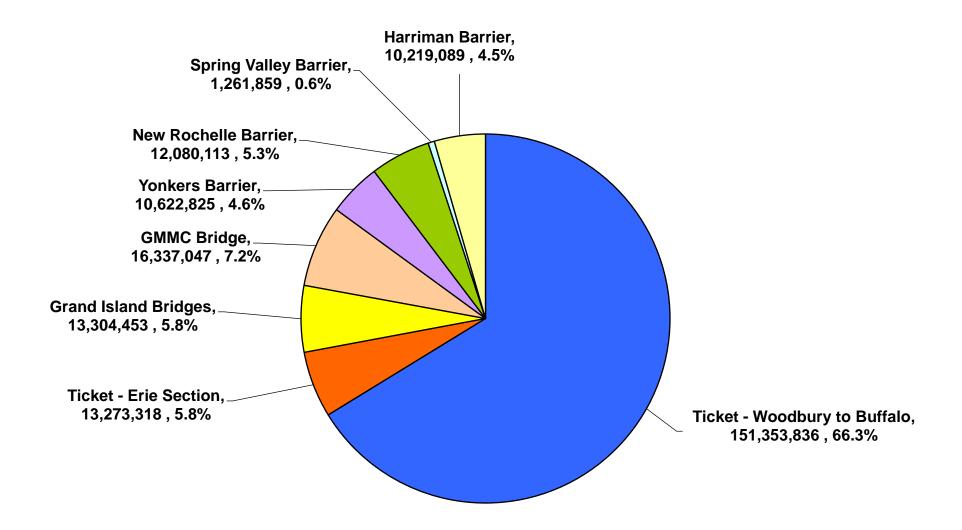

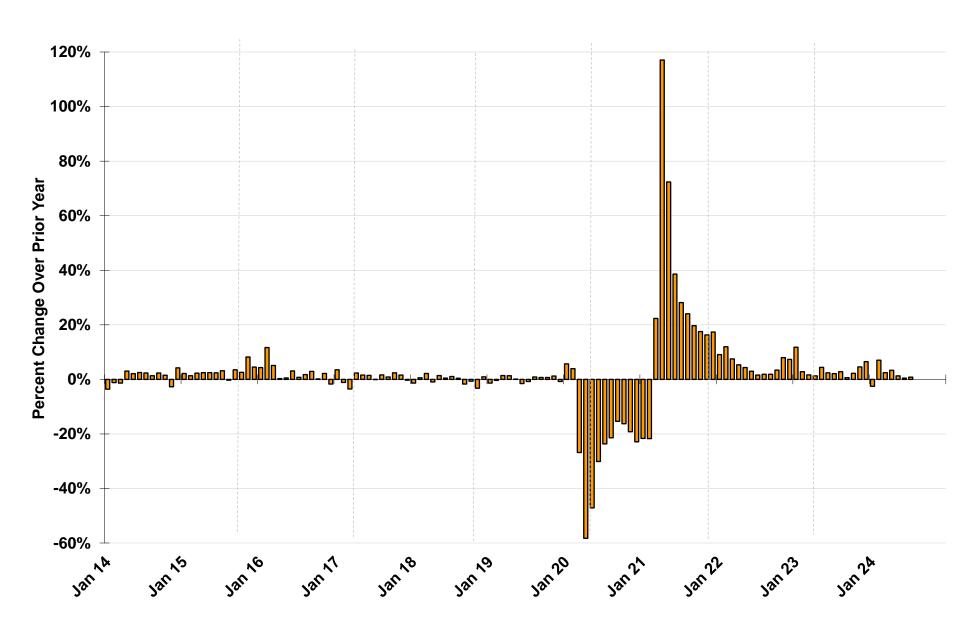
% of E-ZPass Trips to Total Revenue

2024 YTD Total Thruway Trips, By Location

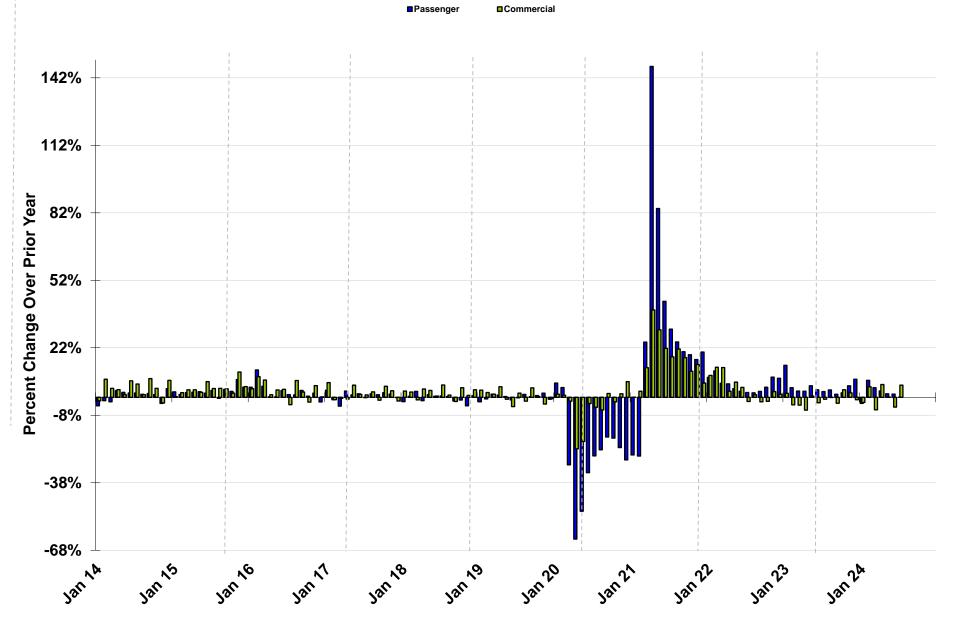


Percent Change in Monthly Thruway Traffic

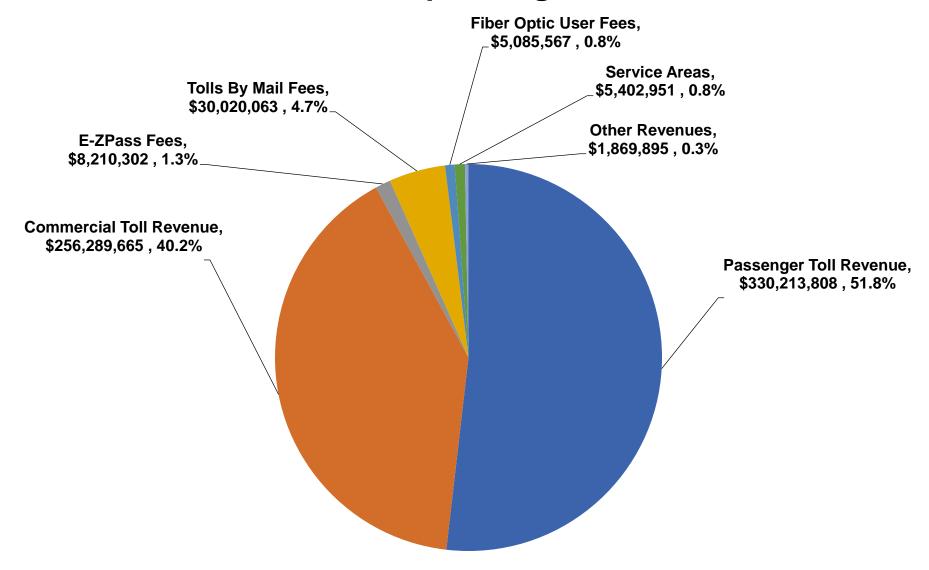
Total Passenger and Commercial Revenue Trips



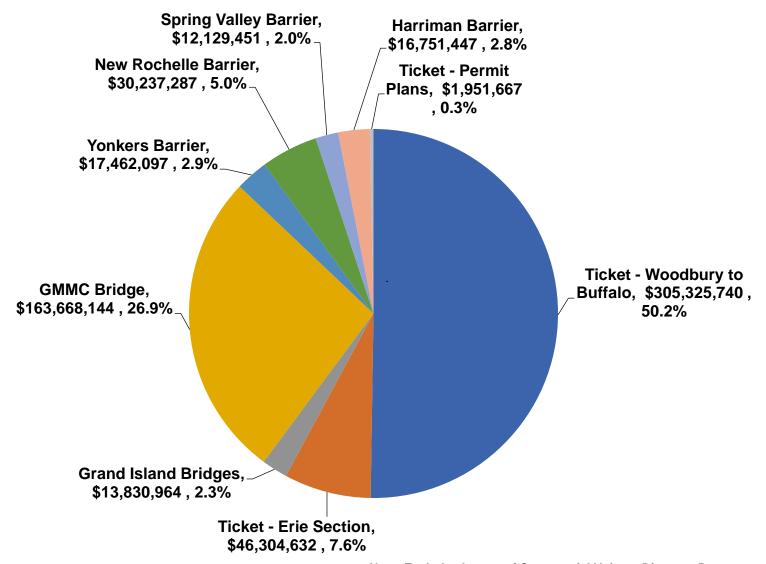
Percent Change in Monthly Thruway Traffic By Passenger and Commercial Revenue Trips



2024 YTD Operating Revenue

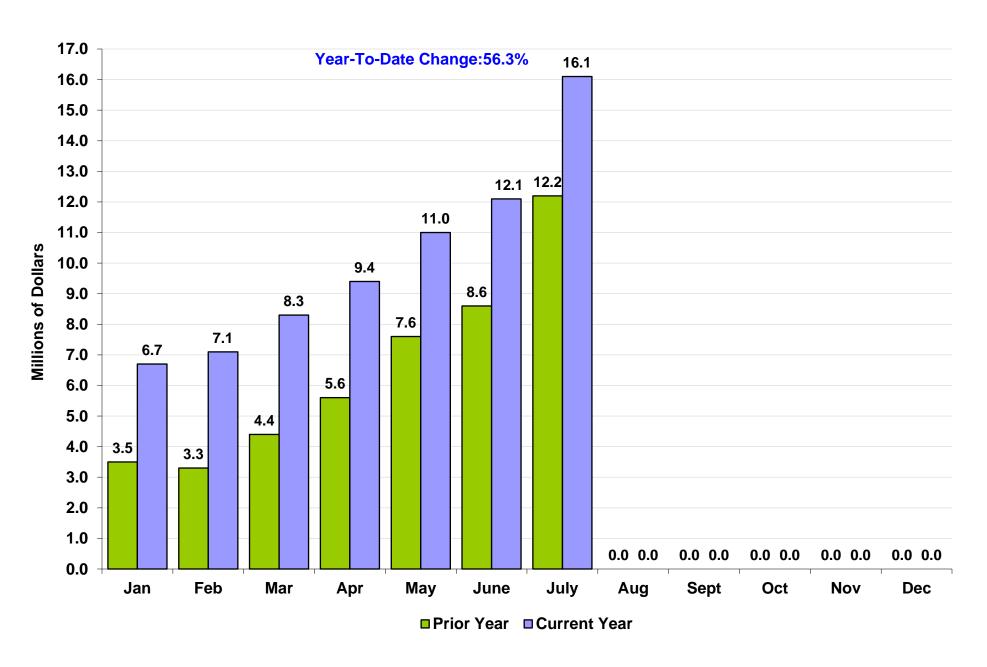


2024 YTD Toll Collections, By Location

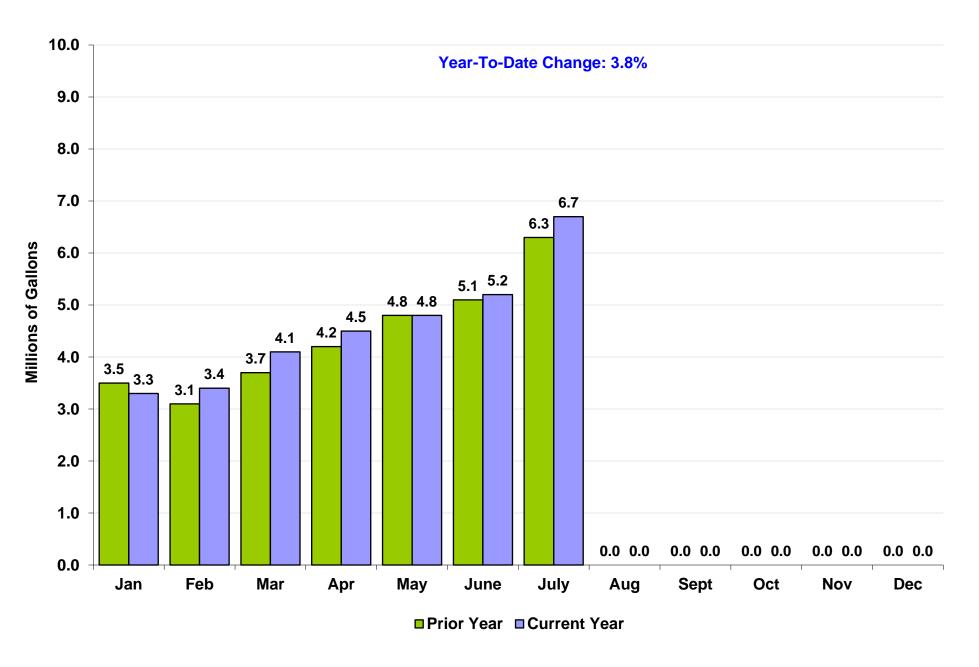

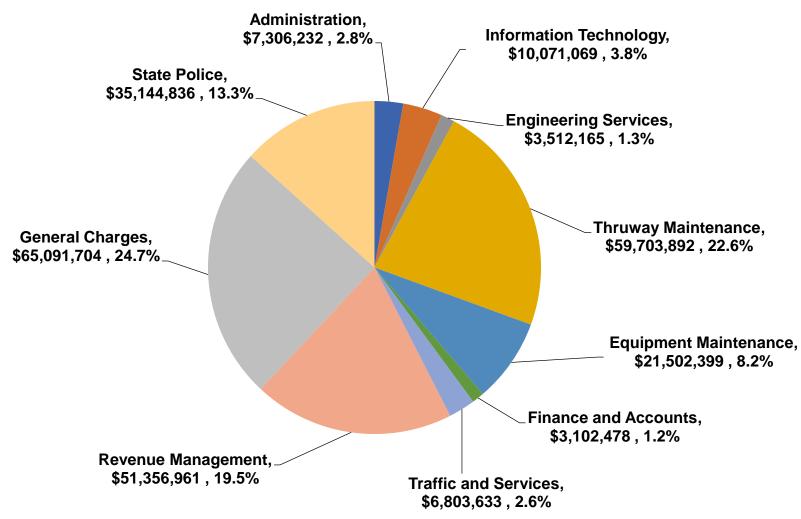
Restaurant Sales at Service Plazas



Fuel Deliveries to Service Areas



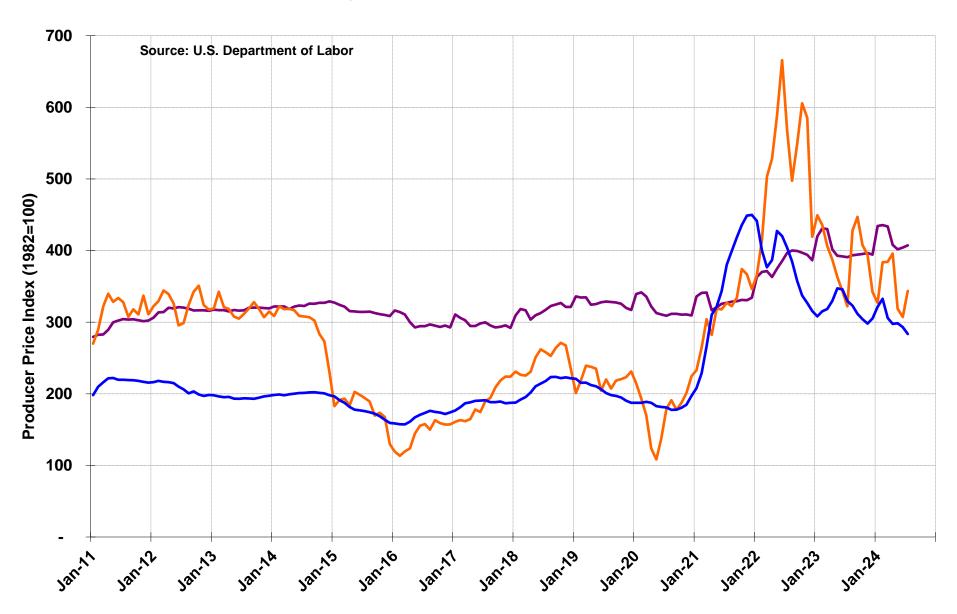
2024 YTD Operating Expenses



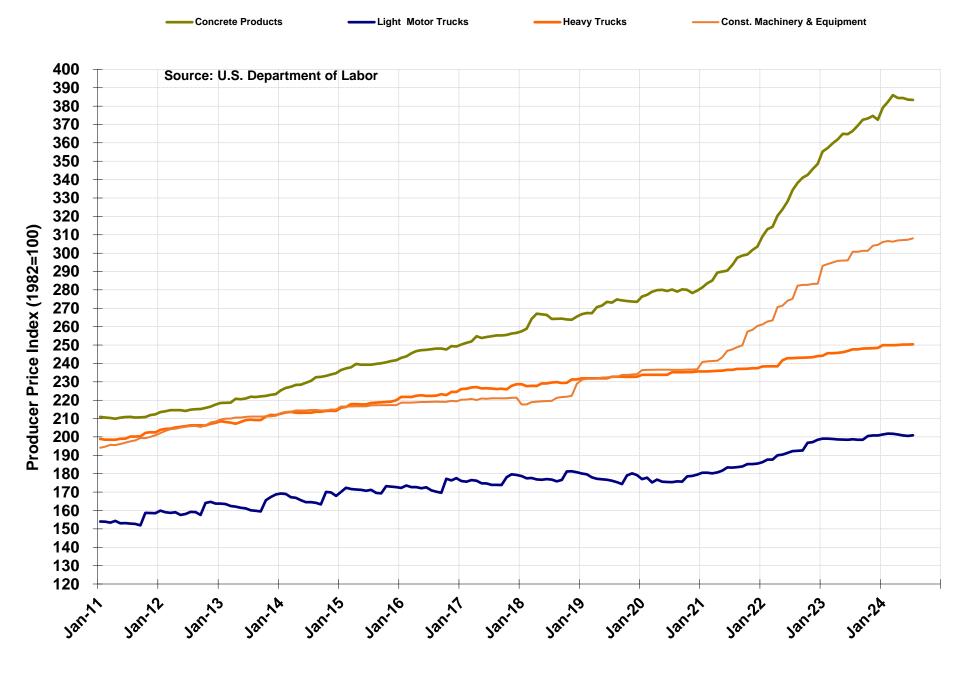

Producer Prices: Construction Inputs

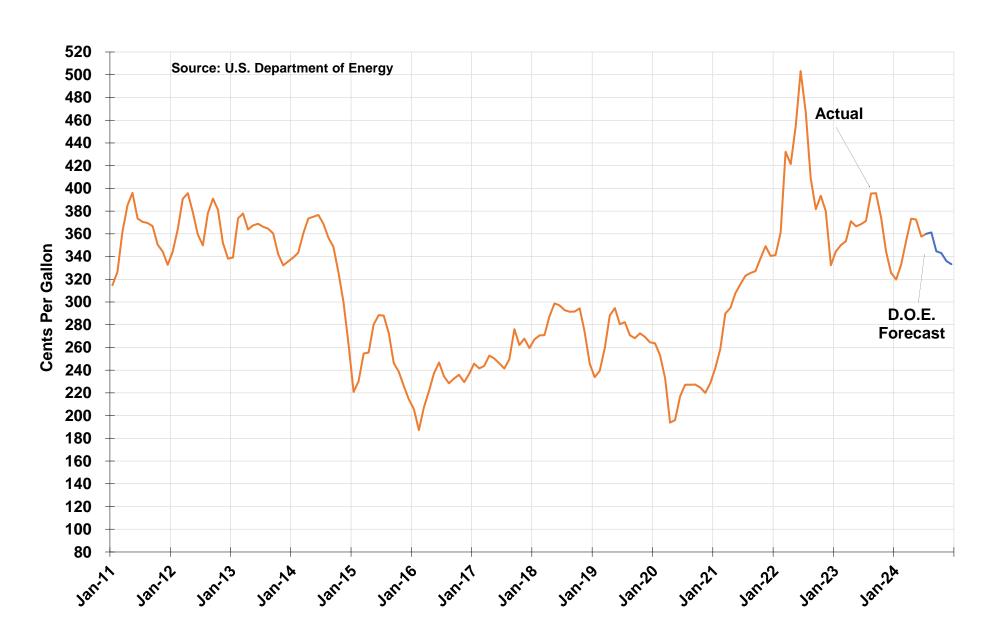
Asphalt Paving Mixtures No. 2 Diesel Fuel Steel Mill Products

SUBJECT: Investment Transactions – Second Quarter Investments 2024
